


- I. Prestamp and Foreign Postage used in British Guiana Examples including a prestamp cover used three years prior to the Earliest reported example as well as several covers franked with Foreign Postage used in British Guiana.
- II. "Cotton Reels" Examples both on and off cover including the only recorded unused example of any cotton reel value.
- III. Tall Ship Issue of 1852 Examples both on and off cover including a reconstructed pair.
 - IV.Small Ship Issue of 1853-1859
 Used and Unused Examples including the only known
 strips of four on cover.
 - V. Surface Colored Issue of 1856 Used and Unused Examples both on and off cover including the Unique One Cent Magenta.
- VI. Small Ship Issue of 1860-1875
 Used and Unused Examples including Multiples and usages on cover.




The Berbice straight line handstamp which is believed to be the earliest recorded example, used to Edinburgh rated at 2/6. This marking predates the earliest Berbice marking by three years.

1810-1811



Error in Year Date 1801 for 1810.



Both covers to London show the Demerara Horseshoe (Townsend type 5) which has been recorded as used from April 28,1807 to March 6,1813.

1815-1825



The Large Fleuron (Townsend type 6) is known used from Dec. 1809 to Aug. 1819. This 1815 use to London shows a 2/3 rate.



The Small Fleuron (Townsend type 7) is recorded from January 1822 to Dec. 1842. This 1825 use to London was charged at a rate of 2/2.

1813



This Berbice two line stamp was used from 1813 to 1830, here shown on an Early Use to Inverness. Although the 2/6 rate should have been sufficient, a 1/2 d Local Delivery Fee was added on arrival.

1820




Berbice two line stamp (Townsend type 1) on 1820 Folded Letter to London rated 2/2.

1821



The Only Recorded Example of Townsend type 4. This 1821 folded letter to London was charged at the rate of 4/4.



1834-1847



The straight line Berbice handstamp (townsend type 3) was used from January 1832 until June 1837 with strikes being seldom clear. This folded letter shows a rate of 2/2 on the front.

The Berbice circular backstamp (townsend type 6) on an 1847 folded letter to London showing the seldom seen 1/2 handstamp (townsend type 10) on front which paid the 1/- rate and the extra rate from Berbice of 2d.
