"Mit Luftpost befördert / Flugpostamt München 2" airmail confirmation cachet.

Re-posted Dublin on April 28 and carried on May 2

with first Imperial Airways flight service <u>London - Brussels - Cologne</u>, inaugurated on May 2 by DH 34 G-EBBY with Capt. A.L. Robinson.

One of three 10 Rappen postcards posted that day.

EARLY AIRMAIL SERVICE (DUBLIN) - LONDON - PARIS - ZURICH

April 25, 1924



Posted registered **BAILE ÁTHA CLIATH** on April 25, 1924, and carried with airmail service <u>London - Paris</u>.

Forwarded to Zurich.

Inscribed "Not urgent!".

LONDON / REGISTERED transit postmark of April 26,
PARIS transit postmark of April 26, 7.00 p.m.,
and ZÜRICH / BRIEFTRÄGER arrival postmark of April 28, 7.00 a.m.

Imperial Airways was created on March 31, 1924, and planned to start operations on April 7 but a pilot's strike delayed its first flight until after April 26. Regular mails posted in Ireland (and UK) for airmail service to Paris were held back until April 26 but registered mails (even if inscribed "not urgent") were carried with the first foreign service.
