From its foundation on 26th October 1863 the F.A. has gained worthy respect from her competitors Internationally and at club level with notable results against Germany (Berlin) in 1938....and against Rumania (Bucharest) in 1939.... In 1953 and 1954 defeats by the Hungarians, home and away enforces changes in England's playing style in following years... Centenary Year of 1963 sees the event honoured by Monaco... culminating three years later with England's finest hour as "World Champions"....finally we conclude with European footballs richest prize the European Cup with memorable victories of Manchester United (1968) and Liverpool (1977).
