The purpose of this two-frame display is to illustrate the philatelic aspects of telegraphs in Canada. The telegraph, in association with the railroads, played a vital role in binding a large and sparsely-populated country together. The displays shows early telegraph stationery from the Montreal and Dominion Telegraph Companies, and later material from the Canadian Pacific, Northwestern and Candian National companies who operated the nationwide services. Also shown are examples of Frank Stamps, including complete and part booklets. The display concludes with examples of cable delivery stationery and an example of a Marconigram, sent by radiotelegraphy.

The Great North Western Telegraph Company incorporated in 1880 took over the Dominion and Montreal lines in 1881-83 and until the establishment of the Canadian Pacific was the only domestic telegraph company in Canada. It was also foreign-owned (by the American Western Union). As late as 1905, it was the largest operator, sending over 2,500,000 messages a year but by 1915 it was bankrupt and in 1918 it had to be rescued by the Government who merged it with Canadian National Railways to form the Canadian National Telegraph.

Complimentary frank stamps issued by the Great North Western Telegraph Company. On the pattern of the Canadian Pacific, the Western Union owned GNWTC issued frank stamps in booklets to employees and customers between 1890 and 1921. Booklets contained five interleaved panes of four stamps. They were printed by Rolph and Clark Ltd of Toronto on white wove paper, perforated 12 by lithography.

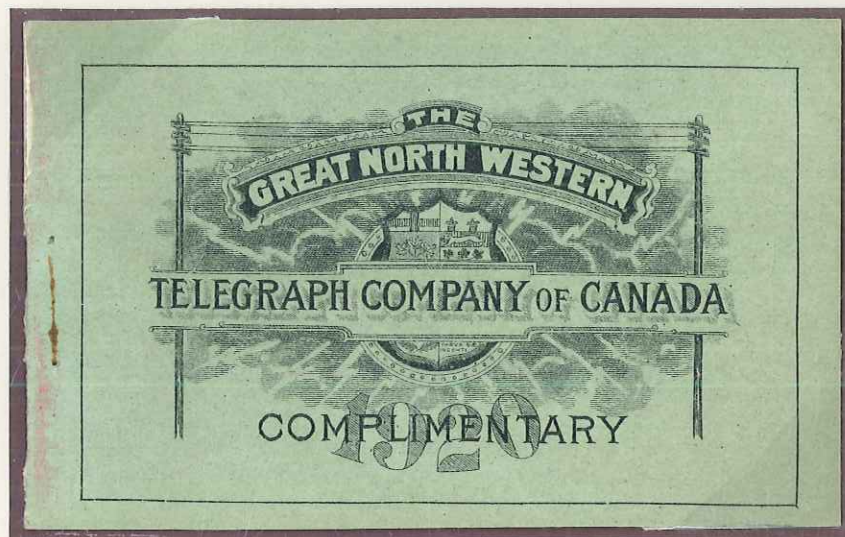


Frank stamp of 1919 with facsimile signature of George D. Renouf, General Manager. large control number in red.

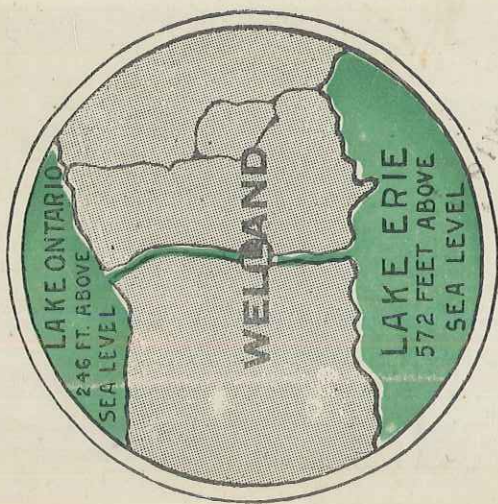

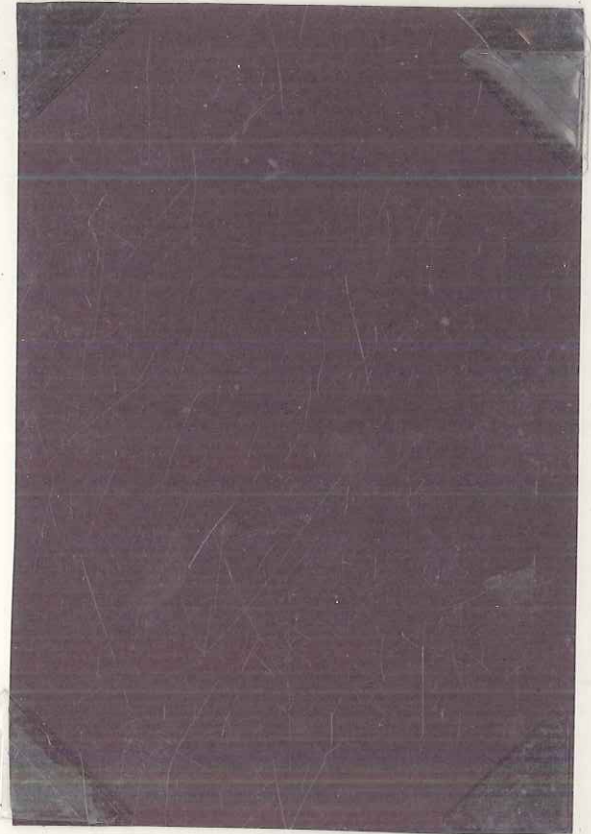

READ THE NOTICE AND AGREEMENT AT THE TOP.

The Canadian Pacific Railway Telegraph issued frank stamps between 1887 and 1934 to employees and customers to prepay telegrams over their system. They were originally issued in booklets of thirty-two (eight interleaved panes of four), although make-up varied on later issues: each booklet bore a letterpress control in red or blue, generally consisting of a letter and number, which was repeated on each stamp. A new series was issued each year (except for 1888). They were printed *intaglio* by the British American Bank Note Company in Montreal (from 1915 Ottawa) whose imprint appears at the foot of each pane on thin greyish paper, perforated 12. The design was the telegraph company seal (North American map) changed to a telegraph pole in 1930.

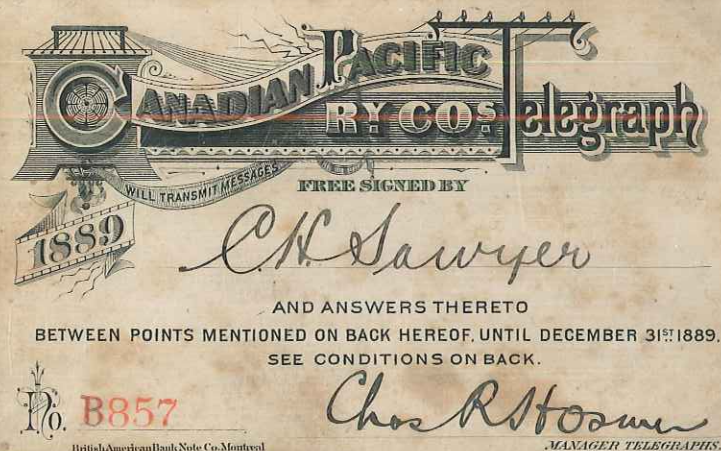

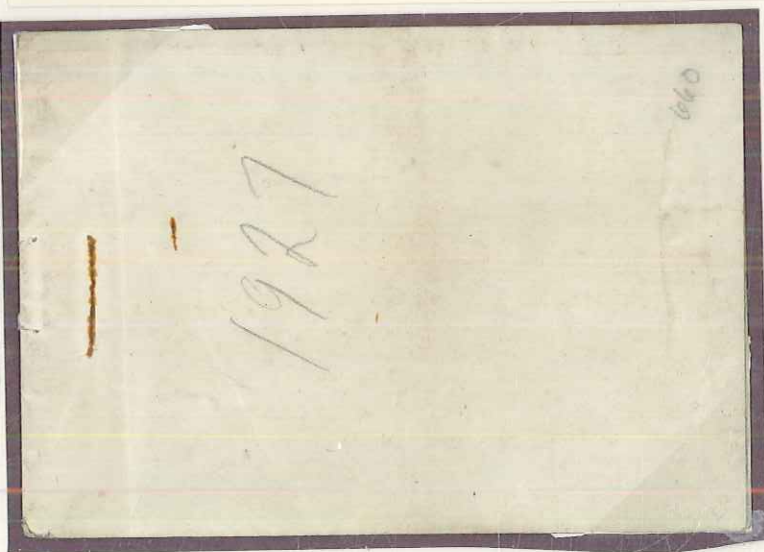

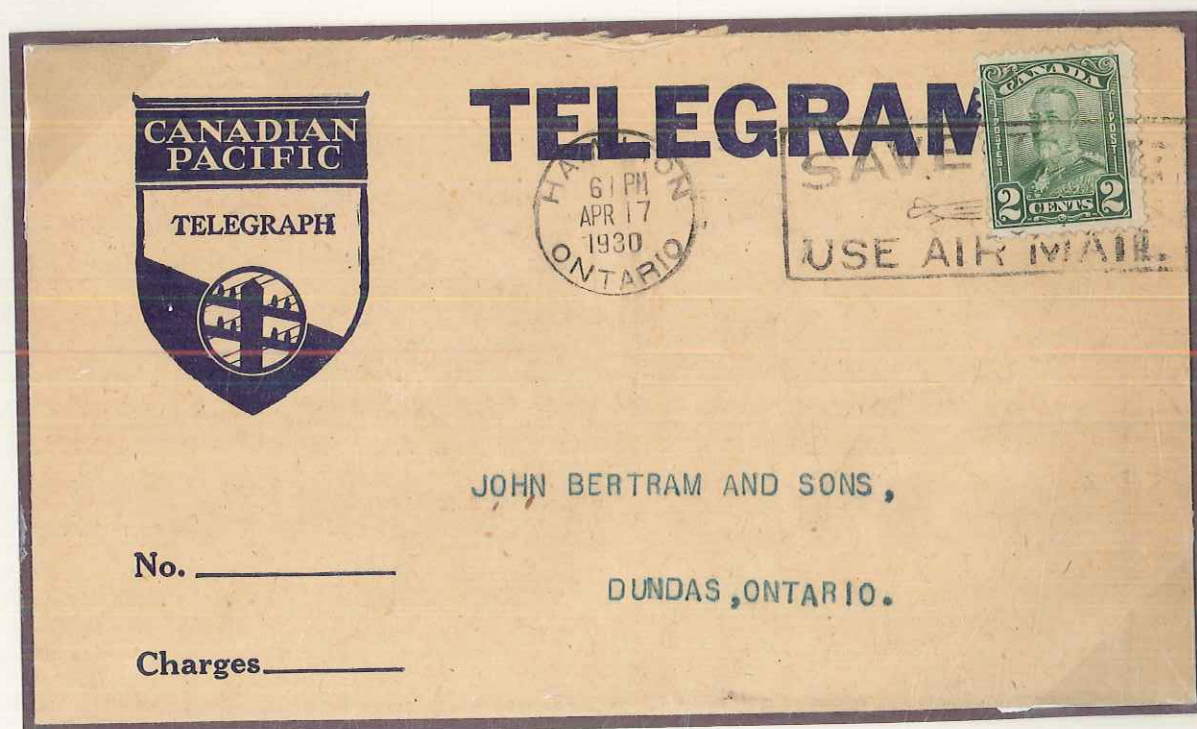

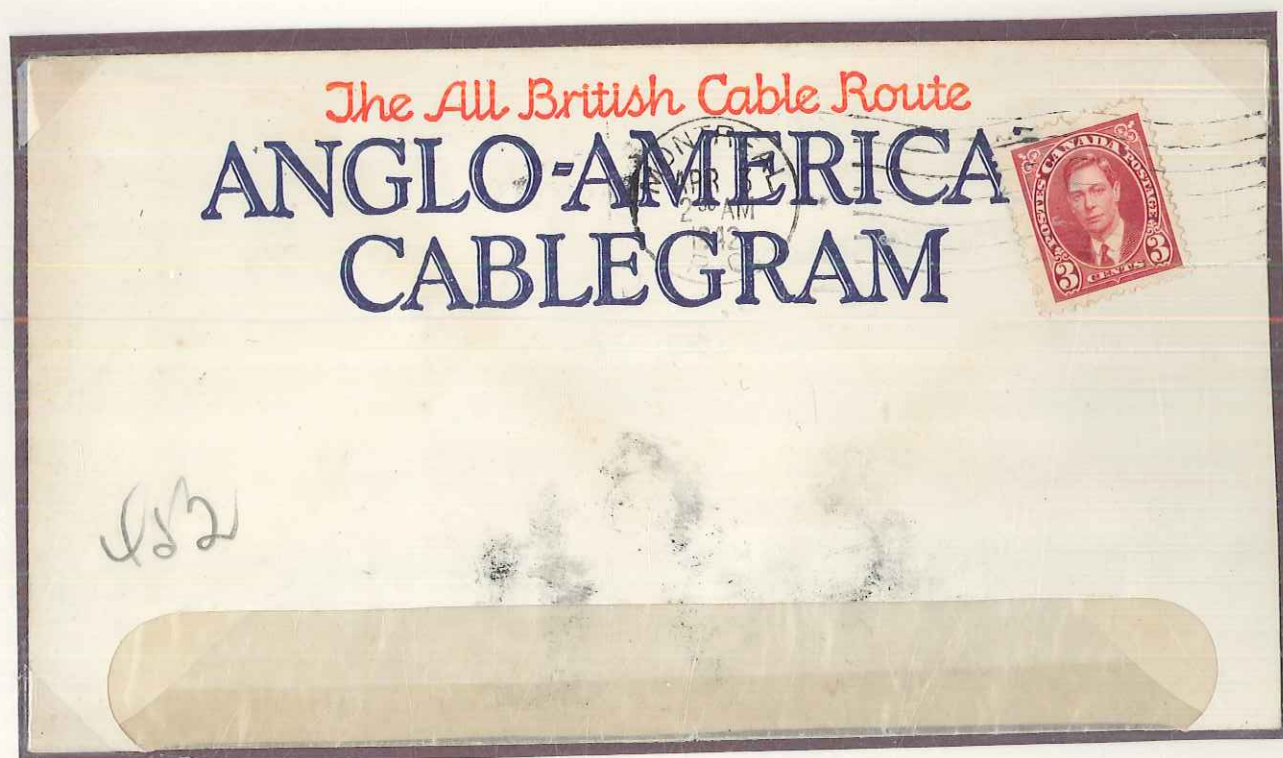

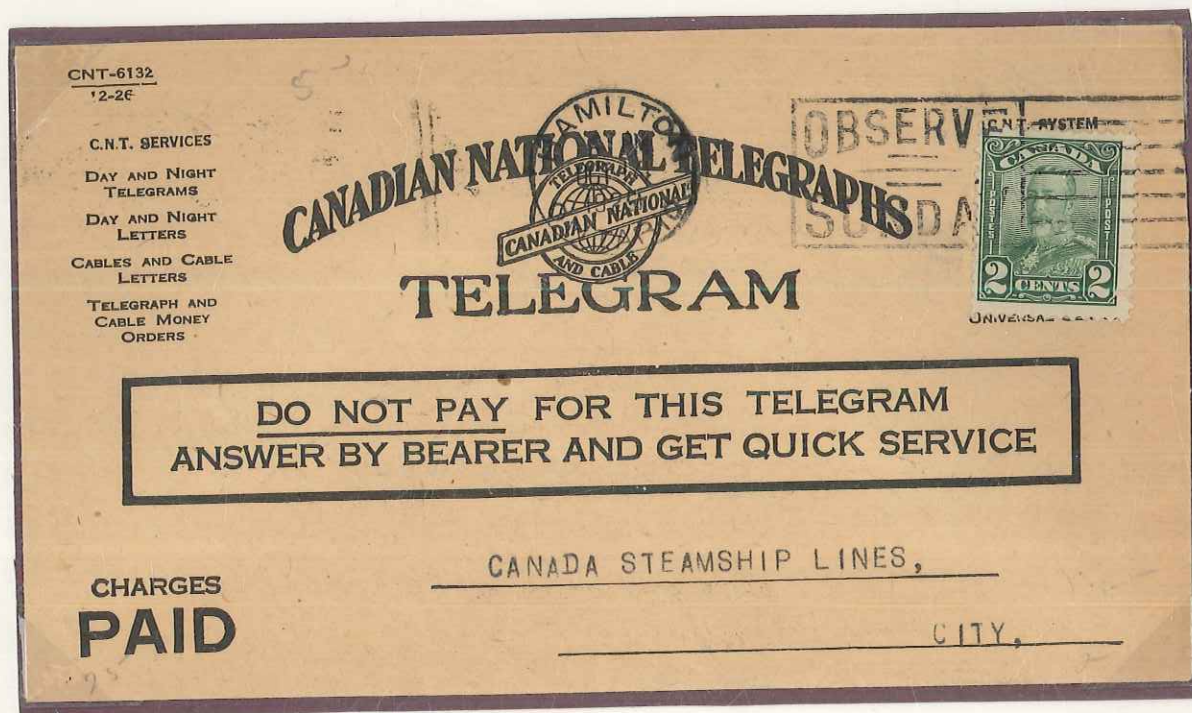

Despite its part American ownership, the Anglo-American company advertised itself as "*The All-British Route.*"

These two envelopes used in Montreal in March and April 1942 show two variants of envelope types used to send out cables from the Anglo-American Cable Company Office.



The government-owned *Canadian National Telegraph Company* was established on January 1 1921, incorporating the lines of the GNWTC, the Canadian Northern Railway, the Grand Trunk Pacific and other lines operated by Western Union in western Canada.. It was always a smaller system than Canadian Pacific but it had exclusive access to the Western Union owned *Anglo-American Cable Company* for international traffic.

Marconi first sent a radio message between England and Newfoundland in 1901 and shortly thereafter the Canadian Marconi Company was established to exploit wireless telegraphy commercially. Telegrams sent to and from Canada "via Marconi" were handled by the Canadian Pacific Telegraphs and the Cable and Wireless company. *Marconigrams* were much more expensive than cables and their use was virtually confined to business.

These Presents Witness that the Postmaster General (as to the covenants agreements and stipulations hereinafter contained on his part) doth hereby covenant and agree with the Company and their successors and the Company for themselves their successors and permitted assigns (as to the covenants agreements and stipulations hereinafter contained on their part) do hereby covenant and agree with the Postmaster General in manner following (that is to say):—

INTERPRETATION OF TERMS.

1. For all the purposes of these presents—

Subject to the provisions of this Agreement the Company shall and will during the continuance of this Agreement at their own costs and charges in all respects convey or cause to be conveyed once in every four weeks in each direction all mails which the Postmaster General or any of his deputies officers servants or agents shall from time to time require to be conveyed in either direction between Liverpool in England and the port of Hong Kong in China and between the several ports and places on the coast of China and Japan.
