We don't usually get involved in such matters, but there is a simple answer to your question.


The letter was written by a missionary whose last name was Seiz, from Bethanien auf St. Jan. This means the Moravian mission station of Bethany, St. John, Danish West Indies (now U. S. Virgin Islands).

We know from other sources that Seiz (also spelled Seitz) served in the West Indies.

I do not know philatelic matters. Where the stamp should be I read "Charged by J. Jordan & Co.", or at least that is a possible reading. Perhaps you have already investigated J. Jordan and Godfrey Haga, who were Moravians.

Should a translation of the letter be needed, we have an arrangement where it can be done for a fee.
