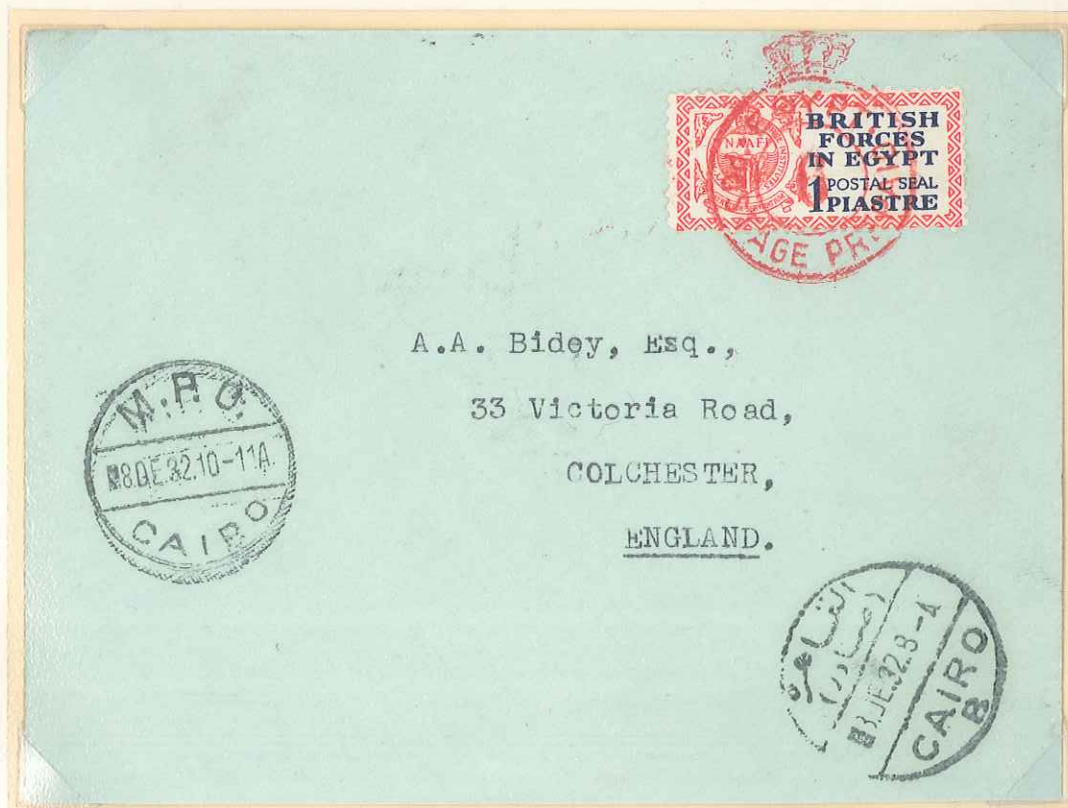

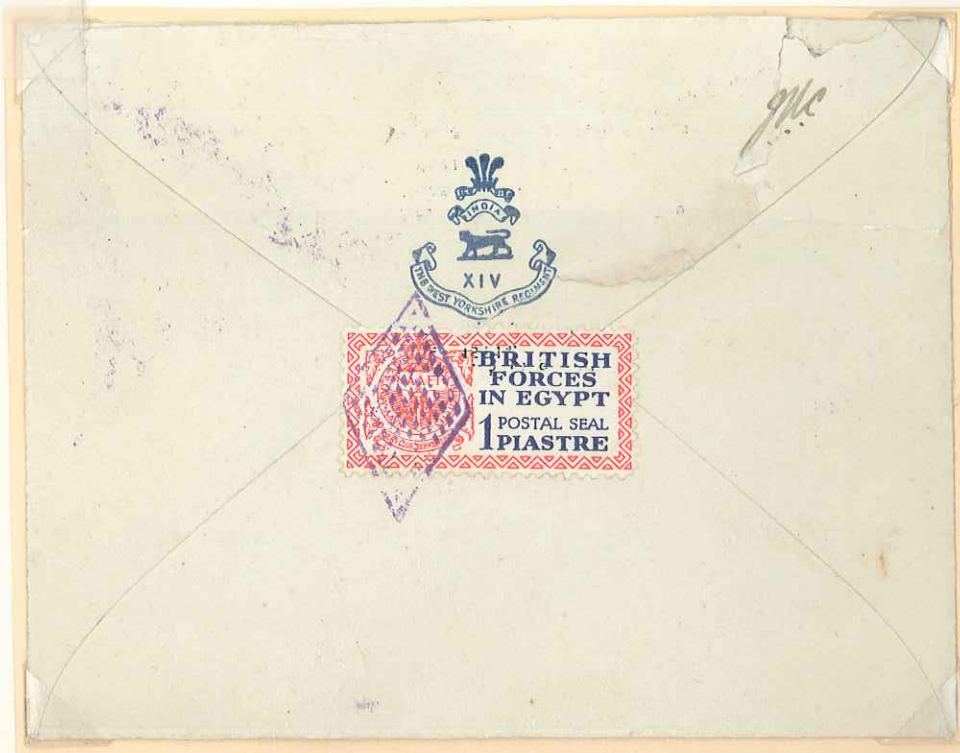

The rate of Postal Seal apply to UK only the cover was taxed on arrival in Ferozepore India on August 1933. Various markings have been made. Postal Seal correctly affixed and cancelled with black Retta (9 x 9) dots.



Cover to England from Cairo on 8th December 1932. Postal Seal wrongly placed on front of cover, and cancelled with Crown cancel which is contravened the postal agreement. The Seal was to be placed on back of covers: B /s M.P.O Cairo and Cairo Civil.

Cover to England from Moascar. This cover is one of the earliest cover recorded. Sent from Moascar 7th November. Both the Crown Cancel no.8 and B/s Moascar is cancelled in mauve colour which is rare. The B/s Moascar also has the error O widely separated from the P. This cancellation was in use for 3 months only. Postal Seal correctly affixed and cancelled with the mauve colour Retta, (9 x 9) dots.



Cover to England from Moascar with Crown Cancel no.8 in red and B/s M.P.O Moascar dated 15th December 1932. Also a very early cover. The cancellation also have the error, the O widely separated from the P. This cancellation was in use for 3 months only. Postal seal correctly affixed and cancelled with the unusual mauve colour retta, (9 x 9) dots.

Cover to England, cancelled with Crown Cansel no.3, for Moascar and B/s M.P.O Moascar 11th May 1933. Postal Seal correctly affixed and cancell with **unusual mauve colour Retta**, (9 x 9) dots. This is a mourning cover, seldom seen.



Cover to England from Port Said. On front cancelled with Crown Cancel no.10 for Navy House Port said and Port Said Civil cancellation dated 16th March 1933. Postal Seal is correctly affixed, and **canceled wrongly with the Crown Cancel. This contravened the Postal Concession Instructions, because the Crown Cancel was to be used on the front of cover.**

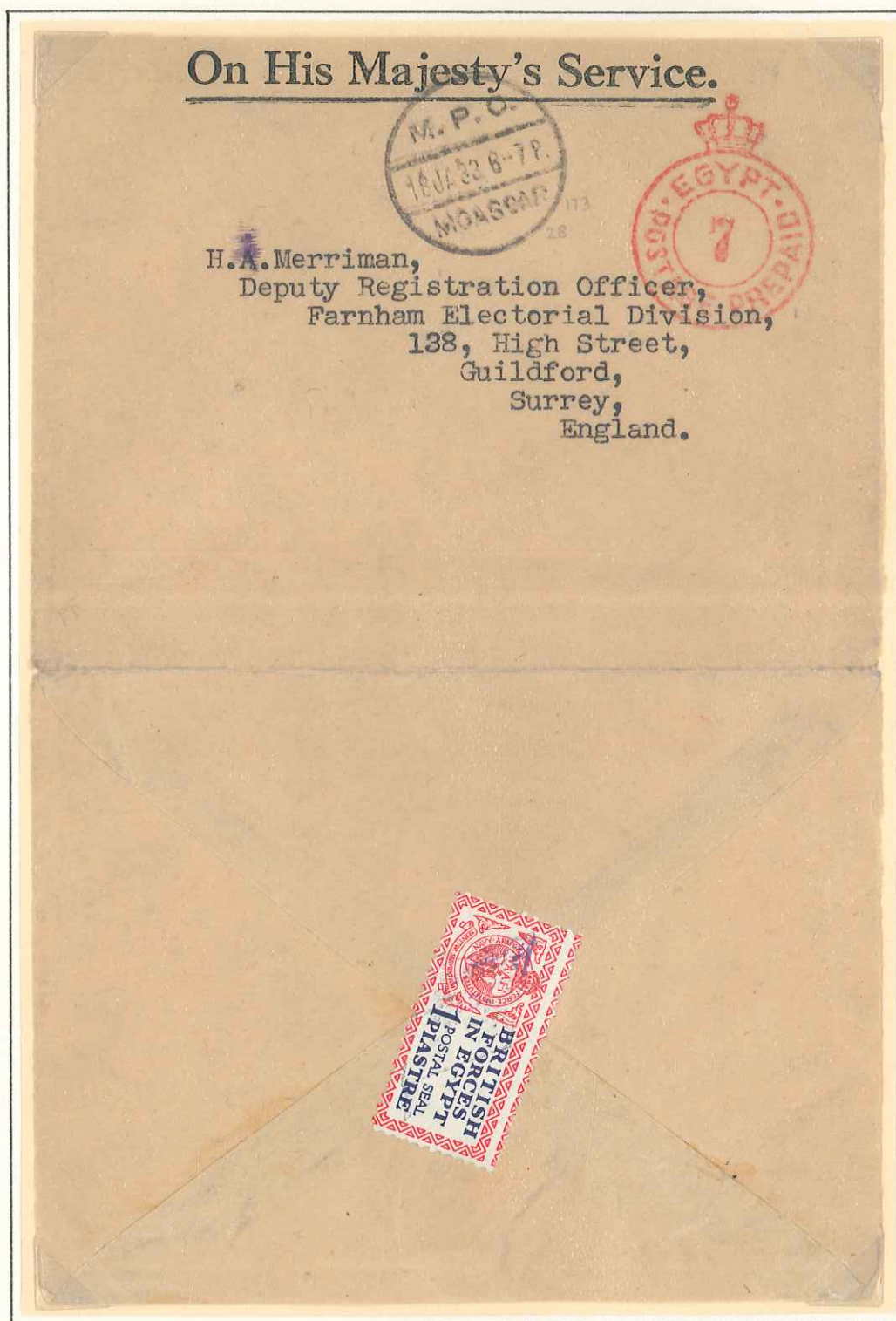

The release date of the Postal Seal was 1st November 1932. Arrival cancellation London S.W.1 15th November 1932. Postal Seal cancelled with black retta (10 x 9) dots.



Cover to England from Cairo. Cancelled with red Crown Cancel no.6 and curved M.P.O. Cairo 30th November 1932. Postal Seal correctly affixed and cancelled with black retta (9 x 9) dots.

On the back Letter Seal has not been cancelled. **Even though the Postal Coession had been in use for more than a year or so, post offices in England did not realise that the Seals on the back of the covers denoted that the postage had been paid, and therefore, charged the receipt postage due of 3d.**



Cover to England from Cairo cancelled with Crown Cancel no.4. The Letter Seal has the **Variety no. 15 "line across E"**. The seal is cancelled with black Retta, (10 x 9) dots.



Cover to England from Cairo. Letter Seal affixed on the front of cover contravened the Postal Concession Agreement. Should have been on the back of the cover. Crown Cancel no.5 for Cairo. Also curved Cairo dated 29th April 1934.

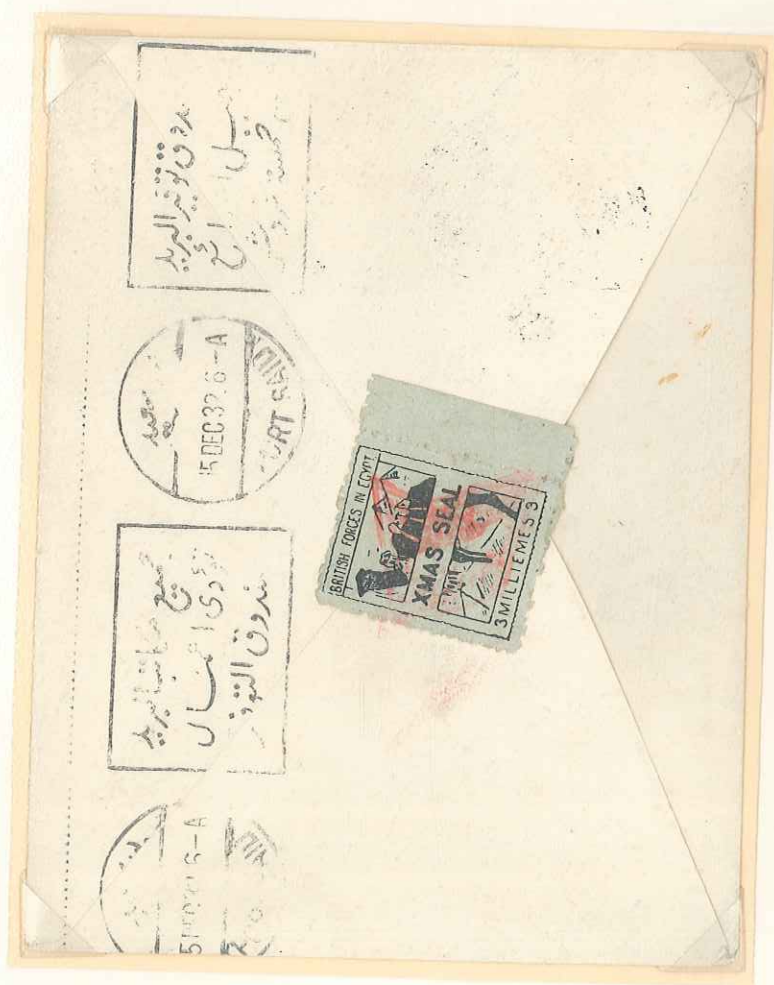

Seal correctly affixed and cancelled with black Retta (9 x 9) dots. **Unusual stamp on cover. Ex-Hobbs.**

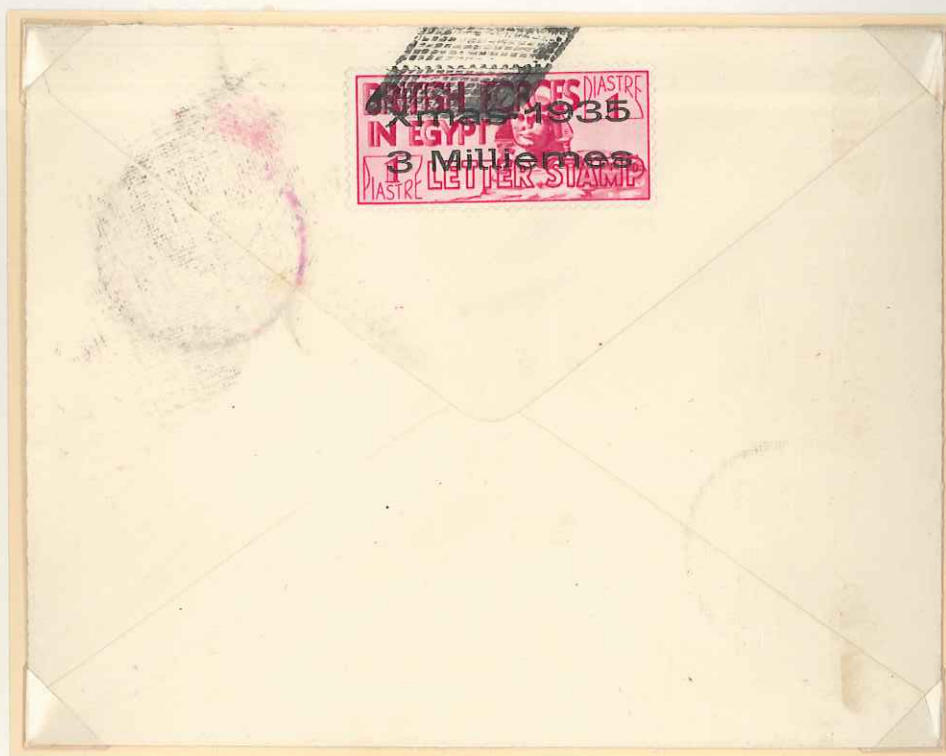

B/s Cairo M.P.O dated 17th December 1935. Provisional Issue correctly affixed and cancelled with black Retta, (17x 15) dots.



Cover from Abu Qir to Scotland, cancelled with Crown Cancel no.14 and B/s Abu Qir Civil dated 16th December 1935, **which was the First Day of Issue**. Also B/s Alexandria M.P.O dated the same day. Provisional Issue correctly affixed and cancelled with black Retta, (9 x 9) dots. **Destination Scotland is rather unusual with the Provisional Issue.**



Cover from Abu Qir to England, cancelled with Crown Cancel no.14, and B/s Abu Qir Civil dated 6th May 1935 **which is the First day of Issue which make this cover very rare, as the 6th May was a service holiday in Egypt**. POSTAL CONCESSION BRITISH FORCES IN EGYPT

The use of the present letter stamp which is sold at all N.A.A.F.I. Institutes in connection with the postal concession for the British Forces in Egypt will be discontinued with effect from 1st March, 1936.

On that date a special postage stamp issued by the Egyptian Postal Administration, with the effigy of H.M. King Fuad, and marked "Army Post" will be placed on sale at all N.A.A.F.I. Institutes.

These special stamps will cost 1 piastre, the same as the letter stamps now used, and the only difference will be that they will be placed on the top right hand corner of an envelope on the front, the same as an ordinary postage stamp.

Letters bearing these stamps must continue to be posted in military or Royal Air Force post boxes, and should not be placed in Egyptian Post Boxes.

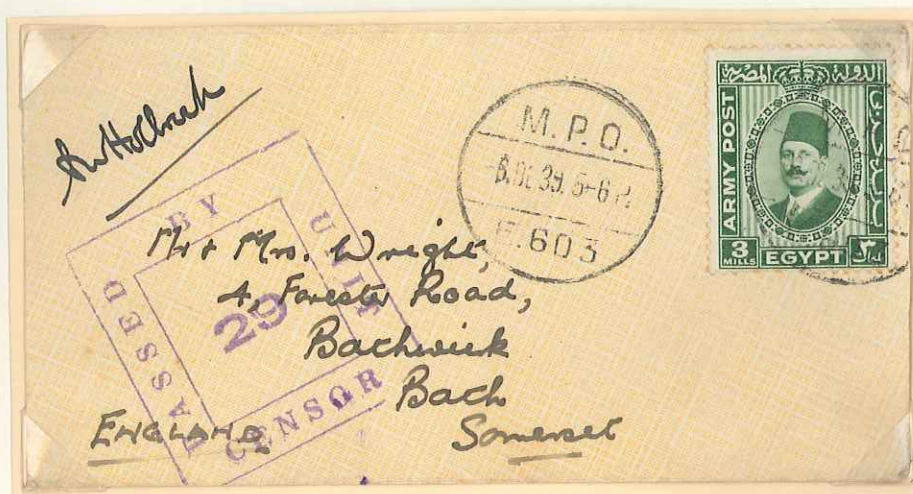
Any member of the Forces in possession of an excessive number of the letter stamps now in use (red), may forward them to the Camp Commandant, Headquarters, B.T.E., provided they are not mutilated and are in good condition, up to the 29th February, 1936, when he will be refunded the face value thereof should he so desire.

In order to cover those who have only a few of the present letter stamps, i.e. not worth commutation, they will be accepted in Military Post Offices as stamps on letters up to and including the 15th March, 1936. After that date they will cease to be of postal value and any letter bearing the present letter stamp will be taxed on arrival in the United Kingdom or Ireland.

The use of the new stamp is covered by the same conditions as apply at present to the letter stamp, i.e. they can only be used for the postage of letters to the United Kingdom and Ireland, including the Irish Free State, and must not be used on letters to any colony, possession, or foreign country, or for air mail, registered letters or parcels.

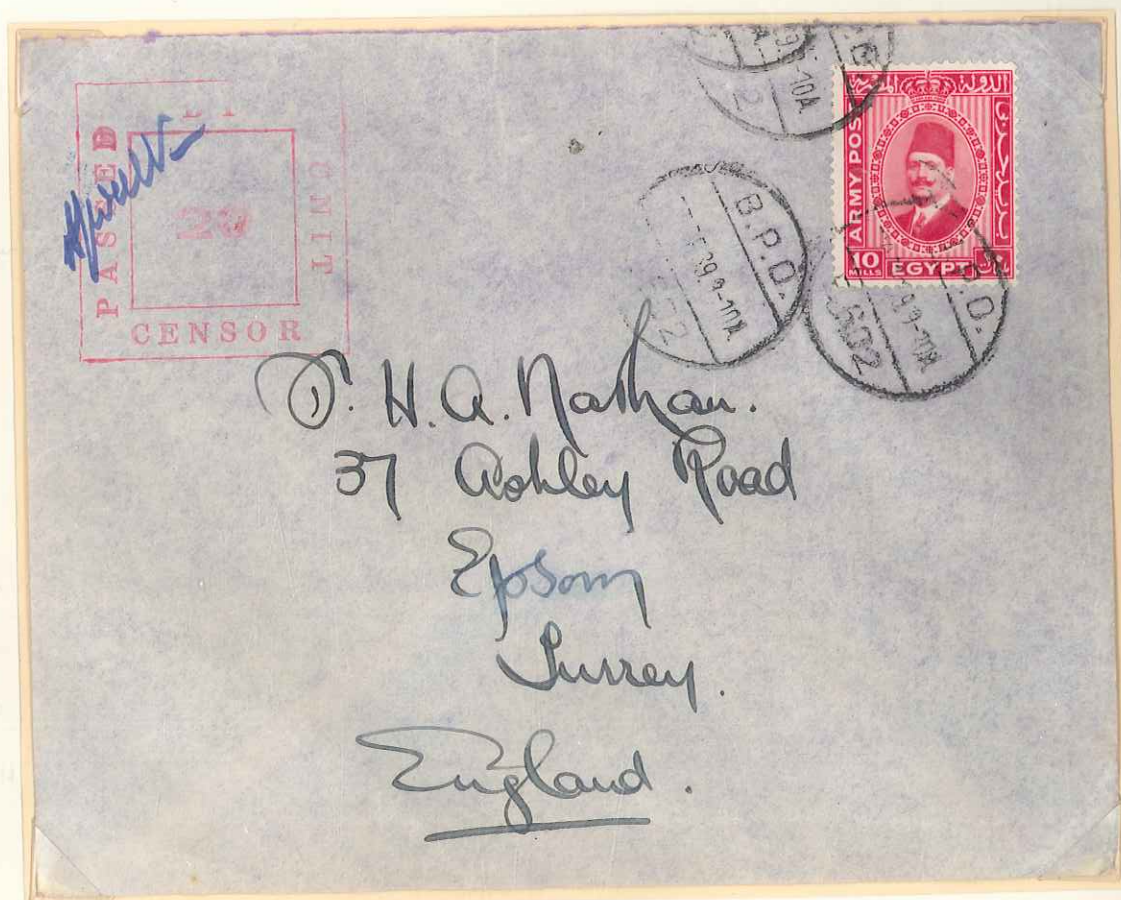

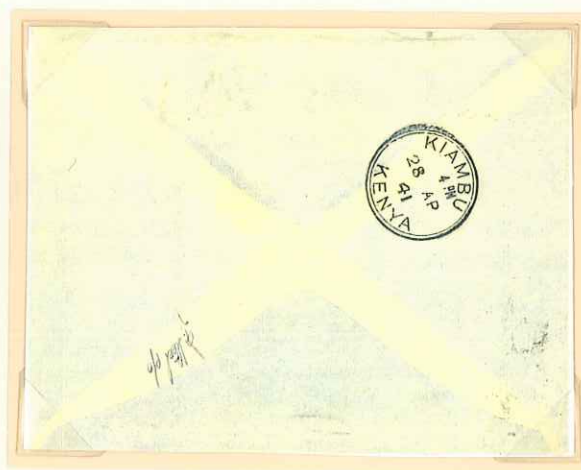

Cover from Sidi Gaber to Alexandria on February 28, 1940. The cover had been posted from M.P.O.E.607 through the Civil Post Office. As it was not posted through the Military Channels it was therefore treated as an unpaid letter and taxed 10 milliemes on delivery. **The combination of Army Stamps S.G.A.14 & S.G.A.15 is very seldom seen.**
