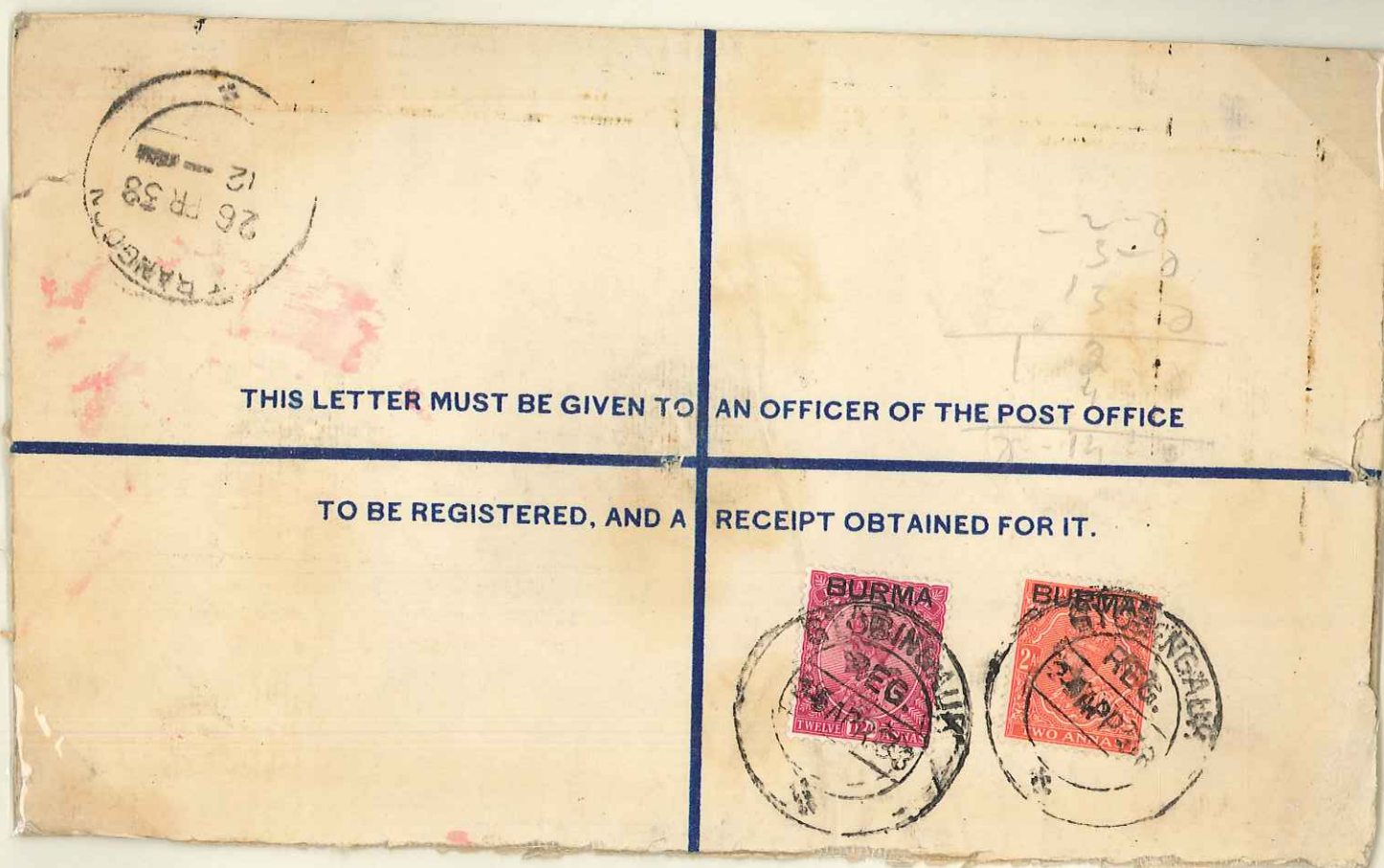

On the outbreak of war, the "All-Up" Empire air mail service to the U.K. was suspended on 6 September 1939. A flat rate per half ounce to the U.K. of 14 annas for postage and air fee combined was introduced and the service was operated by B.O.A.C.



27 September 1939: This obliterator, originally introduced in the nineteenth century in India, had been discontinued in almost all post offices in Burma by 1939. Kalemio was a small station in the isolated Chin Hills and probably continued with the old practices

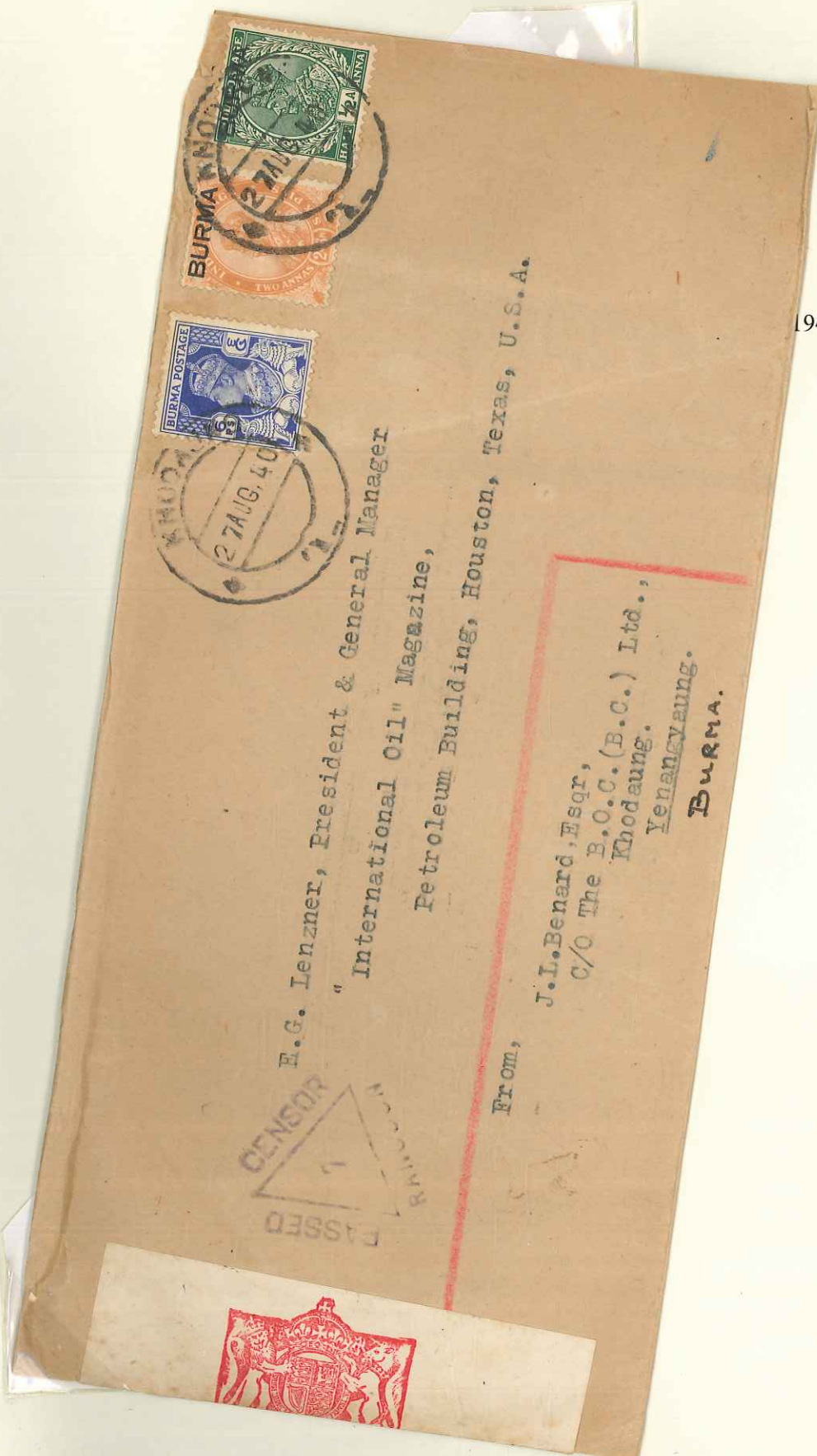

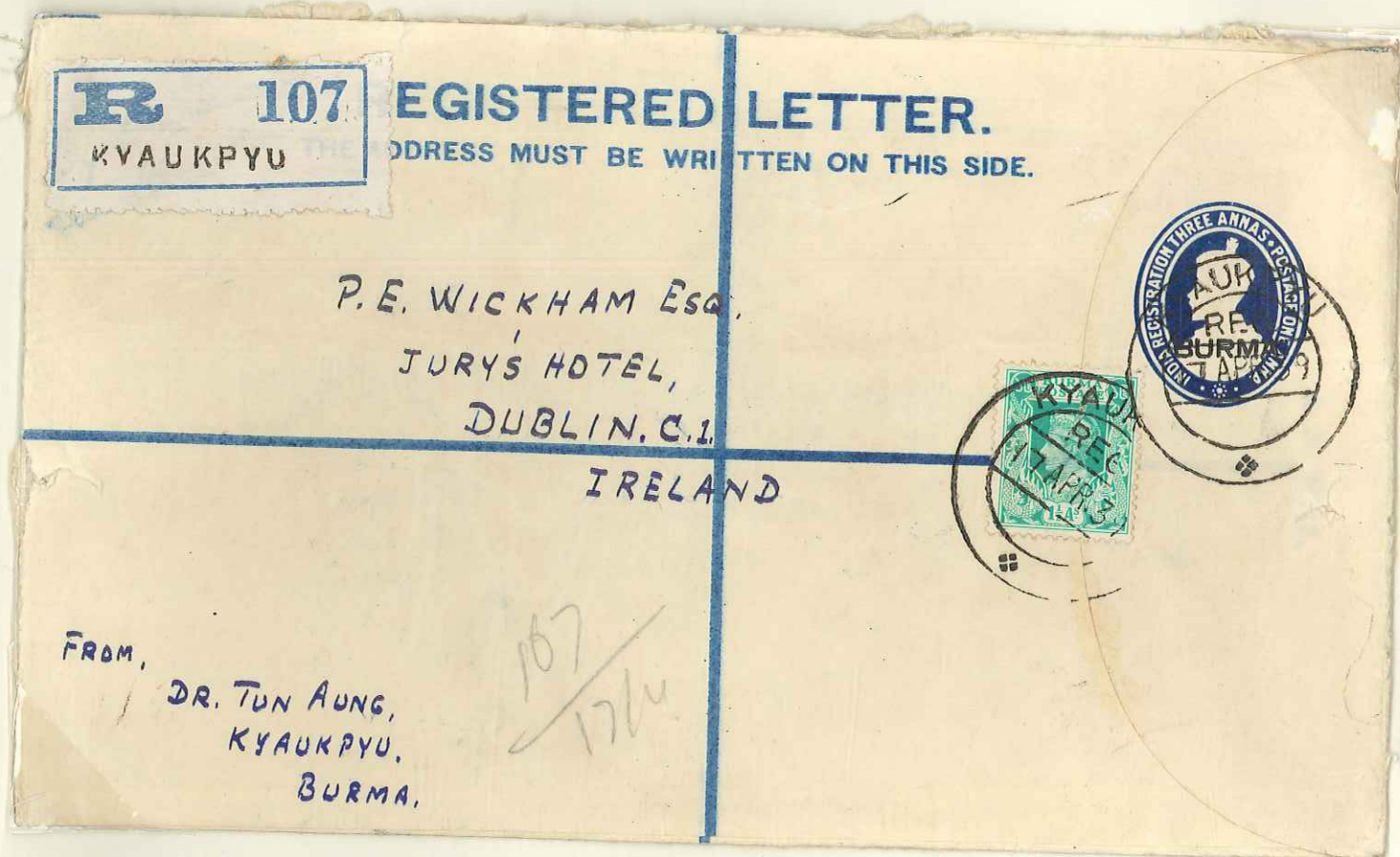

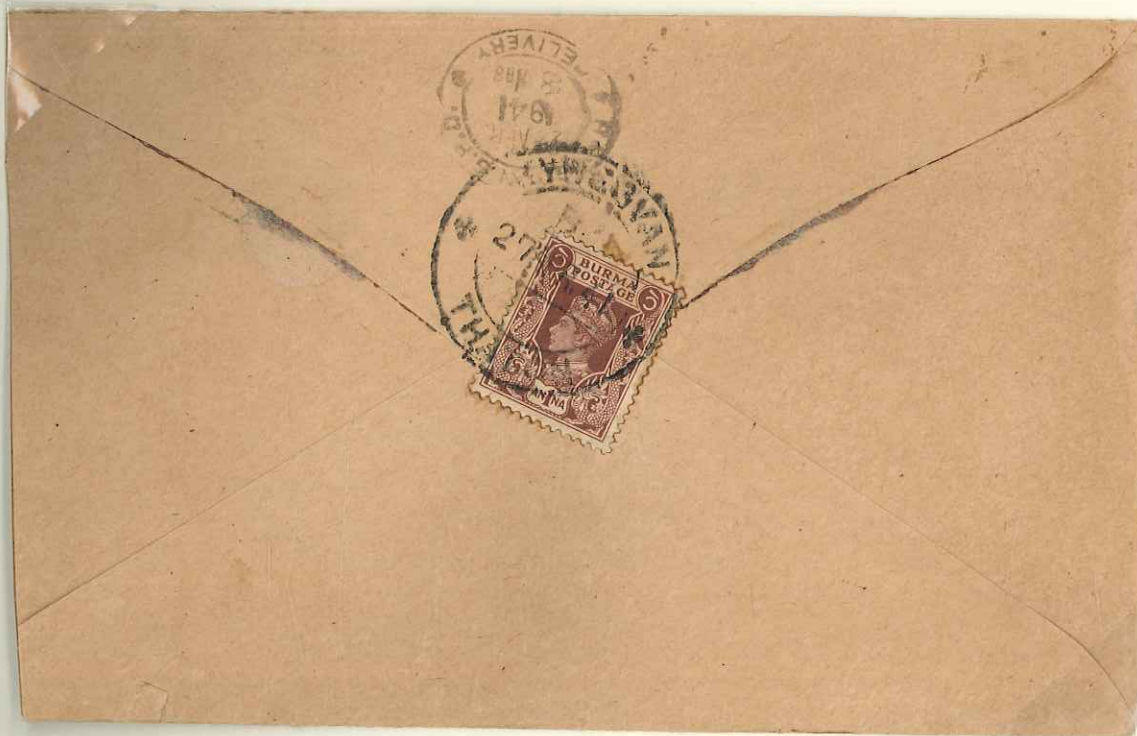
