

ITALIAN POST OFFICE

Mail to Italy was forwarded by the French until an Italian post office was opened in Alexandria on March 1, 1863. The office was located at the Italian Navigation Company, Adriatico-Orientale, at No. 9 Rue de la Poste. In 1877 the contract was taken over by Rubattino Company. In 1881 they merged with I. & V. Floria & Co. to form the Navigazione Generale Italiana, which continued the contract until the post was closed on February 1, 1884.
