"BERBICE" TWO-LINE DATESTAMP



20 June 1834 - Italic Berbice datestamp, T&H type 3, recorded used from 1832 to 1837, and rated "scarce." The address side shows "2/2" manuscript rate and is endorsed "Packet (Sheldrake)" and "received 9th August."

"BERBICE" ONE-LINE DATESTAMP



12 July 1840 - **Earliest known use** of T&H type 5, recorded used from 4 August 1840 to 30 July 1841, and all strikes are rated "rare." Rated "1/-" on arrival.

DEMERARA "SMALL FLEURON" CANCEL



21 December 1834 - **Small fleuron** (T&H type 7, used 1822-42); sent by Falmouth packet and received in England on 12 February 1835. Rated "2/5½" but re-rated "4/0." Falmouth boxed "½" {½d. Due) handstamp, not to be confused with Berbice "½" rate handstamp.



19 July 1831 - Sent to Barbados and rated "8" plus "2" (captain's gratuity or rate from New Amsterdam to Georgetown?).

21 December 1835 - Datelined Demerary and endorsed "By Reliance," entering the mails at Deal (note distinct Deal / Ship Letter" handstamp, rated "2/2" and backstamped 1 February.



12 January 1835 - Datelined Demerary and addressed to Liverpool, entered the mails at **Port Glasgow**, with scarce crowned "Ship Letter / G R / Port Glasgow" handstamp and datestamp of same (for 21 February) on reverse. Rated "1/8" and showing "Addl. / ½" handstamp.







Postmarked 28 Jan. 1818 but datelined 31 Jan. - Large fleuron datestamp (T&H type 6, used 1809-1819), cover rated "6/6" (i.e. 6 shillings 6 pence) and thus triple weight. Carried by the Falmouth packet; backstamped at London on 14 May.


1838 - Worn late impression of the datestamp, to London and readdressed to Sutton, Mouncton with scarce boxed "POSTAGE NOT PAID / LONDON" handstamp, first rated "2/2" then "2/6."

5 May 1842 - Georgetown to Rev, Tidman at Mission House, London. Note 24 June receiver. Rated "1/" due, the current packet letter rate.

5 October 1839 - Endorsed "p Laurel" and date of sailing, entering the mails at Greenock (scarcer "Ship Letter" datestamp) on 26 November. Rated "2/8" and backstamped at Edinburgh the next day.
