




AIRMAIL STAMPS 1948 - 1965: CORNER BLOCKS OF 4 OF 1d STAMP DUBLIN - LANCASTER

April 4, 1949 / August 1, 1957








1/5 MAXIMUM CARD SHOWING THE ROCK OF CASHEL, CO. TIPPERARY







