


The Kran Issues

As the postal system was expanded for parcels and insured mail, the need for higher value stamps became more significant.

In the fall of 1876 it was decided that stamps with Kran (equals 20 Shahis) denominations would be printed. By September 1876, 1 Kran and 4 Kran stamps were being produced using the existing "1" and "4" Shahi clichés in blocks of four.

In December 1876, Postmaster General Gustav Riederer replaced the Lion Shahi stamps with the First Portrait (of Nasser-eddin Shah) Shahi stamps, which were ordered from the Imperial Austrian Printing Office. The new denominations were compatible with the established postal rates.







Persía ROI Bushire Under British Occupation (1915)

<u>Summary</u> — The occupation of Bushire and associated skirmishes in surrounding regions represent one of the key conflicts of WWI.

This important WWI event is covered in detail in this Section; Post WWI events are in the following Section VI (End of the Qajar Dynasty).

On August 8, 1915 British and Indian forces invaded and occupied Bushire, the primary port in the Persian Gulf. The Union Jack was flown high above the port, and on August 15, the Persian Post Office was overtaken and Persian stamps were overprinted "Bushire Under British Occupation".

The occupation lasted ten weeks, ending Oct. 16, 1915. By agreeing to withdraw from Bushire, Britain was successful in receiving concessions to control the Persian Gulf and the oil fields of South Persia, as well as to maintain its connection to Mesopotamia.



August 9, 1915 - British Military cover On Active Service & "BUSHIRE 9 AU 15" on Reverse; **Day after arrival of the British occupying forces in Bushire.**



BUBO is the only case when a foreign power overprinted the stamps of Persia.
