

Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen Defender of the Faith &c.
To Our Trusty and well beloved The Honorable John B. S. Dorner I
Greeting We do by these Presents Constitute and

Appoint you to be Ensign and Lieutenant in Our First or Grenadier Regiment
of Foot Guards & from the eighteenth of December 1854 You are therefore carefully and
diligently to Discharge the Duty of Ensign and Lieutenant by Exercising and
well Disciplining both the inferior Officers and Soldiers in the said Regiment
and We do hereby Command them to Obey you as their Ensign and Lieutenant and
You are to observe and follow such Orders and Directions from Time to Time
as you shall receive from Us or any your Superior Officer according to the Rules
and Discipline of War in pursuance of the Trust hereby reposed in You.

Given at Our Court at Windsor — the ninth — day of February
1855 in the Eighteenth Year of Our Reign.
