1964 - PHILATELIC REVIVAL - 1964

1962 - Abdul Kayeum, from the Afghan Ministry of the Interior responsible for Postal Affairs, recognised there was a problem and requested the Universal Postal Union for Technical assistance. On 1st April 1963, Howard Brooks was appointed Deputy Director General of Posts in the Ministry of Communications. He was the third only foreigner ever employed by the Afghan Postal service. By August Brooks submitted to the Minister of Communications, now responsible for the Afghan Post, a set of priorities for new postal services that encouraged collectors, established funding policies, and an organised schedule of issues be annually published, sales to be without restriction and recommended the establishment of a Postal Museum. Brooks then created

- (a) a separate Philatelic Department
- (b) a Philatelic Advisory Board consisting of Afghan and foreign residents in Kabul who served without payment. In 1965 Howard Brooks retired and this Board gradually ceased to operate.

The Board met for the first time on 20th November 1963. Post Boxes and aerogrammes were reintroduced. One of two issues a year continued to be printed in Kabul.

Printing was contracted to Austrian State printing Office (ASPO) up until 1978 and from then to the former Soviet Union, supplies of stamps being air freighted to Kabul. The design of issues was in general carried out by George C. Adams in New York.

In 1972 Afghanistan was linked by five different international airlines, Ariana Afghan, Aeroflot, Pakistan, India and Iran. Domestic air services were provided to Kandahar, Mazar-i-Sharif, Herat, and Kunduz. Surface mail was by bus to other towns and villages, horseback or foot messengers for small towns and villages.

Kabul had more than 6 Post Offices with regular mail by foot or bicycle.

Credibility was restored and was heralded with the issue of a Philatelic commemorative of two stamps displaying the Sher Ali issues of 1870.

This new cancel type PM33 is the earliest known use of this new format which replaced all existing PM26 & PM27 cancels by 1966. For the first time a cancel displays a Post Office No. above the town name in the lower half of the cancel. It is possible that different numbers were issued to postal clerks at each local post office. The number may indicate a particular use e.g. Official/unofficial or, if identical town name cancels are used for the same town, different numbers could indicate different Sub-Post Offices or even issues to postal employees. In Kabul, with its several Sub-Post Offices, the allocation of different numbers for identical cancels replaces the previous practice of using distinctive city suburban names for each cancel. This new procedure was also used for the next cancel PM-36 issued in 1968. Examples of PM13 use are not known after c1932 but it is possible that it may have been used for many years. How the 'Cancel No. vs Post Offices' were allocated requires further research.



The former an account of ancient knowledge, theoretical and practical, the latter a digest of medical and pharmacology known to Avicenna. A medical text used for six centuries until the second half of the 17th century. (*Afghan Philately* by Uyehara & Dietrich)

NOTES:

- 1. A week later 125 Poul sheets were re-issued with a substituted 125 Poul cliché replacing the 35 poul colour error.
- 2. The delay saw the normal sale time of SURTAX issues exceeded, and *Patterson* considers 125 Poul reissues as an official reprint.
- 3. However the re-issued sheets were on sale in post offices and are valid issues. Patterson estimates sales in other major cities and "new issue" order shipments indicate no more than c250 colour errors were released. Howver the New York stamp dealer, Frank Warner, states the first printing was c5,000 and only 312 total colour error copies may exist. [(Stamps, 79:8(5/24/ 52):263)].
- **4.** Imperf sheets released are usually a fraction of the overall issue release, estimated as 2000 Imperf sheets.
- 5. Imperf colour Errors released may be c125 making the imperf colour error much rarer than the perf colour error by a factor of about 2½, if compared with the total c312 perforated colour errors released. This is conservative, based on a total printing perf/imperf of 7,000 wheras it may have only been 5,000. Whichever figure they are rare.
