



CENTENARY OF NEW SOUTH WALES

These stamps were the world's first commemorative issues. In 1887 a competition was conducted to obtain designs for the issues. The 1d and 6d by M. Tannenberg; 4d by H. A. Barraclough; 5/- by C. Turner; and 20/- by Mrs F. W. Stoddard, were all 1st prize winning designs. The 2d and 8d by Miss Devine and the 1/- from a photograph in the Sydney Museum were not award winners.

Designs: 1d view of Sydney and Australian Ferns; 2d Emu and Berries of the Lilly-Pilly; the Corea (or Native Fuchsia) and sprays of wattle; 4d Captain Cook; 6d Queen Victoria, Arms, Waratah, Wattle blossoms, Eucalyptus, Australian ferns and heath; 8d Lyre Bird, Waratah and Honeysuckle; 1/- Kangaroo, Waratah and Flannel Flowers; 5/- Map of Australia; £1 Captain Arthur Phillip, first Governor, and Lord Carrington, Governor in 1888, and Australian ferns and Christmas Bells.







SURCHARGE

In February 1880, the rate of postage for newspapers to England was changed to 1½d and, as no stamps of this value existed, 20,400 1d stamps were surcharged "Halfpenny" to meet the new rate. These provisionals were issued on February 21, 1880 but were withdrawn seven days later when the rate was again changed.

For this issue the basic Bradbury Wilkinson design was used. Two numerals were added to each stamp so that the design now included four numerals, one in each corner. The 1d value with perforation $12 \times 9^{1/2}$ is thought to have been printed outside the Government Printing Office and therefore is not an official issue. No. 49 is known to exist with figures in the lower corners only. It is believed that these were part of a trial printing prepared but not officially approved for release and that one or more sheets were accidentally placed on sale in 1902, the date shown on 8 of the 12 postmarked copies known to exist.







When the "Courier" stamps were first contemplated, an order for a more "permanent" issue of stamps was sent to England. The contract to supply the stamps was won by the firm Perkins Bacon Ltd, who specialised in fine recess printed stamps.

For this issue Perkins Bacon chose a portrait of Queen Victoria based on a watercolour by Edward Corbould, which, in turn, was based on a full length painting by Alfred Chalon (hence the name of the issue).

Initial supplied were printed in England on paper watermarked with a six pointed star, and the supplies and plates sent out to Tasmania.

Again, the inscription on the stamps reflected the name of the colony at that time.









Subsequent supplies of the first three values of this series were printed in Tasmania on unwatermarked paper (1856 - 1857), and, from 1857 to 1869, on paper watermarked with a double-lined numeral (1 for the one penny stamp, 2 for the two pence, and 4 for the four pence). Several printings of the penny stamp were in a distinctly brown shade.







Originally, all the stamps issued by the Tasmanian Post Office were imperforate. As a service to their customers, several license stamp vendors began privately perforating and rouletting, the stamps they sold.

Chief amongst these was the stationary supplier J. Walch and Sons, of Hobart. This firm used perforating machines measuring 10 and 11.8. Another was R. Harris, of Launceston, using a machine measuring 12.5. Various other perforations and roulettes are known.

In later 1871, the Government obtained its own perforating machine and subsequent supplies were issued perforated 11.4.






