





THIS REMARKABLE 1/2 ANNA STAMP OF INDIA 1854, MAY SETTING, USED, HAS A TRACE OF CORNER ORNAMENT, WHICH NORMALLY BELONGS TO HALFANNA DIE III, ONE ANNA AND FOUR ANNA SETTINGS OF INDIA 1855. THIS WAS DISCOUNTED BY LIVING PHILATELIC AUTHORITIES WHO ATTRIBUTED IT TO A "RETOUCH" OR A "TOUCH-UP" TO A BADLY TRANSFERRED 'ROSE' OF THE CROVVN.

THE THEORY WAS VINDICATED WHEN, IN 1969, A COMPLETE 1/2 ANNA SHEET OF INDIA 1854 IN THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA COLLECTION WAS LOCATED WITH THE RARE TYPE OF CORNER ORNAMENTS.

THE SHEET WAS FINALLY INTERPRETED AS BEING ONE OF THE PROOF-SHEETS, A FEW STAMPS OUT OF WHICH APPEAR TO HAVE BEEN ISSUED FOR PUBLIC USE THROUGHINADVERTANCE.

AS THE PRINTING PROCESS PROGRESSED. CERTAIN FEATURES OF THE IMPRESSIONS ON PRINTING STONES BEGAN TO WEAR OUT. SUCH DEFECTS THAT DEVELOPED DURING THE PROCESS OF PRINTING WERE TOUCHED-UP BY HAND SUCH RE-TOUCHES DID NOT RESTORE THE ORI-GINAL OUTLINES AND ARE THUS CLEARLY NO-TICEABLE IN PRINTS. RE-TOUCHES ARE, THERE FORE, REDRAWINGS BROUGHT ABOUT ON PRINTING STONES AFTER

SIX ANNAS PROVISIONAL STAMPS

OF 1866

On July 15th, 1863, the postage rate for a letter weighing half an ounce from India to the United Kingdom, via Marseilles, was fixed at six annas eight pies.

In May 1866 the stock of two annas stamps in the Calcutta Stamp Office ran low, so that an urgent need arose for a stamp of six annas pending the arrival of a new value of six annas eight pies. To meet this demand it was decided to overprint the six annas Foreign Bill Stamp with the word "POSTAGE" and this was done at Calcutta.

The overprint "POSTAGE" was printed in a curved line in green and the upper half bearing the word "FOREIGN" and the lower half with the word "BILL" were cut off.

The sheets of Forign Bill Stamps consisted of four rows of twenty stamps and the overprint was applied to each row in turn.


Two variations in the overprint exist. In the first, the overprint measures 2 mm. in height and in the second 3 mm. In the first case the overprint varies but little, and any difference appears to be due to broken type.

In the case of the tall overprint there are twenty different known types. In the book "The Postage and Telegraph Stamps of British India" Part 1 by L.L.R. Hausburg, published for the Philatelic Society of India by Stanley Gibbons Ltd in 1907, Mr. Hausburg states that it has not been quite possible to complete the plating of these stamps. In Plate XVII, Nos. 150-169, reproduced overleaf, the types shown are believed to be the twenty different ones, but, Mr. Hausburg further states that others have been seen which vary slightly and suggests that these variations may be due to a slight shifting of type, or to an accidental injury.

The tall overprint is also known inverted, and is extremely scarce in this condition.

It is not known how many of each type were printed. The total number printed has been assessed at 166,460. The actual number sold was 102,212, and these stamps were first placed on sale in Calcutta on the 28th June, 1866.

The object of this study is concerned solely with the tall 3 mm. overprint, and an attempt will be made to examine in detail each of the twenty different types as well as the variations, and if possible to re-affirm the conclusions reached by Mr. L.L.R. Hausburg.
