

# BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

In 1914 on 28 June the heir to the Austrian Empire, Archduke Franz Ferdinand, and his wife Sophie were assassinated in Sarajevo by a fanatical Bosnian Student. A fund was initiated for a Memorial Church at Sarajevo.

Issue: 1917 28 June: Commemorative Stamps.  
A premium of 2h for the Fund was added to the postal value.






# BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

Issue: 1916 1-30 October. P 12½. Franz Joseph I died 21 November and stamps for his successor Charles I were issued 10 months later. Large stocks of this 1916 issue were remaindered in November 1918 after Charles' abdication.





# AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN MILITARY POST

## ISSUES FOR ITALY

Following the Italian defeat at Caporetto on 24 October 1917, the Austro-Hungarian forces advanced to the River Piave. The Friuli (Venezia Giulia) remained occupied until the allied victory at Vittorio Veneto, 30 October-3 November 1918.

Until 1918 1 June current General Issue stamps were used.  
First issue: 1918 1 June. SG. 1-19.


