IRISH ACCEPTANCE FOR EXPERIMENTAL FIRST FLIGHT SERVICE BY IMPERIAL AIRWAYS: LONDON - BATAVIA

April 4, 1931





Posted **BAILE ÁTHA CLIATH** on April 2, 1931, and carried on April 4 with first experimental service **IE 106** by Imperial Airways *London - Batavaia*.

SINGAPORE transit postmark of April 18, and **BATAVIA** arrival postmarks of April 19.

The Imperial Aircraft "City of Cairo" crashed on April 19, short of fuel, near Koepang which was the next stop after Batavia, and was badly damaged.

Kingsford Smith in the Southern Cross left Sydney on April 21, reached Darwin on April 23 and Koepang on April 24 and then returned with the stranded mails.





Posted Dublin on June 29, 1931,
forwarded via London – Marseilles airmail service
and carried on July 1 by first Air Orient service,
piloted by Winckler, Marseilles – Saigon, French Indo-China.

MARSEILLES transit postmarks of June 30
and SAIGON CENTRAL arrival postmarks of July 22, 1.55 p.m.
On July 6 the Air Orient plane was forced to land at Akyab by a fire on board,
and mails were transferred on July 15 to the next KLM aircraft.


Ignoring the ANA flight, the cover was forwarded London - Amsterdam, followed by the regular Dutch KLM service Amsterdam - Singapore.





Registered mail, posted Kuala Lumpur on October 9, 1931, forwarded via Penang to Alor Star and carried by KLM airmail service
<u>Alor Star - Amsterdam</u> and <u>Amsterdam - London</u>. Forwarded to Dublin.

PENANG transit postmark of October 10 and RATHMINES arrival postmark of October 28.
