On reverse HK arrival 5th August, London 12th September, Redhill, Surrey, the same day. Scarce three colour franking.

Cover somewhat worn with torn flap, but inside a previous owner's assessment of the sailing from the Treaty Port..




HONG KONG POST CARD - KGV

1922 usage of a 1918 1½c (orange) post card (Webb Type 34) with additional 1912 1c and 2c (SG100 & SG101), dd '28/JU/22'.

This type of card issued for China, the rate changed from 1½c to 2c in 1923 and was hardly used in the intervening five years. Also, as HK did not issue fractional definitive values, it was not possible to accurately add the correct UPU rate of 4c per ½ ounce. Also the stamp colour of orange tended to merge with the buff coloured card. This card was considered unpopular by the local populace, therefore it can be considered uncommon!







On reverse a Hong Kong registration label.








