" O.H.E.M.S.

With its overprint applied at Cairo by typography, this submitted stamp is from position #7 of a 15 mills upper pane (separated from the lower pane of a two hundred-subject "A.21" control-numbered press sheet before being overprinted). It is quite fresh-appearing, and is fully sound but for one short perforation tooth at its right-hand vertical edge. It is a product of the second of the four, one hundred-subject settings used in the overprinting of the small-format stamps (the first setting in which movable type was employed — applied to the 4m. 5m. 10m lake and 15m" Maleemat" stamps, and designated as setting "B" by Douglas McNeille). A mere 7000 examples (seventy panes) of the " - inscribed 15 mills value were included in the second-setting "O.H.E.M.S." overprinting, and represent the only application of an 'official service' overprint to that stamp.

^{*}Although the stamps of the second overprinting are recorded as having been delivered to the Government on 8th November. 1922, that date is certainly incorrect, given the "B.23" control numbers of the 4m. 5m and 10m panes. Further study is needed to determine the earliest date of their usage, which now appears to have been at some point in mid-1923. C.F.H.
