ITEM DESCRIPTION

1841 1d red-brown OJ obliterated by a black Greenock Special Maltese Cross.

OBSERVATIONS

Comparison with the registration sheets indicates that the stamp is from Plate 30, which was registered on 6 December 1842.

The cross in question matches reference examples of the Greenock Special Maltese Cross (see *illustrations* for two examples, and comparison with similar crosses). Rockoff & Jackson (pp. 378–382) recorded the Greenock Special Maltese Cross being used from 28 July 1841 until the end of the Maltese Cross era.

A tiny scissor cut in the margin at bottom-left does not encroach into the design.
