## 1897 SHIP MAIL IN THE GULF OF FINLAND

3k Finnish stationery card with 1k Russian stamp added to make overseas rate, posted at sea to FRANKFURT and put ashore at HANGO, Finland, where stamps cancelled

## 1912 SHIP MAIL IN THE GULF OF FINLAND

10k Russian stationery envelope to LYSEKIL, Sweden, cancelled in transit at Finnish port of ABO (TURKU) by trilingual date-stamp, the abbreviated inscription translating:

ABO, BY STEAMSHIP FROM ABROAD 24 VII 1912

The cancellation depicts the silhouette of a steamship above the date with crossed posthorns below. Period of use: 1912-1920.

Received LYSEKIL 26 7 1912 (backstamp).





Bilingual receipt for charges in respect of photing the Swedish vessel s.s. "AIRA" in and out of KRONSHTADT road, issued by Kronshtadt Pilot Commander 4 Nov 1911 using 5k revenue.







#### 1902 SHIP MAIL FROM FINLAND

Cover from MARIEHAMN, Aland Islands, addressed to s.s. "HEROS" at EUPATORIA, Crimea, 10k Russian stamp tied by framed pictorial ship cancellation with word "ABO" on side.

Put ashore at ABO (TURKU), Finland, 4 IV 02 (New Style). Received ST. PETERSBURG 23 Mar 1902 (Old Style) and EUPATORIA 26 Mar 1902.





## 1916 SHIP MAIL FROM FINLAND

Finnish postcard to CASTELSARRASIN, France, message written on board while at NAANTALI, Finland, pair Russian 2k stamps cancelled on arrival at ABO (TURKU), Finland, 3 VII 1916, with pictorial ship mark with words "POSTI\*POST" alongside.

Three-line handstamp of military censor in TORNEA, Finland.

This pictorial mark is said to have been used on ships from Helsinki from 1890 onwards.
