



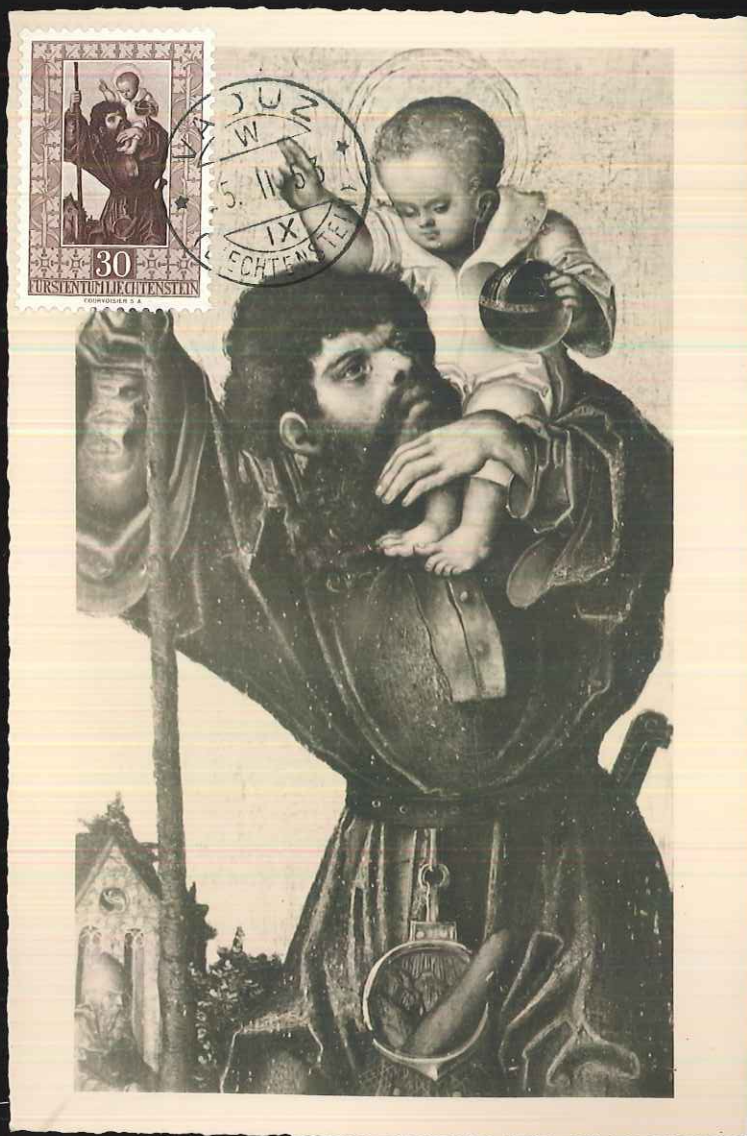

During and immediately after the 1914-18 war, while Liechtenstein was still tied to the Austrian currency by the Customs Union, inflation became so bad that Liechtensteiners lost the inclination to save.

From 1922 to 1925, Government departments placed this rectangular handstamp on their mail encouraging people to "Put your money in the local Savings Bank".

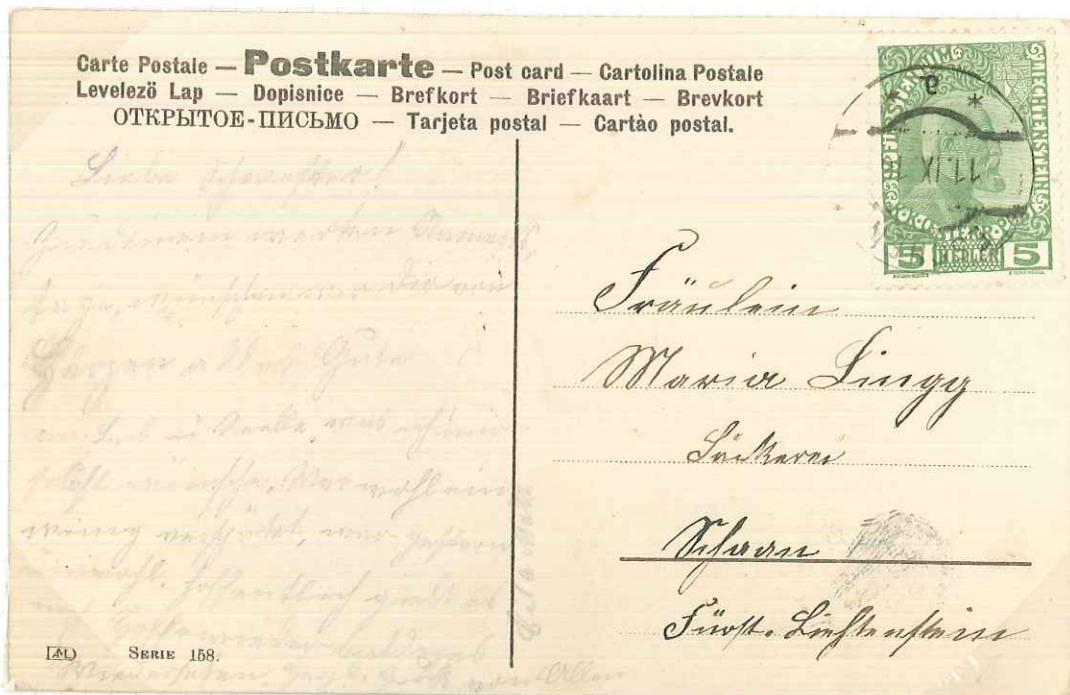

REGISTRATION LABELS (CONT.)

FROM 1928 ONWARDS, THE 'NO.' BEFORE FIGURE WAS DROPPED ENTIRELY AND THE FIGURES WERE CHANGED TO 'BLOCK' TYPE

UP TO NOW, THE LETTERING, FRAMES AND FIGURES HAD ALL BEEN IN BLACK BUT NOW MOST ISSUES APPEARED PART RED AND PART BLACK. ALSO, ON OCCASIONS, WITH THE ADDITION OF THE NAME OF A PARTICULAR EXHIBITION AFTER THE TOWN NAME. SOME WERE PERF, SOME IMPERF. & PERFORATED.

THIS EXAMPLE SHOWS THE FRAME, 'R' AND NUMBER IN BLACK WITH THE TOWN NAME AND EXHIBITION NAME IN RED. IT IS DATED 11.10.34 AND POSTED TO BASEL, SWITZERLAND.

THIS COVER SHOWS THE REVERSE COLOURING OF THE PREVIOUS,
THE FRAME AND 'R' IN RED AND THE TOWN AND NUMBER IN BLACK. IT IS
DATED 5.3.37 AND DIRECTED TO VIENNA FROM TRIESENBERG POST OFFICE.

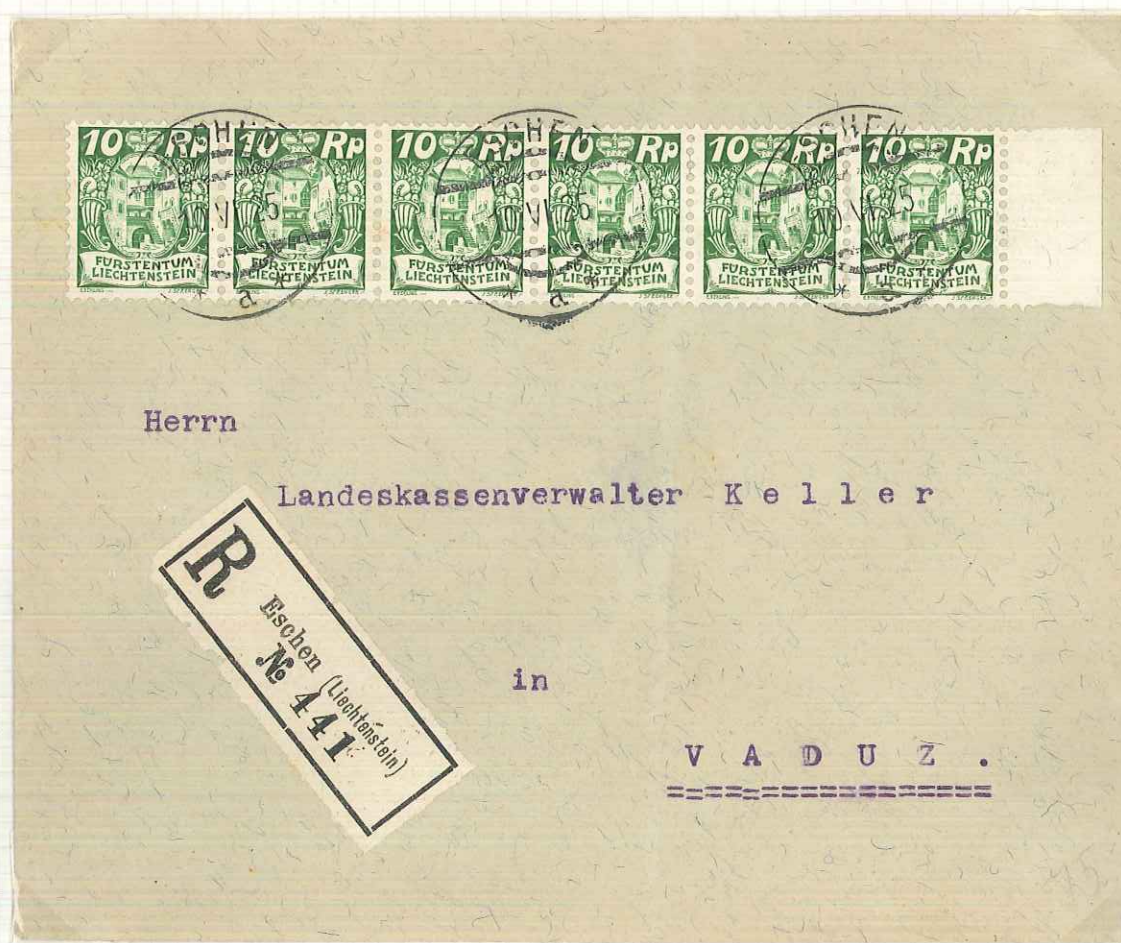

REGISTRATION LABELS (CONT.)

IN 1921, FURTHER LABELS WERE ISSUED BUT ON WHITE PAPER. THEY WERE OF THE SAME FORMAT AND LETTERING AS THE FIRST ISSUE BUT HAD THE COUNTRY'S NAME AFTER THE POST OFFICE. AND WERE ROULETTED.

THIS COVER WAS SENT TO VADUZ FROM ESCHEN ON 10.6.1925.



LABELS OF THIS TYPE WERE ISSUED TO BALKERS, ESCHEN, SCHAAN, TRIESEN, TRIESENBERG AND VADUZ.

NOTE:- THE OFFICE AT TRIESENBERG WAS OPENED ON 1.2.1921.

POSTAGE DUE ISSUES.

1921

As with the 1921 definitive issue, many essays and proofs were produced before the finalised designs were issued. In conjunction with these, essays were also made for postage due stamps in the Swiss currency.

These essays were produced in small sheets of four stamps each with the denomination of 30 rappen. Three sizes of stamps were prepared and the essays printed in seven different colours.



The essays were not adopted and no postage due stamps were issued in the Swiss currency until 12th. April 1928. During this period from 1st. February 1921 until that date, Swiss Postage Due stamps were used in Liechtenstein.
