All three stamps were designed by Quoc-Thu.






These three stamps were issued on June 12, 1959 to mark the visit of Major Titov to Viet-Nam. Gherman S. Titov was the second Russian to sucessfully complete a manned space flight. His flight occured in the Vostok ("East") II on August 6, 1961, and he completed 17 orbits. The 12 xu value was designed by Tran Luong and shows Titov greeting children. Anh Tuan designed the 20 xu value showing President Ho-Chi-Minh pinning a medal on Titov. The high value shows Titov in a space suit and was designed by Quoc-Thu.

The General Post-Office of the D.R. Vietnam will release on July 20, 1962 a commemorative stamp with a special cachet to mark the eighth Anniversary of the signing of the Geneva Agreements concerning Vietnam.

Denomination: 12 xu — black, scarlet, olive-brown and pale brown orange.

Size: 24.5 × 47 — Perforation II — Sheets of 100 — ungummed.

Offset by the Tiên bô State Printing-Works.

Inscription: For socialism and for national reunification.

The design by Quôc-thu shows the map of Vietnam—in the North: edification of the country; in the south: Fight of the people against the fascist regim of Ngô-dinh-Diêm and the U.S. aggression.

The Inscription on the cachet reads: 8th Anniversary of the siging of the Geneva Agreements.





These two stamps were issued on August 14, 1962. One stamp depicts the Ban Gioc Falls and the other depicts Ba Be Lake. Both stamps were designed by Bui Trang Chuoc.

This stamp was issued on September 1, 1962 to publicize the International Military Sports Festival of Socialist States that was to be held in Prague, Czechoslovakia. However, this event did not take place and the stamps were to have been withdrawn before the scheduled date of issue. A small number was sold at some post offices before the withdrawal instructions were received. This stamp is very rare.

The stamp was designed by Bui Trang Chuoc. The Michel Catalog lists two different types of this stamp of equal rarity. The difference between the two types is the paper.







Nguyen Trai was a great politicial, a brilliant strategist, a poet, an author and a remarkable humanist. He was the soul of the resistance movement headed by Le-Loi which successfully expelled the Chinese from Viet-Nam in 1427.

Viet-Nam also issued a set of stamps in 1980 to honor this man.



In Vietnam, beside the staple cultivation of rice, that of many other nourishing plants has been developing: maize, sweet potato, manioc, haricot beans, pea-nuts, sesamum...

The cultivation of plants for industrial purpose has also been on the way of expansion: tea, anise, coffee, caster-oil plant, lacquer-tree, rubber-tree, etc...

March 1962 saw the release of a series of five stamps Industrial Plants of total face value 62 xu,



This stamp was prepared in 1962 to commemorate the 45th anniversary of the Russian October Revolution but it was not released. It is listed by Michel but not by Gibbons. It only exists imperforate. According to Steve Carol, in 1981 this is one of only three such that exist in the United States - Mark Isaacs and Steve have the other two. It is very rare.

Russia's October Revolution opened with the armed insurrection on the 24th of October in 1917. It was organized by Lenin's Bolshevik Party, and it effected a fundamental change in all social, political and economic relationships in Russian society. Viet-Nam also issued stamps in 1957, 1967 and 1977 to mark this event.

The sculpture depicted on the stamp appears to be the "Worker & Collective Farmer" by Muchina from Russia's pavilion at the Paris International Exhibition of 1937.



This set was issued on December 28, 1962 to honor the first "team" manned space flights that were accomplished by the Russians. Vostok III went into orbit on August 11, 1962, with Major Andrian G. Nikolayev as the cosmonaut (20 xu value). While it was still orbiting, Vostok IV followed, manned by Lieutenant Colonel Pavel R. Popovich (12 xu value). The two spacecraft were in radio communication and could one another (30 xu value). They landed at about the same time; Vostok III had made sixty-four orbits during 94 hrs. 25 min. in space, while Vostok IV had completed forty-eight orbits in 71 hrs. 3 min.



These two stamps were issued on March 14, 1963 to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the death of Karl Marx who died in 1883. Karl Marx was born in Germany in 1818. In 1847 Friedrich Engels and he wrote The Communist Manifesto, the first systematic statement of modern socialist doctrine. Although Marx's influence during his life was not great, after his death it increased enormously. His doctrines were revived in the 20th century by Lenin, and they constituted the basis Bolshevism.

The stamps depicting Karl Marx were designed by Trinh Quoc Thu. One million sets were printed.




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

On May 8, 1963 Viet-Nam became one of the many nations that issued stamps during 1963 to commemorate the Red Cross centenary. In 1862 Jean Henri Dunant appealed to the leaders of many countries to found societies devoted to the aid of the wounded in wartime. Fourteen nations answered his appeal, and they formed the Red Cross in October of 1863 in Geneva, Switzerland.

This stamp was issued on July 20, 1963 on the occasion of Viet-Nam Day and the visit of the South Viet-Nam delegation (NLF) to North Viet-Nam. The design is from a photograph showing Nguyen Van Hieu's arrival in Hanoi on October of 1962. The photo was first published in a book dealing with South Viet-Nam, which was sold by Peace Book Co. of Hong Kong, an enterprise owned and operated by the Red Chinese government.


Born in 1922 on the Camau peninsula, Hieu became a revolutionist at the age of 23 while taking part in the original outbreak of fighting against the French in the South during 1945.

While with the Viet Minh he headed an organization called the South Vietnamese Propaganda Bureau. This bureau encouraged and aided in the formation of local propaganda units in the Mekong Delta. After Dien Bien Phu he went to Saigon where he worked on many newspaper staffs writing under the name "Khai Minh". He left the Saigon area in 1958, probably going to the North.

He reappeared in 1960, succeeding Phung Van Cung (Provisional Secretary General, National Liberation Front) as Secretary General of the NLF at the organizing congress. He served in this capacity until 1963. He also held various high ranking positions in various political groups associated with the NLF.









Perforated and Imperforated Proofs on Thick Waste Paper




