



A Commercial Cover Sent by Surface Mail to Vienna Austria from Baghdad, 1937

A Commercial Cover Sent by Surface Mail to Germany from Baghdad, 1935


It paid 15 fils and was canceled with a bilingual "Baghdad- As Samauel" strike on 29th August 1935.

A Cover Sent by Surface Mail from a Member of the Iraqi Notable Bashayan Family of Basra Sent from Baghdad to the USA, 1927.

It paid 3 annas and canceled with a bilingual Baghdad strike on 7th November, 1927.



A Cover with a Letter in Persian from Najaf-Iraq to Isfahan-Iran, Nov. 1928


A cover enclosing a letter in Persian sent from Najaf, Iraq to Isfahan paying 3annas and was canceled with a bilingual Najaf on 9th November, 1928. The back shows a bilingual strike of Isfahan on the equivalent of 15th Nov.(?).





A Cover Sent from Baghdad to the Less Common Destination of Dublin- Ireland 1928


The cover was sent by surface mail from Baghdad to Ireland paying the correct rate of 6Annas and canceled with a bilingual Baghdad strike on 6th October 1928.





It paid 3 annas and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad strike on 8th April 1933






A commercial post card sent by surface mail from Baghdad to USA .It paid 8 fils and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad – Al Samauel strike on 6th August 1933





Printed Matter Rate from Baghdad to USA Paying ½ anna Canceled with a Bilingual Baghdad H.O. Strike on 10th February 1927.

A Cover Sent from the American School for Boys in Baghdad to Newton University Mass, 1933.

It paid 15 fils and was cancelled with a scarce strike of bilingual Baghdad-Al Rashid on 30th May 1933. The back shows a bilingual strike of Baghdad Sort on the same day.



A Cover with a Rare TELKAIF Cancel to England, 1939

The cover was sent from the quite uncommon little town of Telkaif, a centre for Iraqi Christians near Mosul It paid 3 fils, the printed matter rate to F canceled with a bilingual This cancel



A Redirected Cover from Basrah to Arbil and onto Baghdad ,1933.

The cover was sent from Basrah to Baghdad addressed in English but then was redirected in Arabic to Arbil, North of Iraq. It paid 8 fils and was canceled with a bilingual Basrah strike on 28th April. The back shows a Baghdad Dely strike on 30th April. There is also another Baghdad strike on 1st May and a bilingual Arbil strike on 2nd May.

It took two days for the letter to make it to Baghdad and was redirected to Arbil in the North the following day.



A Cover from Baghdad to Calcutta-India, 1925.

It paid 3 annas and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad, H.O. strike on 15th June 1925.

The back shows two strikes of Baghdad and of Calcutta on 29th June, 1925.




A Printed Cover Rate Sent from Mosul to
Boston, USA, 1928
The cover was sent from Bashir Allouse who
became later a very well known Iraqi
Scientific Educator, Researcher and Author



It paid only 3 fils, the printed matter rate canceled on 3rd May 1928. The cover shows a hand violet strike indicating it originated from: "B.E.Allouse" Mosul-Iraq.

A Commercial Cover Carried by Surface Mail from Basrah to St Louis, USA, 1938 (A very late date for the cancel!)

Paid only 3fils, the printed matter rate and was canceled with a bilingual Basrah City strike on 3rd August 1938. P&P indicates the cancel was known only up to 1930!. The back shows two strikes of Basra Sort on 3rd and Baghdad Sort on 4th.



A Cover Sent Surface Mail From the Uncommon Location of FALUJA to Detroit, US, 1923

It paid 3 annas and was canceled with the rare bilingual FALUJA strike, (Unrecorded by P&P). It was sent back to Baghdad before it began its journey west. The Faluja strike is dated 12th Oct 1923 while the bilingual Baghdad H.O. was dated 14th October.



A Cover Showing an Early Stamp Usage and Cancel Sent from Kirkuk to Baghdad, 1923

It paid 2 annas and was canceled with an all English strike of Kirkuk dated 7th October, 1923. This is an early usage of the stamp since these Mandate stamps were delivered only a month earlier. Also, Iraq then was still under the effective control of Britain with the Iraqi Kingdom declared only a month earlier in August. The all English Kirkuk cancel is of the occupation period and indicates that the authorities had not started to cater to the wishes of the people by introducing an Arabic part to the cancel especially in Kirkuk, the centre for the oil industry which was under British control. However, the back shows a bilingual strike of Baghdad P.O. This cancel appears to have been missed listing by Pearson and Proud.




A Cover Baghdad Cantonment to Vienna-Austria, via Istanbul, 1930

It paid 3 annas and was canceled with a bilingual strike of Baghdad-Cantonment on 4th April, 1930.

The back shows a wavy machine cancel of Istanbul on 11th April and a bilingual strike of Baghdad Sort. On 4th.



A Printed Matter Rate Cover Sent by Surface Mail from Baghdad to New Malden, England, 1928.



The printed matter cover was sent by surface mail and paid the correct amount of only ½ anna. It was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad strike on 6th August 1928.

A Printed Card from Basra City to STAMFORD UNIVERSITY, US, 1927.

The printed post card written in English was sent from Basrah City to Stamford University, California but redirected to Long Beach.

It paid 1 ½ anna and was canceled with a bilingual Basrah City strike on 17th June 1927. The front shows a circular strike of Stamford University on 24th July. The back shows a bilingual Basra-Sort strike on 17th June.

The sender had an address in central Baghdad.



A Cover Sent from the American Consulate in Baghdad to the US, 1929



The cover's senders address is at the American Consulate Baghdad. It paid 3 annas and was canceled with a a bilingual Lower Baghdad on 22nd October, 1929.

An Official Cover from "The American School for Boys" Which Was Renamed Later for Political Reasons as "Baghdad College". It was Addressed to Newton a Small Hamlet Outside Boston, USA,1933.

It paid 15fils for surface mail and canceled with the scarce strike of bilingual Baghdad Ar-Rashid on 15th April 1933. The back shows a bilingual strike of Baghdad-Sorting on the same day.



A Commercial Cover Sent by Surface Mail from Baghdad to New York, 1937

It paid 15 fils and was canceled by a bilingual Baghdad strike on 2nd November 1937.

It paid 15 fils for surface mail and was canceled with Baghdad-Ar Rashid strike, a less common cancel of Baghdad on 14th June 1933.

The back shows the strike of bilingual Baghdad –Sort on the same date.

An elegantly printed and produced Christmas greeting card tied with a blue ribbon and showing a printed scene of Basra. It was made available to the British occupying forces, on behalf of the 34th Brigade in Baghdad for Christmas 1917. It uses as the greeting verse an old Iraqi greeting which states:

"May the best of the days of the year that is gone, be worse than the worst of the days still to come"



An Air Mail Cover from Baghdad Cantonment to England, 1927

Air Mail Cover sent from Baghdad RAF Cantonment to England paying the correct rate of 6 annas and was canceled with a bilingual strike of BAGHDAD CANTONMENT on 27th May 1927.

A Cover from Baghdad Cantonment to England by Air Mail, 1928.

It paid 6 annas and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad- Cantonment strike on 9th April, 1928. A printed red box indicating AIR MAIL is on the front.



Torn

A Cover Sent Air Mail from Baghdad RAF Cantonment to London 1932 (Showing a Late Usage of the Annas Stamps and an Unrecorded Late Date for the Cancel)

It paid 6 annas and was canceled with a bilingual strike of Baghdad Cantonment on 15th January 1932 which is close to the date when such stamps became invalid after adopting the new currency and its stamps appeared, Also, according to Pearson and Proud the cancel was last seen in May 1930 ,i.e. almost two years earlier.



An Air Mail Cover Sent via KLM Airlines from the RAF Base of Habania, Named Dibban to Folkstone Kent, 1938



It paid 39fils using mixed franking and was canceled with the rather rare bilingual strike of Dibban on 12 April 1938.

Air Letter Sent from Habbanya-RAF Air Base in Iraq to Liverpool, UK, 1945.

It paid 39fils and was canceled with a bilingual Habbanya on 31st July 1945. It shows a censor's hand strike and machine cancel of Baghdad. It was written by a person with an address .in the Civil Cantonment of the Base.



An Air Mail Cover from Mosul to the Village of Ashbourne, England ,1933.

It paid 55 fils for air mail and was canceled with a bilingual Mosul strike on 15th March, 1933. The back shows a bilingual strike of Baghdad Sorting on 16th March.



An Air Mail Cover Carried by KLM Airlines from Baghdad to London and then Redirected to Croydon, 1937.


It paid 39fils and was canceled with the scarce bilingual strike of Baghdad, Ar Rashid on 31st May 1937. The back shows a bilingual Baghdad Sorting and a London arrival strike on 4th June, 1937.

It took only four days!




A "On His Majesty's Service" Cover Used Privately Sent by Air from Baghdad to Worthing England, 1928

It paid 6 and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad-Exchange strike on 30th March 1928. It shows a yellow Air Mail sticker in English and French.



An Air Mail Cover Carried by Imperial Airways from Baghdad to London, 1935



The cover appears to have originated from the Imperial Airways office in Baghdad and addressed to their Air Terminus in London. It paid 15 fils and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad-Exchange on 17th January, 1935.

A Commercial Cover Sent Air Mail from Baghdad Vienna, Austria, 1928

It paid 6 annas and was canceled with the scarce Baghdad Exchange Square, (JAMIMERJAN) strike on 30th Oct(?) 1928.



A Commercial Cover Sent by Air via IMPERIAL AIRWAYS from Baghdad to New York, 1935

The letter paid 15 fils and canceled with a bilingual Al Samauel strike on 20th May 1935. The back shows a bilingual strike of BAGHDAD-Sort. On the same day. A British Air Mail Sticker is applied with a type written in red "BY IMPERIAL AIRWAYS"

A Registered Commercial Cover Sent by Air via IMPERIAL AIRWAYS from Baghdad to Prague, showing strikes of Brandisi, and Venice Italy, and taking only FOUR days, 1938.


The letter paid 48 fils canceled with a bilingual Al Samawal ,Baghdad on 6th January 1938. There is on the front a slogan cancel in violet indicating "AIR MAIL BY Imperial Airways". There is also a REGISTERED strike and a Registration label of bilingual Baghdad As-Samawal with a red strike of registration number 1491. The back shows the letter made it to Barandisi-ltaly only two days later, with a transit strike of Venice dated the 9th and a Prague arrival on the 10th. The Back also shows a strike of Baghdad Reg on the 6th and AS-SAMAWAL, Baghdad on 6th. Thus it made Baghdad to Prague in only four days!



An Air Mailed Cover from Basrah to New York Carried by Air from Basrah to Cairo, 1928.

It paid 6 fils and was cancelled by a bilingual Basrah strike on 6th March 1928

The front of the cover shows a bold printed in blue "AIR MAIL-BASRAH-CAIRO", then it went surface mail.





An Air Mailed Cover Carried by Imperial Airways from Baghdad to Elizabeth, New Jersey, USA, 1934.



The cover supports a blue label "BY AIR MAIL- PAR AVION" as well as a type written message:

"BY IMPERIAL AIRWAYS". It paid 15 fils and was cancelled with a bilingual As-Samawal – Baghdad on 7th

March 1934.



It paid 35 fils using the older stamps of Faisal-I canceled with a bilingual As Samawal-Baghdad strike on 11th October 1935.


There is on the front a boxed hand strike of "CANCELED BOMBAY DELY" and a hand written in red Air Mail.

It paid 6 ½ Ryals and 10 Chahis totaling 7 ½ Ryals canceled with a bilingual strike of Tehran on 24th August 1938. The back shows a bilingual strike of Baghdad Sort dated 25th August.



A Air Mailed Cover from Abadan, Iran to England Basrah, Iraq, From the Anglo-Iranian Oil Co., 1929


The cover embossed at the back by a double elliptical sign of the Anglo-Iranian Oil Co., paid 49 Chahis and canceled with a bilingual Abadan Depart on 18th December 1929. The back shows a bilingual Basrah-Sort strike dated 18th December.

An Air Mail Cover to Wmbley – England from the RAF Baghdad Cantonment by Air through Baghdad-Cairo It paid 4 ½ annas and was canceled with a bilingual strike on 3rd June 1926 of Baghdad Cantonment,



Air Mail Cover from Basra City to Lincoln-England, 1926

An Air Mail Cover printed in blue "AIR MAIL/BAGHDAD_CAIRO" from Basra City to Lincoln-England. It paid 6 annas and was canceled with a bilingual ,Basra City on 3rd June 1926

An air mail cover overprinted locally in blue in two lines with a bar between AIR MAIL / Baghdad - London. It is sent from Baghdad to England (OXFORD SHIRE) and addressed to Flight Lt. H.N. Hampton, D.F.C. The rate charged is 23 Fils (#66D) cancelled with a bilingual circular (BAGHDAD CANTONMENT) dated 6th Dec. 34 /4-pm. No markings on the back

An Air Mail Cover Sent from Basra to Cairo-Egypt, Representing a Late Usage of the Annas Stamps, 1st January 1932

The cover which shows affixed a serrated blue rectangular British label was sent by air from Basra to Cairo, Egypt. It paid 6 annas and was canceled by a bilingual Basra strike on 1st January 1932. This represents a very late usage of the annas valued stamp, since only some three months later a new national currency was introduced and such stamps became invalid shortly after.

The Back shows a bilingual strike of Cairo on 4th January, 1932 indicating in Arabic، مصروصل بالطيار , which translates into :

" Arrived by Plane"

A Commercial Cover Sent by Air Mail from Baghdad to London England, 1930

It paid 6 annas and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad strike on 28th May 1930



An Air Mail Cover from Baghdad to London 1926

The cover shows payment of 14 ½ annas canceled with a bilingual Baghdad strike on 17th November 1926.

The cover was addressed to Stanley Gibbons



An Air Mail Cover from Dhibban, (The RAF station of Habbania) to Bristol-England, 1937

The cover was sent by air from the RAF station of Habbania and paid the correct rate of 33 fils and canceled with the scarce Dhibban strike on 28th October, 1937.



An Air Mail Cover from Baghdad to England, Sowing an Unlisted Cancel, 1934


Air Mail Cover sent from Baghdad to England paying the correct rate of 16 fils and was canceled on 9th March 1934 using a bilingual strike of Baghdad not recorded by P.&P. where the Arabic name appears at the top.

It has a blue BY AIR MAIL ,PAR AVION sticker attached.



A Cover Sent Surface Mail from the Kurdish Town of Sulaimania to the Uncommon Destination of Vancouver-Canada, 1927

The cover shows wrongly a written by AIR MAIL while the stamps paid were for printed/card rate It paid 1 ½ annas and was canceled with a bilingual Sulaimania strike on 7th December, 1927. The back shows the bilingual Sort cancel of Baghdad on the 9th.



Air Mail Cover from Baghdad to Vienna, 1937

The cover was sent rom Baghdad to Vienna and paid 33fils. It was cancelled with the scarce cancel of Ar Rashid –Baghdad on 23rd September 1937.

The back shows a bilingual Baghdad Sort cancel on same day. There is also "WIEN NEUSTAD" cancel on 27th September with another cancel of "Hinter Brunel" on the same day. It is remarkable that it took only FOUR days to get to Vienna in 1937!



An Air Mail Cover from Hilla- Iraq via Baghdad to USA, 1929

The cover was sent by air from the provincial town of Hilla (near Babylon) to Long Beach – California. via Baghdad.

It paid 6 annas and was canceled by a bilingual strike of Hilla on 26th January, 1929. The back shows a bilingual Baghdad Sorting strike dated on 27th January.



A Commercial Air Mail Cover from Baghdad to Budapest, Hungary, 1927

It paid the correct amount of 6 annas and was canceled with a bilingual Baghdad on 10th December, 1927
It shows on the back a machine cancel of bilingual
Cairo, مصر, a strike of Budapest on 19th December and another dated the 20th



An Air Mail Cover from Amarah-Iraq to Marseille- France, 1929

The cover was sent from the provincial town of Amarah in southern Iraq to Marseille, France via Baghdad. It paid 9 annas and was canceled by a bilingual strike of Amarah on 4th April, 1929. It shows a bilingual Baghdad Sorting strike dated on 7th April. The back also shows a Marseille strike dated the 16th April.



A Cover Sent by Air Mail to the London TIMES from Maqil-Basra on 6th April 1929.

It paid 6 annas for transport via BASRA-CAIRO to the London Times. It was canceled with a bilingual MAQIL on 6th April 1929. There is also on the back the bilingual strike of Basra on the same day.

An Air Mail Letter From Basra to RAF Station Ruislip (Redirected)England With Mixed Franking


An Air Mail letter sent from BASRA to RAF Station Ruislip(redirected)

The back shows a bilingual Basra-SOR.dated two days later on 18th May.

There is an additional strike on the front (reading "Greece?")





A "By Imperial Airways" Letter from BASRA to the RAF Depot at ABOUKIR EGYPT

An Air Mail letter sent from BASRA to Egypt and overprinted in blue BY IMPERIAL AIRWAYS.

The envelope has a prominent water mark of an airplane. It is posted from Basra to the RAF Depot at Aboukir in Egypt.

It paid 22fils(#62C). Canceled with a bilingual BASRA-Sorting dated 12th September 1935 at 11.15AM. The back shows a bilingual (Arabic and French) cancel indicating ARRIVED BY AIR-Alexandria.





IRAQ-1929 Air Mail from Baghdad to England

An Air Mail Cover flown from Baghdad via Cairo to Wembley England showing a BAGHDAD CANTONMENT bilingual circular cancel dated 30th March 1929 /5PM.No arrival date is shown.

The rate paid is 4 1/2 annas using Scott#1.
The cover shows printed in blue






