





Tibet 2/3tr Blue (Scott #15) and 2 Shokang Official (Scott #04) tied by indistinct Phari Cancel. The return address on the cover is interesting: "Radio Supply Stores Ltd, Importer of Wireless Apparatus and Radio Engineers, 3 Dalhousie Square, Calcutta". In the late 1940s Tibet was trying to develop a Wireless Telegraph system with the help of the British Wireless operator – Robert Ford. We know that in 1950 a wireless telegraph system operated for a few months .. using regular Tibetan stamps as well as special wireless telegraph stamps. The use of an "Official" stamp on what appears to be a commercial cover is difficult to explain .. possibly the Tibetan stamps were added later to a genuine commercial cover from Calcutta to Phari. (?).

The cover bears a boxed "NOT OPENED BY / CENSOR" marking. This "War Time" cover was part of the "Gyanratna" correspondence. "Gyanratna" was the largest Tibetan trader and maintained an office and warehouse in Calcutta. The cover bears three unrecorded "PHARI TO LHASA" Directional marks in Violet. Only a few covers, circa 1940 or earlier, are know with Directional Markings – most cover with Directional marks date from the late 1940s or early 1950s. Badly toned on the corner.



Normally the Tibetan stamps would have been added in Gyantse and cancelled by a Tibetan Postmark of Gyantse. When Tibetan stamps were affixed in Kathmandu they were usually not cancelled until arrival in Tibet. This cover is unusual, but genuine in all respects. (Illustrated in Singer's NEPAL, page 254).
