# Plate 11

This letter was posted in MAYBOLE on December 3rd 1841 and received the distinctive Maltese Cross stamp. On the reverse are two rectangular MAYBOLE dated stamps, one very faint in red.



The stamp shows the characteristic break in the NE square. There is a dot on the E of ONE.

This letter was posted in LONDON on May 13th 1841 where it received a red Charing Cross receiving house backstamp and a black Maltese Cross cancellation on the stamp. It was sent to BATH where it received a blackish-green dated double arc backstamp.



The stamp shows the typical small break at the left end of the NE corner frame. The 7 o'clock ray is missing and the 'F' is tall. The colour is one of those seen almost exclusively on the early plates.

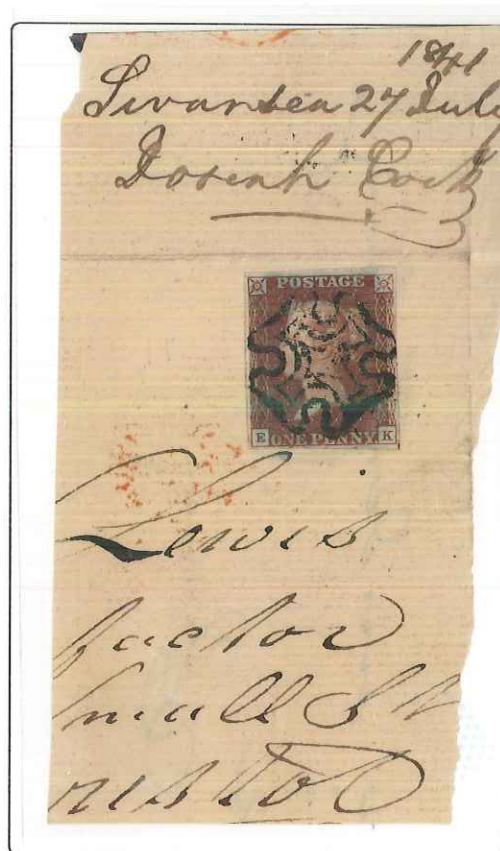
