





POLITICS AND THE GAMES OF THE V OLYMPIAD – STOCKHOLM 1912 “SPORTS GEOGRAPHY”

The 1908 political polemics continues. Vienna protested against a separate participation of a BOHEMIAN (CZECH) team. St. Petersburg did the same, opposing a separate FINNISH participation. Both countries considered BOHEMIA respectively FINNLAND to be provinces and not independent countries.

Note also that during the 1911 Budapest 12th IOC Session, Germany moved not to authorise the participation of HUNGARY, it not being an independent nation.

Coubertin and the IOC pretended that besides a political geography, “SPORTS GEOGRAPHY” existed. Countries with representative sports activities and NOCs should participate, with due terms to humour (supra-)national sentiments.

Johannes (Hannes) Petteri Kolehmainen of Finland was born on December 9, 1889 in Kuopio, Finland. His two brothers were also distance runners. Kolehmainen began running when he was a teenager. On 6 May 1911 He broke the the 3000m world record of in 8:48.5. He also won the British four mile championship race in 1911



In the 1912 Olympics, he won the 10,000m (31:20.8), 5,000m (14:36.6), another Gold medal in the 12,000m individual (45:11.6) cross-country and a Silver medal in the 12,000m team cross-country. He most likely would have won a medal in the 3,000m team race. Kolehmainen won his heat, but the other three Finnish runners did not turn in good times, and Finland did not make it to the final. The 5,000m final was exciting. Kolehmainen and Jean Bouin of France, the two favourites, had a huge lead on the rest of the runners in a short time. It was the two of them for gold and silver. For twelve and a half laps, they stayed together. The two kept passing each other, but neither managed to pull away. With 20 meters to go, Bouin was winning. Then, with a final burst of energy, Kolehmainen broke the tape at the finish line slightly ahead of Bouin, with a world record time of 14:36.6. Kolehmainen broke into a grin. That is why he is given the nickname "Smiling Hannes." This record was only beaten ten years later by Paavo Nurmi. After the race, while being congratulated by Baker (later Lord Noel-Baker), he looked up on the flagpole and saw the Russian flag. As in 1908 the Finnish athletes had decided to use no flag instead of the Russian one when they won medals. In what sealed his popularity for Finns, he said "I would almost rather not have won, than see that flag up there."

Kolehmainen most likely would have won more medals in the 1916 Olympics, but they were cancelled for World War I. He finished 4th in 1917 at the Boston Marathon, and then returned to the Olympics in 1920, when he was well past his prime.

Even so, he decided to run the marathon. It was the longest Olympic marathon: 42,750 meters and in heavy rain. Even so, Kolehmainen did excellent. After five kilometres, he was in second place. For the next ten km, he was never less than fourth. After the 15th kilometre, he was in second position again. Kolehmainen became the leader after 30 km and never lost it.


In 1924, he participated again in three marathon race but abandoned. He later set world records over both 25km and 30km. At the 1952 Helsinki Olympic Games, Kolehmainen was chosen to light the Olympic Torch at the Opening Ceremony, after receiving the Olympic Flame from Paavo Nurmi, who carried the flame into the stadium. Kolehmainen died in Helsinki, on November 11, 1966.



JIM THORPE * 28.5.1888, † 28.3.1953, OF NATIVE AMERICAN AND IRISH DESCENT, IS OFTEN CONSIDERED THE GREATEST ALL-ROUND ATHLETE IN HISTORY. THE ACCOLADE IS WELL MERITED WHEN JUDGED BY HIS SUPERIORITY OVER HIS CONTEMPORARIES. AT THE 1912 OLYMPICS, HE WON THE PENTATHLON AND DECATHLON BY HUGE MARGINS, SETTING WORLD RECORDS IN BOTH EVENTS. AT THE AWARDS CEREMONY, THE KING OF SWEDEN TOLD THORPE, "SIR, YOU ARE THE GREATEST ATHLETE IN THE WORLD." BUT THE FOLLOWING YEAR THORPE'S NAME WAS STRUCK FROM THE ROLL OF OLYMPIC CHAMPIONS AFTER IT WAS REVEALED THAT HE HAD EARLIER BEEN PAID FOR PLAYING MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL. THE AMOUNT INVOLVED WAS MINISCULE (\$15 [US] PER WEEK) BUT IT WAS NOT UNTIL 1982 THAT THE IOC REVERSED ITS DECISION AND AFTER AN INTERVAL OF 70 YEARS THE MEDALS WERE RETURNED, POSTHUMOUSLY, TO THE FAMILY OF THEIR RIGHTFUL OWNER. PART FRENCH AND PART SAC-AND-FOX INDIAN (NÉ WA-THO-HUCK, A SAC-AND-FOX INDIAN NAME MEANING "BRIGHT PATH"), HE ATTENDED CARLISLE INDIAN SCHOOL WHERE HE ESTABLISHED AN AWESOME REPUTATION AS A FOOTBALL RUNNING BACK, BEING VOTED ALL-AMERICAN IN 1911 AND 1912. HE LATER PLAYED PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL (1915-1929) FOR THE CANTON BULLDOGS AND WAS ACTUALLY THE FIRST PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL FOOTBALL LEAGUE, ALTHOUGH THE TITLE WAS LARGELY CEREMONIAL. THORPE ALSO PLAYED MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL FOR THE NEW YORK GIANTS, BOSTON BRAVES AND CINCINNATI REDS.







GOLD MEDALS WERE AWARDED TO WINNERS IN THE INDIVIDUAL EVENTS, MEMBERS OF THE EQUESTRIAN EVENTS, DOUBLES IN LAWN TENNIS AND MEMBERS OF THE 12-METERS YACHT RACES. 90 GOLD MEDALS WERE STRUCK.

SILVER-GILT MEDALS WERE AWARDED TO THE WINNERS IN ALL OTHER TEAM EVENTS. 200 SILVER-GILT MEDALS WERE STRUCK.

3. **FINLAND:** Finland was a grand duchy with the Russian Tsar as Grand Duke. It was under Russia's control only for financial matters and in foreign affairs: It had its own parliament, its own government, its own laws and legislation and ITS OWN STAMPS– in short – full inner autonomy. Baron Reinhold Felix von WILLEBRAND (1908-1919) was the IOC member for Finland. Finland had a NOC since 1907 (recognised in 1907). As the opening ceremony drew nearer, diplomatic activities with Russia increased.

The compromise worked out with the Russian government:


1. The Finnish delegation would march, during the opening ceremony, directly behind the Russian delegation
2. The flag-bearer could carry a small Finnish wimble and a sign with the name “FINLAND” (see picture).
3. The athletes could wear shirts with the Finnish badge

3. FINLAND: The Finnish team consisted of 162 men and 2 women. The team participated in 10 sports. The Fins won 9 Gold, 8 Silver and 9 Bronze medals, for a total of 26 medals. Finland ranked fourth amongst the competing nations and its place in the Olympic Games was certainly justified. Its “Empire” father, Russia, only won 4 medals, ranking 15th amongst the competing nations. **H. KOLEHMAINEN** was the second ranking amongst “most medal and most gold medal winners” and, **J PEKKALAINEN** was the youngest medallist (17 years, 63 days),







1. HUNGARY: Germany's motion was not even discussed, Coubertin having dismissed it as a matter of course. HUNGARY had a NOC since 1895, recognised the same year. Moreover, HUNGARY participated under its name since 1896 at all Olympic Games.

HUNGARY started with 123 athletes (5 doubled in other sports), competing in 11 sports. HUNGARY won 3 Gold, 2 Silver and 3 bronze medals, for a total of 8 medals. It placed 8th in the nations' calculation.











DELTIOLOGY (POSTCARDS)

The OC made an agreement with the Granberg Industrial-Art Co., whereby the firm was granted the sole right of publishing and selling picture postcards with reproductions of photographs, taken inside all venues. The Finance Committee placed one large and one small stall at the disposal of the firm. Granberg paid 13'000 Kronor (\$ 3'600) for the exclusivity, which turned out advantageously for all. In counterpart, Granberg was allowed to define the cards as "Official Postcards". 330 cards made up the series showing the events. We have chosen a selection featuring the football tournament.

THE FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT WAS PLACED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF A SPECIAL OLYMPIC FOOTBALL COMMITTEE, WHOSE MEMBERS WERE NOMINATED BY THE SWEDISH FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION. THE LATTER TOOK THE FINANCIAL RISK FOR THE ORGANISATION OF THE TOURNAMENT AND WAS TO RECEIVE 75% OF ALL PROFITS. THE TOURNAMENT TOOK PLACE FROM JUNE 29TH – JULY 5TH. 11 NATIONS PARTICIPATED. GREAT BRITAIN BEAT DENMARK FOR THE OLYMPIC TITLE (4:2), AND THIRD WAS HOLLAND. THE WINNER RECEIVED A CHALLENGE CUP AND A SILVER-GILT OLYMPIC MEDAL. A CONSOLATION SERIES, UNIQUE IN OLYMPIC HISTORY, AND IN WHICH 7 NATIONS PARTICIPATED, WAS WON BY HUNGARY WITH AUSTRIA PLACING SECOND. THE FOURTH PLACED AND THE TWO FINALISTS OF THE CONSOLATION SERIES RECEIVED MEDALS OFFERED BY THE SWEDISH FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION. THE OLYMPIC MEDALLISTS RECEIVED THEIR PRIZES FROM THE HANDS OF HIS MAJESTY, THE KING, IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CONCLUSION OF THE FINAL IN THE STADIUM (4:7.) THE REFEREES AND LINESMEN RECEIVED A SILVER CUP. THE TOURNAMENT WAS OF A VERY HIGH LEVEL. 33'864 VISITORS PAID FOR ENTRANCE TICKETS IN THE THREE STADIUMS; 13'865 PAID TO SEE THE FINALS ON JULY 4TH. THE FOOTBALL SPECTATORS WERE THIRD IN QUANTITY AFTER TRACK AND FIELD AND SWIMMING.









July 1911: The DT made financial arrangement (at the IHAD) for the participation of the DT at Stockholm.

April 1912: A circular letter was circulated through the DT Board of Directors.


Participation at Stockholm was refused by 23 votes against 1.

30.5.1912: Dr. F. Götz asked for a vote of confidence, which was given to him by the same score. However, Götz agreed to participate subject to a delegation of 160 gymnasts, which was naturally turned down by DRAfOS. Götz therefore advised DRAfOS of the non-participation of the DT at Stockholm.

3.6.1912: DRAfOS, at its meeting before leaving for Stockholm, regrets the DT's decision not to participate.

The leader of the Gymnast manifestation at the University of Leipzig, Dr. Hermann KUHR, used his relations with a Swedish physician and thus a Gymnasts squad, consisting only of Leipzig students, went to Stockholm. They were heavily attacked by the DT leadership.


