




2 and 3 December 1899: Two cards to Switzerland via Bombay – Aden Sea Post Office, Set C, on the S.S. Peninsular 9-14 December, arrived 23 December. Franked ½A for the printed matter wrongly struck with UP4 (for 1A postcard rate) later cancelled.



26 September 1904: Letter to Australia, arrived 27 October. Franked 1d for the Imperial rate. However Australia at that time was not in the Empire Penny Post scheme so marked 15 gold centimes deficit (1½d) resulting in 3d to pay.




2 October 1918: Front to the U.K. arrived 3 December, franked 1A, 1d postage due collected.



2 December 1940: Paungde to India, arrived 19 December, struck with UP6 in error as ½A stamp on reverse was not initially noticed.



16 July 1901: Unpaid letter, India to Rangoon, also struck with UP40 on arrival 23 July.



13 February 1904: Kyonpyaw, unpaid letter to Rangoon via Yegyi 14 February arrived 15 February when also struck with UP40.



29 December 1905: Unpaid postcard, Pyawbwe to Rangoon, arrived 30 December and also struck with UP40.



6 June 1909: Unpaid letter, Ceylon to Rangoon, via Tuticorin 9 June, arrived 16 June.



24 July 1914: Unpaid letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 31 July. Also struck with UP53.




20 May 1905: Unpaid letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 29 May.



31 July 1907: Thabeitkyin to Rangoon arrived 2 August. Franked ½A p.s. cut out, which has not been accepted so struck with UP40.



November 1912: Under franked letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 2 December.



9 February 1911: Under franked letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 14 February.



4 October 1912: Unpaid letter, Bassein (UP7) to Rangoon, arrived 6 October.



6 February 1924: 1A P.S. envelope, Padigon to Rangoon, arrived 7 February, struck with UP15 in error being endorsed "Cancelled" in ink.



25 March 1915: Unpaid letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 31 March (E.R.D.).



21 July 1915: Unpaid letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 29 July.



11 May 1927: Unpaid letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 17 May (E.R.D.).



24 May 1932: Under franked letter to Rangoon, arrived 5 June.



23 November 1931: Under franked letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 2 December.




2 January 1934: Under franked letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 9 January.



9 January 1915: Unfranked letter, Bassein to Rangoon, arrived 11 June (E.R.D.).



11 September 1915: Under franked letter Bassein to Rangoon, arrived 12 September, also struck with UP59.



27 March 1924: Unfranked letter from India, arrived Rangoon 1 April and struck with UP19 (ERD). Arrived Hmawbi 2 April



15 August 1924: Unpaid letter, India to Theinzeik, via Rangoon 28 August (also struck with UP80, arrived 29 August).



19 March 1925: Unpaid letter to India arrived 1 April.



1 July 1941: Under franked letter to Rangoon, arrived 14 July (L.R.D.).



21 September 1937: Under franked airmail to Rangoon, arrived 25 September.



23 June 1939: Under franked airmail to Rangoon, arrived 29 June.



22 May 1934: Unfranked letter to Rangoon, arrived 29 May (E.R.D.).



1 April 1937: Under franked letter to Rangoon, arrived 7 April.



1 December 1940: Under franked letter to Rangoon, arrived 13 December (L.R.D.), also struck with UP54 (L.R.D.).



23 February 1895: ¼A postcard, India to Rangoon, arrived 3 March. Reposted? 4 March.



13 December 1893: Under franked ¼A postcard, Rangoon to Insein, arrived 14 December (DY12), also struck with DP7 (only recorded example).



18 September 1936: Registered letter, Rangoon to India, franked 4¼As for the 4½A rate, under franked noticed in the Indian Sorting Branch the next day and struck with UP32.







18 November 1896: Unfranked letter to Prome, struck with UP34 then cancelled and struck with UP31 (E.R.D.) arrived 19 November.



29 September 1892: Stampless letter to India, arrived 9 October (DY12). Only recorded example.





8 September 1924 and 14 August 1931: Under franked postcards, the U.K. to Burma. Endorsed 10 gold centimes due (1d.).

10 June 1916



27 June 1921: Under franked letter, Rangoon to Tengueh, China via Old Burma Road arrived 7 July. 13/4A deficit (DY2) which has been converted to 30 gold centimes, also struck with UP7.



13 October 1910: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>A postcard, delivered 14 October. Only recorded example.



10 May 1932: Under franked letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 16 May.



17 March 1902 (E.R.D.): Unpaid postcard to Rangoon (DP11) arrived 24 March, readdressed to Syriam arriving 28 March.



8 May 1908 (L.R.D.): Unfranked letter to India arrived 17 May.



31 July 1908 (E.R.D.): Under franked letter to India, arrived 10 August.



23 December 1910: Unfranked letter to India, arrived 30 December.



7 September 1908: Unfranked letter to India, arrived 16 September.



23 May 1911: Under franked letter to India, arrived 23 July.



14 August 1914 (L.R.D): Under franked letter to India, arrived 22 August.



17 March 1914: Unfranked letter to India, arrived 25 March.



29 January 1918: Under franked letter, Mandalay to Rangoon, arrived 30 January.




29 April 1922: Under franked letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 10 May.




23 February 1940: Under franked letter, India to Rangoon, arrived 6 March.



16 June 1928: Unfranked letter, Rangoon to Kangyidaung, arrived 18 June.




19 October 1923: Unfranked letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 29 October.



18 July 1930: Unfranked letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 24 August.




11 May 1939: Under franked letter to Rangoon, arrived 16 May (E.R.D.).




23 July 1941: Under franked letter to Rangoon, arrived 5 August (L.R.D), also struck with UP80 (L.R.D.).



14 February 1938: Under franked 9p postcard, India to Burma, arrived 21 February, also struck with UP23.



4 November 1921: Letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 12 November. Wrongly struck with UP10, later cancelled.



1 May 1932: Under franked letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 9 May.



16 January 1917: Under franked letter to India, arrived 24 January.



14 October 1917: Unfranked letter to India, arrived 22 October.



19 March 1924: Under franked letter, Rangoon to Kangyidaung, arrived 20 March. (Postmarked 2 March!)



25 April 1924 (L.R.D.): Under franked letter, Rangoon to Kangyidaung, arrived 28 April.



16 November 1924: Under franked letter, Rangoon to Kyangydaung, arrived 18 November.



5 May 1932: Under franked letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 10 May.



Ship mail received 24 December 1936, also struck with I6 (L.R.D.), UP23 and SL14.




4 December 1940: Under franked (struck with UP54) airmail to India, arrived 10 December. Readdressed, returned to Rangoon 23 January 1941 (UP64 and UP80).



20 August 1932: Unfranked letter to Indo-China, arrived 1 September, also struck with UP6.



16 December 1933: Unfranked letter, Rangoon to Moulmeingyun, endorsed "Found in G.P.O. L.B. without stamps", arrived 18 December (UP2).




13 October 1922: Unfranked letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 20 October.




2 June 1933 (L.R.D.): Under franked letter, Rangoon to India, arrived 7 June.



29 May 1935: Letter to the U.S.A. incorrectly franked with a service stamp, so struck with UP6 and endorsed 50 gold centimes (5d or U.S. 10c).



5 December 1940 (E.R.D.): Under franked letter, Henzada to India, arrived 19 December.




24 December 1931 (E.R.D.): Under franked letter, Thongwa to Malacca, via Penang 3 January 1932, arrived 5 January, 4c in Straits posting dues being affixed (on reverse) the equivalent of 10 gold centimes.



7 June 1933: Unfranked letter, Eime to Indo-China via Singapore 15 June, arrived 22 June. 5cts in postage due affixed, being the equivalent of 10 gold centimes.



24 June 1936: Under franked letter to the U.K., arrived 21 July, 1d postage due, affixed being the equivalent of 10 gold centimes.



24 December 1940 (L.R.D.) Under franked airmail, Ainthabyu to India, arrived 2 January, ½A collected being the equivalent of 10 gold centimes.



18 October 1928: Under franked letter to Kajang via K. Lumpur, arrived 23 October. No evidence of postage due being collected.



11 February 1930: Letter Pyimana to the UK via Rangoon and to Karachi by surface route; by flight IW46, which left 17 February and arrived London 26 February. Air fee 6 annas fully pre-paid; unpaid (1½As). Postage deficiency shown as 'T' – 40 centimes (UP73 only recorded example) converted to three pence - postage due label, corrected to 30 in manuscript. Put on at Maidstone on 27 February; a difference of 7 days. This confirms a flight from Karachi



8 August 1938: Under paid letter, India to Paugdawth via Rangoon 17 August, Struck with UP24. Arrived 18 August.
