

27 May 1925: Letter posted on T.P.O. R10, arrived 28 May.



8 August 1917: ½As P.S. envelope, Mandalay to Rangoon, arrived 9 August (E.R.D.).



21 January 1919: ½A P.S. envelope, Zegyo to Rangoon, arrived 23 January (E.R.D.).





1934: To the U.K. Postage 21/2As, air fee 6As, Total 81/2As.



1936: From Mawchi Mines to the U.K. air fee and postage combined reduced to 7½As.



13 May 1934: Airmail, Pyawbwe to the U.K. via Rangoon 14 May (L.R.D.). Franked 7½As.

## RANGOON G.P.O.

The Burma – England air service, introduced in October 1933 operated weekly. Letters which missed the mail at Rangoon were struck with the framed cachet.


Posted in Rangoon 7 a.m. Monday 27 August (the day the U.K. mail left). It was flown out the following Monday 3 September and arrived in London 10 September.

The postage due label is cancelled MAIDSTONE, 11 September, confirming the system.



If the air fee was fully pre-paid but the postage was deficient, then the item always travelled by air and the deficient postage was charged on arrival as above.

Mail was only sent by sea if the air fee was under paid.



6 April 1937: Ciruclar, Rangoon to Shwegyin, arrived 7 April, (D10 E.R.D.) readdressed 8 April to Rangoon, arrived 9 April and forwarded to Singapore 9 April, struck with I35.



18 February 1938: Airmail to Mergui via Rangoon 1 March, arrived 4 March (DY5 E.R.D.) returned to sender 8 April and struck with I35 at Rangoon. Franked 1½d. for the "All up" rate.



1 July 1933: First Flight cover to Rangoon, arrived 11 July, returned to the U.K. 12 July, arriving 14 August.



4 July 1933: Letter Rangoon to the U.K. The air fee was 6As per half ounce or part thereof plus postage at 2½As per oz. A postal clerk has written "1oz" in manuscript and crossed out the blue airmail label and the letter travelled by sea.


22 April 1934: From Rangoon. Insufficient hand stamp applied in error then crossed out as postage due correct, 1½ tolas (see m/s in blue T 1½), but air fee is under paid so framed hand stamp has been applied. Arrived Churu 29 April 1934.



12 January 1898: Letter to a Sailor on a German Ship, Rangoon via Aden – Bombay Sea Post Office, Set C, on the *S.S. Caledonia*, 23 – 26 January, arrived 2 February 1898 to German Consulate, endorsed in ink "Unclaimed" reported 8 August 1900! Deposit room 13 August 1900, D.L.O. 14 – 15 August (D4), Bombay 22 August and Germany 17 September 1900.



17 September 1889: Letter to India, arrived 1 October.



20 February 1937: Local letter delivered 21 February, franked 1A.



25 February 1937: Rangoon to India, arrived 2 March, franked 11/2 As
