In my opinion the Tibetan stamp illustrated on the right is a genuine ½ Trangka Slate Purple (Methuen 15F4) Shiny Enamel Printing (Waterfall #56, Scott #3d) tied to piece by GYANTSE Type I (Hel. T3) cancel. These enamel inks were not suitable for fine printing and very few were produced. Seldom seen Shade.

In my opinion the Tibetan stamp illustrated on above is a genuine 1/3 Trangka in Pale Reddish Purple (Scot #3d, Waterfall #51). This stamp is a 'flat printing' from the shiny period. Tied to piece by complete LHASSA Type VI (Hel. T14) CTO cancel. VF Condition.

In my opinion the Tibetan stamp illustrated on the right is a genuine 1/2tr Violet (Scott #3), VF condition.

In my opinion the Tibetan stamp illustrated on the right is a genuine ½tr Deep Violet (W-45). (Scott #3) VF/Mint (Cliché 9) – finger print on face (It should be noted that many Tibetan stamps have stains and fingerprints on them – this is to be expected as the condition under which these stamps were printed was quite primitive.) A Very Deep Rich Printing!
