Although the pilgrims first landed at Provincetown (across Cape Cod from Plymouth), it was at Plymouth (Mass.) that they made their first permanent settlement. The 300th anniversary issue thus honored places, but then – as always – the spotlight was on Plymouth Rock. While still aboard the *Mayflower*, the 41 Pilgrim "Fathers" (sixty-odd others aboard were not Pilgrims) drew up the Compact under which they pledged to make their own "just and equal Laws..."




In the early 1920's, both flat plate and rotary press printing were used, with emphasis on the former. While various perforations or imperforations were employed, perforated 11 found favor as a compromise between stamp sheets too easy or too difficult to tear. New denominations were added to the value list, and new subjects, both personal and institutional.
