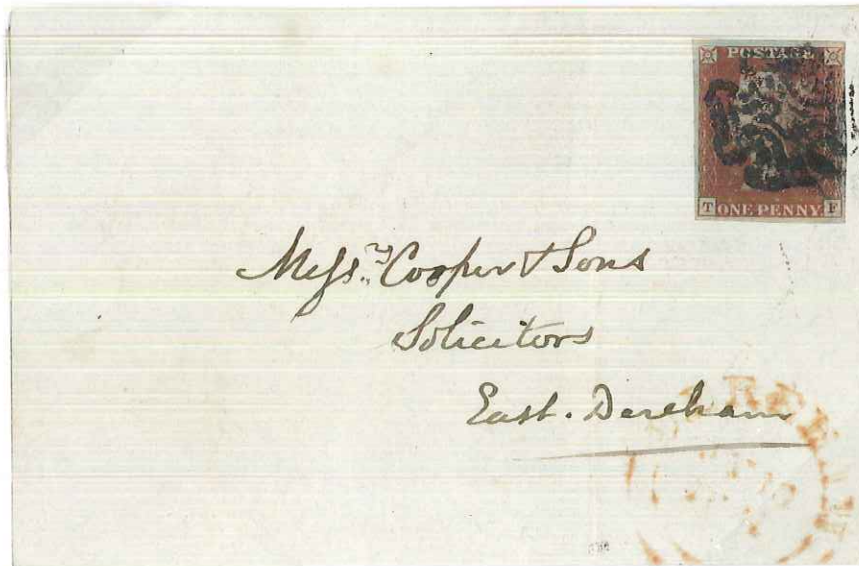
NB shows a tilted N and the NE square is nearly open.

'BD' is a 4-margined example from Plate XI and overlapped slightly at the right on to another 1d red. The latter has had a horizontal piece added at the bottom with the letterings 'DJ' and a triangular piece added at the right above the 'J' square. The lettered piece added, 'DJ' is also from Plate XI. Is this an attempt to use an already cancelled stamp by removing the areas that were postmark or just a very careless postal clerk in the busy Manchester Office?

The PL in oval on the front indicates 'Paid Letter' and was applied in Manchester, County Catalogue M391 and given a rarity 'F' attribution – much rarer than the same strike in black.

Each stamp is tied by the distinctive Manchester Fishtail cross. In Volume 1 of Rockoff and Jackson, the EKD of usage of the Manchester Fishtail cross is on a 1d black cover for March 2nd 1841. The EKD for a 1d red with this same cross is March 3rd 1841 but this example is in the Fletcher Collection housed in the British Library in London. The next date of usage of this cross on a 1d red recorded by them is on March 9th 1841 seen in a R C Alcock Weekly List in May 1967 and the next date of usage on a 1d red is for March 13th 1841 from the Stillwell Collection. Hence the usage of this cross on March 12th 1841 is not only one of the earliest known on a 1d red but IS the earliest recorded multiple usage on 1d reds.

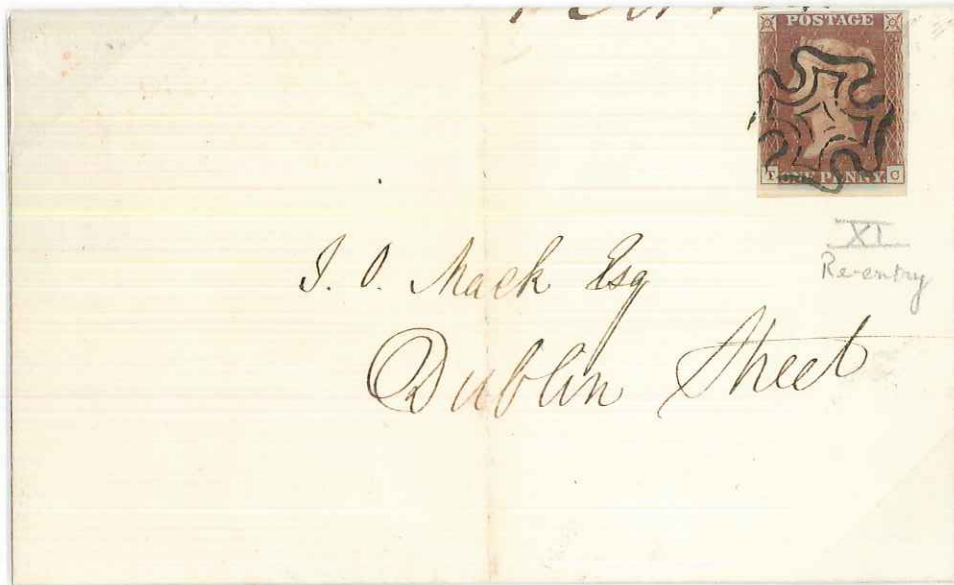

On the reverse is a strike of the 'From 7 to 8 PM' in diamond which is only recorded on Dublin letters. This is a late fee mark where the extra charge paid resulted in the 1d red being affixed. McKay in 'Irish Postmarks Since 1840' notes these marks – various times recorded – which indicate posting after normal time for accepting mail to be despatch, to be Very Rare. This is believed to be the Earliest Known Irish usage of 1d red plate X1. The usage of the late fee mark with plate X1 may well be unique.
