Punjab in India

I suppose a new
Presidency, and Internal
Alteration as to Boundary
Policy in reference to
Rupia - I have told
Mr. Tufan, if he requires
my accounts with him
to be signed at any
time, to apply to you.
I suppose you appoint
a proper Agent to
receive & superintend
the Leicestershire Receipts
until I return - which
I hope may not be very
long. I consider myself

very ill used in not
being promoted, but
not having asked for
it can say no more.

I have now applied
to the Rev Trust Lord
direct, and shall wait
the issue before taking
other steps - The Museum
of Natural History has given
me a beautiful *Canis lupus*
skull for study. I will
write again soon about
his going to Rhodes, also
to our worthy friend
Hindley. This is to go
via Aden by the Consul's
ship - With best regards to
