A second <u>re-entry</u> can be found on the first set of Irish airmail stamps. This variety on the third stamp in the fourth row of the 6d denomination consists in an extensive re-entry to the background, especially on the lower part of the stamp, making it appear darker than its neighbours.



The third stamp in row 9 shows an extra stone on the beach called "pebble on beach".
