



1835 (10.5) Disinfected large part folded entire from Teheran to London, with notations in script regarding Bushire and Diri-i-chameh, no postal markings on front, but struck with circular black Disinfection seal at Semlin, fine and rare early letter

1837 (31.5) Folded disinfected entire from Sir Henry Lindsay Bethune in Tabreez (Tabriz), addressed to the Manager of Royal Bank of Scotland in Edinburgh, Scotland, showing disinfection punctures, London transit and Edinburgh arrival mkgs, unusual & scarce early entire, cert. Persiphila (2011)

1844 (17.6) Folded entire from Reverend Justin Perkins in Oroomiah (Orumiah) mission addressed to Reverend Thomas Edward Vermilye in New York City, via Boston with red transit ds "BOSTON" and straight line "SHIP", plus "20" in circle, very fine, attractive and rare missionary letter, cert. Persiphila (2011)

Note: Reverend Justin Perkins wrote that the French Papists had again been ejected from Persia at the instance of the Russian Ambassador and that one of the Nestorian missionaries had died at Mosul weighed down by the failure of the mission to the wild mountains

Persiphila (2011)

Note: Joseph son of George of Gavalan wrote that he was studying English and medical books and that he had witnessed Christians being beaten and offered money to renounce their religion and "it is very much difficult fopr Christians to live in this country among the people"

1845 (12.4) Folded entire from Reverend Justin Perkins in Oroomiah (Orumiah) mission addressed to Reverend Thomas Edward Vermilye in New York City, redirected to Fairfield Connecticut, via Boston with red transit ds "BOSTON" and "NEW YORK" arrival straight line "SHIP", very fine, attractive and rare missionary letter, cert. Persiphila (2011)

Note: Reverend Justin Perkins wrote that the Jesuits, aided by an official agent sent into Persia by the French government had caused many problems and that he had to go to Teheran to vindicate the mission, travelling 1100 miles on horse and encountering snow three feet deep. He enquired of the recipient "what will be the effect of the annexation of Texas on the perpetunity of removal of slavery?"





David Feldman Extended Payment Facility

David Feldman SA (DFSA) may offer a special extended payment facility for buyers. In 1882, a number of presentation panels were prepared for the UPU. These panels were handpainted and gilded. There are apparently only three remaining, each one is different and hence, unique



1. The auction lots are offered

- 1.1 As presented in the relative auction catalogue and/or through the David Feldman S.A. website. Lots are meticulously described and with the greatest care, however without responsibility. Photographs count as part of the description with regard to the margins, perforation, centering, postmarks and all other visible attributes. The descriptions of the lots mention if the items are signed by recognised experts and/or accompanied by expert certificates.
- 1.2 As viewed in person: before and during auction sales, persons or their agents may examine lots at our offices or at the auction location, and must confirm their auction invitation before viewing.
