Overprinting was carried out by Messrs. De La Rue and put on sale in December 1891. Sheets of the 1d, 2d and 6d contained 240 stamps in two panes (10+12). The 4d comprised four panes of 20 stamps. Late in 1893 the 1/- green was similarly overprinted and placed for sale in July 1894.

Two constant varieties are noted. A stop after 'BRITISH' occurs in position 18 (Row 4/3) and a half-forged 'B' in 'Bechuanaland' may also occur in the same position.


