















German Levant 20 para Postal Card cancelled by the Turkish Post in Jerusalem, Oct. 30.98. Twenty para Turkish stamp added to provide legal postage as Turkey did not accept German stamps.

The German post office in Jerusalem did not open until March 1, 1900.

Turkish Palestine to Germany

1889



Prior to the opening of the "Capitulation" post offices in the Holyland, the Turkish post office handled mail from the Holyland to Germany.

Postmarked: Safed/Juil/ . . . 889

Transit postmark, blue, Constantinople 10 Aout 1889

German receiving postmark 15/8

Labeled unbekant, (unknown), readdressed and returned via German post office in Constantinople, (20.8.89) to the Turkish post office on the same day.

Germany had a post office in Constantinople since 1870.

Germany to Palestine

1915

(via the Turkish Post Office)



There was no alternative to the use of the Turkish Post from September 30, 1914, when the German post offices were closed until December 1915 when the military mission post offices were established. The first military mission post office was opened in Constantinople.

Above:

Fieldpost card, 3.9.15, Turkish censor mark, Galata receiving cancel. To Haifa.

Galata was a district in Constantinople.

Below:

Letter, 6.5.15, boxed Turkish censor's cancel. To Jerusalem



The foreign post offices ceased operations after September 1914. All mail was then handled by the Turkish authorities.

Jaffa 25.1.16 to Aleppo. Backstamped Damascus, Aleppo and Turkish censor's mark.
