It may, however, be assumed that, if they were properly prepaid for the Direct Indian Mail, and bore Air Mail labels, they were so forwarded.

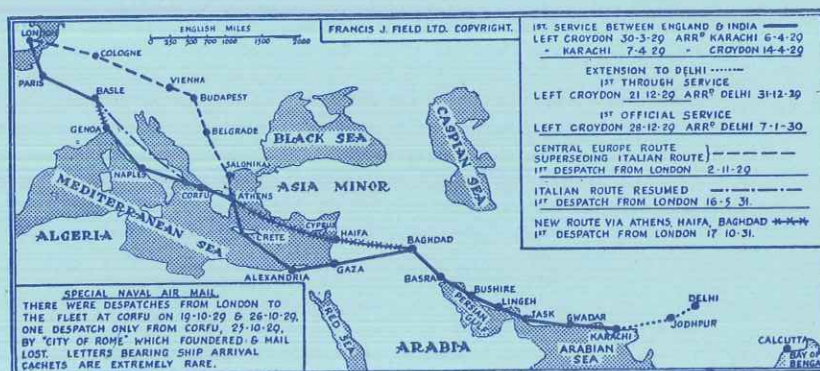

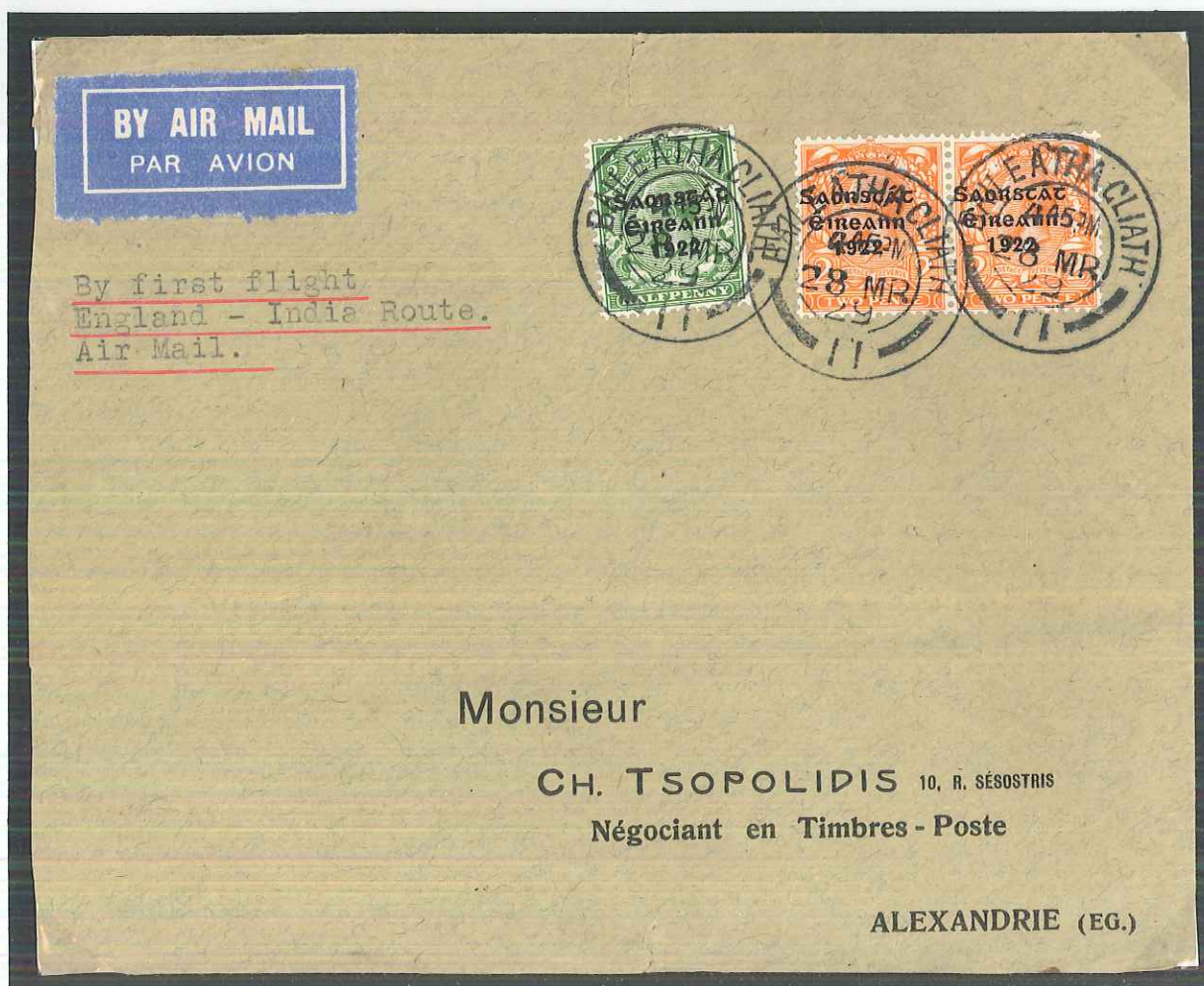
First Imperial Airways Flight, 1929.



FOR THE FIRST LONDON & KARACHI FLIGHTS SPECIAL ENVELOPES IN RED WERE ISSUED BY IMPERIAL AIRWAYS LTD., AND OFFICIAL CACHETS APPLIED IN IRAQ AND PERSIA. NO MAILED WERE ACCEPTED TO AND FROM PARIS, BASLE & GENOA. ON FIRST KARACHI & DELHI EXTENSION, OFFICIAL CACHETS WERE APPLIED TO INDIAN CORRESPONDENCE ONLY. BRITISH MAILED WERE CARRIED ON FIRST FLIGHT OF THIS EXTENSION BUT OFFICIAL NOTICE OF DESPATCH AND EXTRA FEE PUBLISHED ONLY BEFORE THE SECOND ACTUAL INDIAN FLIGHT. DURING WINTERS OF 1929-30 & 1930-31, MAILED WERE CARRIED BY ORIENT EXPRESS BETWEEN PARIS AND ATHENS. THE RATE WITHIN EUROPE WAS REDUCED TO 4D. ON 6TH. JUNE 1930 & FROM LONDON TO INDIA WAS REDUCED FROM 71/2D. TO 61/2D. ON 27TH. JUNE 1930.
