

Ägyptische Postanstalten im Ausland

Sie bestanden in einer ganzen Anzahl von Städten des levantischen Orients, in Abessinien sowie im Sudan. Auch verschiedene ägyptische Postdampferlinien benutzten ägyptische Marken. Verwendet wurde die I. II. III. und IV. Ausgabe des Mutterlandes. Die verwendeten Marken sind an der Entwertung erkennbar: Kreisstempel mit Namen unten, Datum in der Mitte, oben V.R. POSTE EGIZIANE (Khediviane Egiziane). Die ägyptischen Postanstalten im Ausland wurden bis auf einige Postämter im Sudan, die noch einige Jahre länger geöffnet waren, in den Jahren 1872 - 1885 geschlossen.





After a thorough and careful study of the item submitted to me for authentication as EGYPT, a single example of the 2 piastres bright blue 'Second Issue' adhesive of 1867-69 (Zeheri #12, Balian #15, S.G. #15, Scott #14),

This submitted 2 piastres stamp of 1867-69 is type IV of the lithographic transfer matrix of four types, repeated fifty times to produce the lithographic printing stone of 200 subjects,

and is with normal pseudo-watermark (upright, impressed on reverse). The back of the stamp has central thinning, which has very slightly intruded onto the face. It bears an approximately 80%-complete strike of a genuine "V.R. POSTE EGIZIANE ❖ MERSINA ❖" circular datestamp (Egypt Study Circle type III-1.5), clearly dated "8 FEB 1871". The Egyptian consular post office at Mersina (present-day Mersin), a Turkish port located on the Mediterranean Sea coast of southeastern Anatolia, opened on 14th July, 1870 (along with twelve other such exterritorial post offices in what was then metropolitan Turkey or Ottoman Turkish territory) as a direct result of the extension of the weekly Egyptian governmental steamer service of the Khedivial Mail Line. The office remained in operation until on or about 15th February, 1872, when it was closed (as were ten of the other twelve offices which opened concurrently with it) due to a lack of traffic. The office's existence spanned only twenty months, eighteen of which saw the exclusive use of second issue adhesives. During its last two months, second issue and third issue adhesives were valid concurrently (1st to 31st January of 1872) or only third issue stamps were valid (1st February to ca. 15th February of 1872). Genuine strikes of this "MERSINA" datestamp are among the rarest of all of the Egyptian postmarks (Smith accords it a scarcity factor of 1900 points, on a point scale of 1 to 3600). It is likely that less than twenty Egyptian adhesives bearing this postmark survive, two of which (as a horizontal pair) are on a complete cover. c.f.m.



(from a later printing with upright watermark, ca. 1882)

is fully sound, but for a tiny surface disturbance at right-hand edge. It was cancelled at Berber (Barbar) in 1883, during the period of the Egyptian administration of the Sudan. It bears a genuine strike in blue, approximately 90%-complete, of a "❖ POSTE EGIZIANE ❖" postmark (Egypt Study Circle type V-4), including the entire bilingual (Italian/Arabic) town name of "BARBAR / بربر" and the full Arabic date of "١٦ ديسمبر ٨٠" (16 December 80), in which the year indictum, "٨٠" ("80"), has been manuscript-amended/enhanced to "٨٣" ("83") in black pencil (on cancellers of type V-4, year dates later than 1880 were amended in Arabic by hand, or the "٨٠" was allowed to remain as-is, up to as late as 1884). The Egyptian post office at Berber, an important commercial town on the Nile River, opened on 1st October, 1873, and apparently remained in operation until mid-May of 1884, when the town was captured by the forces of the Mahdi. Examples of the type V-4 postmark of Berber are rare (Smith scarcity rating of 400), and are found struck either in black or in blue (the scarcer color). The earliest strike currently recorded is dated 26th January, 1875. Although the Egypt Study Circle Record states that the latest-recorded strike is dated 2nd December 1884, this is thought to be a typographical error, as the post office ceased operation more than six months prior to that date. 


A type V-4 postmark of "BARBAR"

Ägyptische Post im Sudan

Das erste Postamt, welches von der ägyptischen Postverwaltung eröffnet wurde, war in Suakim. Die Öffnung des Suezkanals im Jahre 1869 ermöglichte es, daß die Briefe schneller Suakim erreichten. Briefe nach Khartum wurden über Berber dorthin gesendet. Der Rückzug der ägyptischen Truppen 1884 bewirkte, daß die Postämter "herrenlos" wurden und nur die Postämter in dem Hafen Suakim und Massawa (Eritrea) sowie Wadi Halfa offen blieben.

This submitted 1 piastra stamp of 1875, fully sound and free of defects, was cancelled at Khartoum in 1879, during the period of the Egyptian administration of the Sudan. It bears a genuine strike in blue, approximately 75%-complete, of a "❖ POSTE EGIZIANE ❖" postmark (Egypt Study Circle type V-4), including the entire Arabic portion of the bilingual (Italian/Arabic) town name of "HARTUM" and the full Arabic date of "٢ فبراير ٧٩" (2 February 79). The Egyptian post office at Khartoum opened on 1st October, 1873, and remained in operation until apparently mid-March of 1884, when external postal contact with the city was severed by the forces of the Mahdi, who laid siege to it until its fall in January of 1885. Examples of the type V-4 postmark of Khartoum are rare, and are found struck either in black or in blue (the scarcer color). Strikes are currently recorded with dates between 5th July, 1874 and 15th April, 1880. c.f.H.


