I have examined the bellow in copy shown envelope and am of opinion that as well the stamps as the cancellations are genuine.

Description:

Letter of 2nd weight class, inland rate 10 krajcár postage. The left end of the envelope is cut down approx. 2.5 cm. The paper is clean, with a vertically fold, seal on reverse replaced by a circular label, however fine condition.

Mixed franking between the 1867 and 1871 issues of Hungary.

Stamps:

Two 2 kr(ajcár) stamps of Hungary 1867 issue (Zumstein No. U I) typographed, fresh in colour, clean paper, rather well centred.

Two 3 kr(ajcár) stamps of Hungary 1871 issue (Zumstein No.2) lithographed, fresh in colour. The stamp to left - type V - is very fine centred, the stamp to right - type I - is off-centre and with a little dirty spot on the envelope.

A very fine and rare combination of franking used two days before the end of validity for the Hungarian 1867 issue.

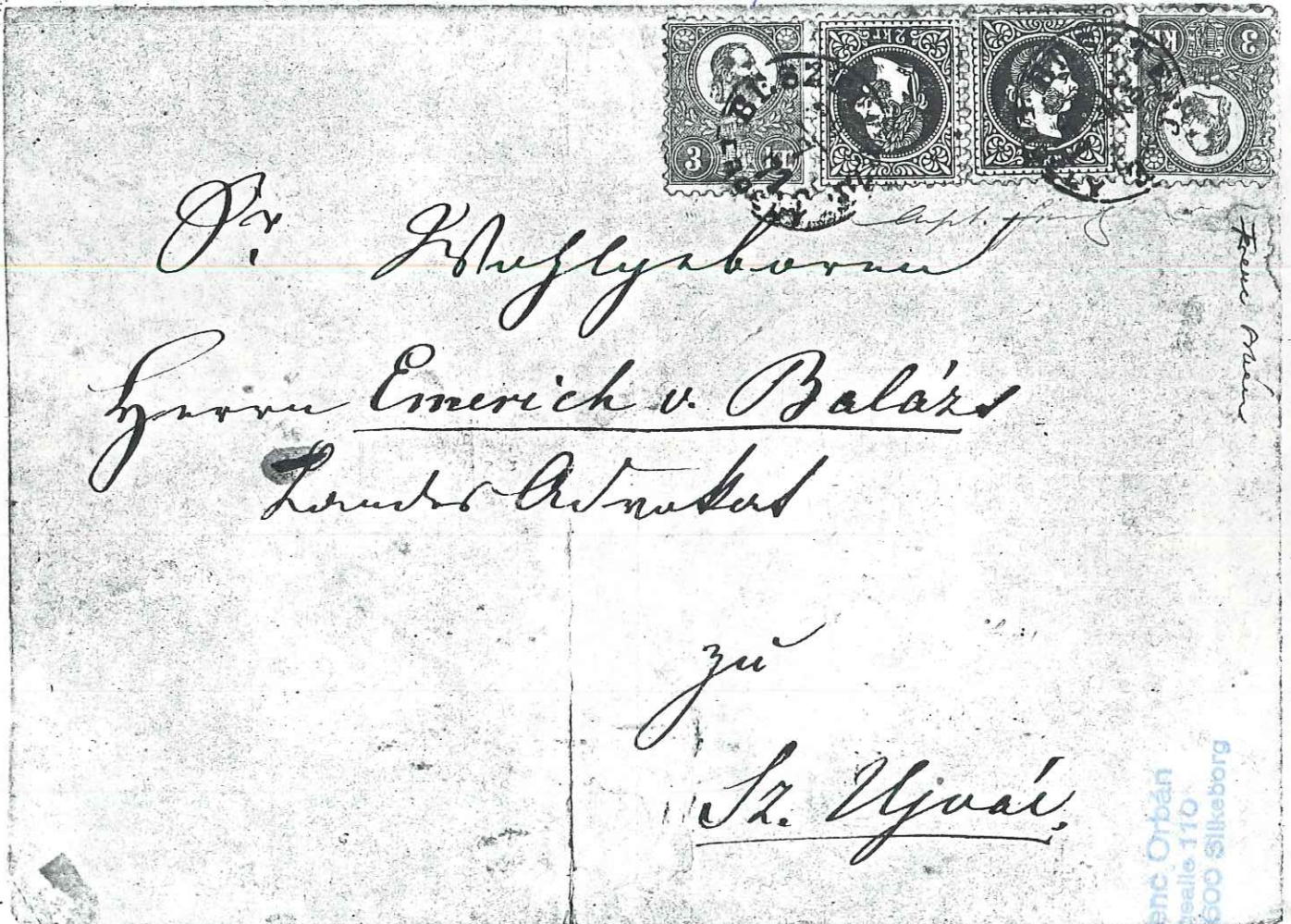
