The Eric Weissenberg Collection of Holocaust Mail and Collateral Items

An exceptional and most extensive collection of holocaust mail and collateral items from the period 1939 to 1945.

Already in 1933, the Nazi regime had established the first concentration camp. The system grew to include about 100 camps divided into two types: camps for slave labour working in nearby factories and death camps for the systematic extermination of Jews and others such as Gypsies, homosexuals, political opponents and mentally disabled.

Only a limited amount of mail was allowed to be sent and received by prisoners at Nazi concentration camps. These letters were subject to a severe scrutiny of regulations. Generally, letters had to be written in German, censored by camp personnel and sent on special pre-printed stationery. Sending money was permitted but packages was not. In theory, the inmates were allowed to send or receive two letters and cards each month, but this allowance was frequently suspended arbitrarily and without notice. Newspapers were permitted but only if ordered through the concentration camp post office. Needless to say that requests to speak to or visit prisoners were prohibited.

The exceptional assembly of this wide range of items not only makes tangible the ordeal of the persecuted within the camps but also shows all the propaganda which lead to the holocaust.





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

Ghetto was created on July 1, 1940. In June 1941 there were approximately 6,000 Jews including almost 2,000 transferred from Oswiecim (Auschwitz) who did slave labour for the German weapons industry. All the Jews were transported to Auschwitz when the ghetto was liquidated between April 1942 and June 1943.

CZESTOCHOWA (Pol. Tschenstochau), Kielce District, Poland

One of the larger and more active Jewish cities in Poland, Czestochowa had upwards of 26,000 Jews (more than 20% of the total) just prior to WWII. As with other large Polish Jewish enclaves, the city had very active religious, educational, economic, social and political communities, with most of the known organizations represented. The Germans occupied in September 1939, immediately formed a Judenrat and terrorized the Jewish community; indiscriminately killing and destroying property. With the number of Jews in the city, the Judenrat had a vast responsibility supplying medical treatment & food for thousands. The ghetto was created on 9 April 1941 and liquidated by October 1942. During this period of time tens of thousands of Jews were transported to Treblinka. A Jewish underground existed in the city and there was a history of armed resistance that started in 1943.

CZORTKOW, Galicia District, Poland (today Ukraine)

Czortkow had an active Jewish history dating back to the 17th century. Anti-Semitism and conflict between the Hassidic and Zionistic elements of the community dominated the late 19th and early 20th centuries and Zionism dominated the cultural and social life of the town by the start of WWII. The Soviets invaded on 17 September 1939, which brought Jewish communal and political life to an end. At that time there was a Jewish population of voer 6,000. The Germans took the town on 6 June 1941. A Judenrat was set up to regulate the supply of forced labor and in April 1942 a ghetto was established. Many Jews were murdered or died from starvation. By the time the ghetto was liquidated 23 June 1943 most of the Jews were deported to Belzec death camp.

DOMBROWA GORNICZA, Kielce District. Poland

Jews began settling in the area in 1828 when they were hired as miners. By the beginning of the 1930s. the Jewish population numbered over 5,000 (total pop. 37.000) –about 40% of which worked in the garment trade. The Germans arrived on 3 September 1939, setting up a Judenrat in November. By early 1940 the Germans took over most of the Jewish businesses and refugees brought the population up to 6,300. Ghetto inhabitants were sent labor camps, worked in shops that supported the German Army or were deported to Auschwitz.

IZBICA, Lublin District, Poland

The first Jewish families settled in the late 18th century and soon comprised over 90% of the population. The town became famous as a Hassidic center. After the Nazis occupied in September 1939, they designated Izbica as a concentration point for Jewish refugees from Western Poland. 3000 Jews arrived in December 1939 and a Judenrat was set up in early 1940. The Jewish population reached a high of 6,500 in Spring 1942. When liquidated, most were sent to Selzec and Sobibor.
























JASLO, Cracow District, Poland

Jews first mentioned in the 14th century. The Nazis arrived on 8 September 1939 and immediately commenced a regime of persecution. A Judenrat was formed at the end of the year and in 1941 the Jews were placed in a ghetto which held a population of up to 2,300. Most were deported to Belzec. The entire town was razed at the end of 1944.

KIELCE, Kielce District, Poland

Although a ban was in place, Jews began settling in Kielce in 1819. The Jews were expelled in 1845 and after the ban was lifted again in 1863, the population grew dramatically. By the start of the 1930s they numbered 18,000 (out of 58,000). The Nazis entered the city on 4 September 1939 and a Judenrat was established on 21 September. With an aggressive influx of deportees, the Jewish population grew to over 25,000 by March 1940. In February 1941 an additional 7,500 Jews arrived from Vienna. Two ghettos were set up in April 1941. Mass Aktions started on 20 August 1942 and about 21,000 Jews were deported to Treblinka while another 3,000 were murdered in the city. The remaining 1,600 were placed in the smaller ghetto and put to work in munitions factories and other labor camps. The members of the Judenrat were murdered on 20 November 1942.



KOLBUSZOWA (Yid. Kolbsow), Lwow District. Poland

Jewish community developed in the 16th century and became an important factor in its economic development as exporters of locally made furniture. In 1939, the Jewish population numbered almost 1,800. The Germans entered the town in the 2nd week of September 1939 and a Judenrat was set up in March 1940. On Passover, the Joint Distribution Committee supplied one ton of matzo to the 1,800 Jews there. In June 1941 they were confined to a ghetto. All were deported to Rzeszow on 24 June 1942 and most died in Belzec in July 1942.

KOLOMYJA (Ger. Kolomea), Stanislawow District, Poland (today Ukraine)

Kolomyja was an important center of Hassidism. Legend had it that the founder of Hassidism in Eastern Europe, Ba'al Shem Tov was born in the town, which contributed to its growth (he was actually born in Okup on the Russian Polish border, aka Podolia). By the outbreak of WWII the town had a thriving Jewish community which numbered in the thousands. With the arrival of the Soviets in September 1939, Jewish communal and commercial life was curtailed. The Hungarian army arrived in July 1941 and then the Germans took over the city on 1 August 1941, when it was incorporated into the General Gouvernement. A Judenrat, which was headed by Mordekhai Horowitz was set and was additionally burdened with the arrival 2,000 refugees from Hungary. In a mass Aktion started on 12 October 1941, almost 3,000 Jews were murdered in the Szeparowce forest 5 miles outside the city. A ghetto was was sealed off on 25 March 1942, crowding together over 18,000. Over the next few months most of these people were deported to Belzec death camp.

LUBLIN, Lublin District, Poland

Lublin had a large and very active Jewish community which dates back to the 15th century. At the time when the Germans entered Lublin (18 September 1939), there were around 40,000 Jews living there (1/3 of total). On 26 October 1939, Lublin was incorporated into the General Government territory and Odilo Globocnik, a close consort of Himmler who was responsible for building Majdanek, Belzec, Sobibor and Treblinka, became head of district police and SS. A Judenrat of 24 was set up in January 1940. The Lublin community suffered greatly and all, from childeren to old people, were put to work. By March 1942, Operation Reinhard, which called for the extermination of Polish Jewry began, and each day 1,400 Jews were loaded onto trains and sent to Belzec death camp. In all, 30,000 were exterminated in Belzec. When the ghetto was liquidated on 9 November 1942 the remaining Jews were sent to Majdanek.

MIENDZYRZEC PODLASKI (Yid. Mezhirech, Mezrich), Lublin District, Poland

Miendzyrzec was one of the first places in Poland where Hebrew books were printed, with a Jewish press operating in 1595. The Jewish population grew rapidly during the 19th and early 20th centuries. All kinds of Jewish organizations were active from various Hassidic sects to the Zionist and labour movements. The Red Army invaded the town in September 1939 and as they retreated about 2,000 young Jews fled east. The Germans invaded on 9 October 1939 and a Judenrat was formed in December. Thousands were sent to labour camps. On 25-26 August 1942, 12,000 Jews were herded into the city square. About 1,000 were shot and the rest were sent to Treblinka. Thousands more were sent there and most of the last 1,000 were sent to Majdanek in May 1943.

MIELEC, Cracow District, Poland

The Jewish community began to develop in the 18th century and quickly formed a majority of the population. On 8 September 1939 the German occupation started. A ghetto was created and the refugee population swelled, bringing the total number of Jews to 4,500. The ghetto was liquidated in March 1942 and the inhabitants were dispersed to various settlements in the Lublin District.

MODLIBORZYCE, Lublin District. Poland

Jews were first mentioned in the mid-17th century and numbered around 957 in 1921. Under German occupation the Jewish population doubled to about 2.000 with the arrival of refugees from Vienna in March 1941. In October 1942 all were expelled to Krasnik and from there to Belzec death camp.



OPATOW (Yid. Apta), Kielce District. Poland

Jews settled in the 16th century, living in their own quarter and engaging in extensive trade. At the beginning of the 20th century the population number over 4,000. As the Nazis approached, many of the young fled eastward. The Nazis occupied in September 1939, a Judenrat was set up in early 1941 and a ghetto in spring 1941. The population swelled with refugees from Lodz and Warsaw and typhoid was rampant. Many of the inhabitants were sent to labour camps, but the majority (over 6,000 on 20-22 October 1942) were deported to Treblinka (nearly 300 survived the war.)

OPOLE (Yid. Apia), Lublin District, Poland

Jewish settlers came in the late 16th century and by the 19th century were instrumental in the town's industrial development. At the start of the 20th century the population reached over 3,000 and became an important Hassidic center. When the Nazi invaded in September 1939, the Jewish population stood at 4,300 and rose to over 10,000 in 1942. Deportations started in March 1942. Most were sent to Belzec and Sobibor. Those left behind were murdered.

OTWOCK, Warsaw District, Poland

The Jewish population grew as the city developed into a health resort in the early 20^{th} century, numbering almost 5,500 (out of 8,500) in 1921. Jews ran hotels and kosher restaurants. Otwock was the seat of a number of Hassidic sects including Lubavitch (Rebbe Schneersohn established a yeshiva here). The Germans captured the city on 29 September 1939. A Judenrat was appointed in October and in December about 15,000 were crowded into a ghetto. On 19 August 1942, about 8,000 were sent to Treblinka and Auschwitz and most of the 4,000 who evaded deportation were sought out and murdered in the ghetto or the forests.



PRZEMYSL, Warsaw District, Poland

The Jewish community in Przemysl dates back to the 10th century and probably had a settlement by the 1300s. In the late 1800s many of the Jews in this town emigrated to the United States. Still, their numbers grew rapidly. By 1910 there were over 16,000 Jews (out of 54,000) and by 1931, over 17,000. The city had many Hassidic sects including the Blazowa, Belz and Sadagora. Their political rivals were the assimilationists organised in the Shomer Israel society and known as "Deutschen" (German) for their modern clothes and clean-shaven appearance. The city was captured by the Germans on 14 September 1939, who did great damage prior to the Red Army arriving on 28 September. When the Red Army invaded they closed down all the Jewish institutions. A number of community leaders were exiled to the Soviet Union, as were about 7,000 Jews. The Germans retook the city on 29 June 1941. A Judenrat was set up, and in July 1942 the city's 22,000 Jews were crowded in a ghetto. By fall 1943 the ghetto inhabitants were either murdered or deported to Belzec, Auschwitz or various labour camps. About 250 survivors appeared in the city when it was liberated by the Soviets on 27 July 1944.






Although a struggle, Jews maintained a prominent position in the city's economic life as far back as the late 16^{th} century. They continued to grow as businessmen and artisans. The Jewish population rose steadily from 3,400 in 1800 to over 11,000 in 1921. The Germans invaded in September 1939 and two synagogues were destroyed and Jews were evicted from "choice" apartments. Subsequently, Jewish businesses were "Aryanised" and various "contributions" were exacted from the community. A Judenrat was set up in October 1939 and in December thousands of Jewish refugees from Western Poland began to arrive. In January 1942 a ghetto was sealed off, holding a population of 12,500. In June over 10,000 additional refugees were brought in and mass deportations started in July. Most were deported to Belzec death camp.

Conditions of Sale

The currency of the auction is the Euro (€)

Participation in any David Feldman S.A. auction means acceptance in full of the following conditions as well as any rights and obligations arising therefrom. These same conditions also apply to all transactions in auction lots taking place outside the realm of the auctions. DAVID FELDMAN S.A., organiser of the auctions, acts as an agent only and is not liable in any way whatsoever for any default(s) of purchaser(s) and/or vendor(s).

1. The auction lots are offered

- 1.1 As presented in the relative auction catalogue and/or through the David Feldman S.A. website. Lots are meticulously described and with the greatest care, however without responsibility. Photographs count as part of the description with regard to the margins, perforation, centering, postmarks and all other visible attributes. The descriptions of the lots mention if the items are signed by recognised experts and/or accompanied by expert certificates.
- 1.2 As viewed in person: before and during auction sales, persons or their agents may examine lots at our offices or at the auction location, and must confirm their auction invitation before viewing. Persons or their agents attending a Live Room auction by invitation and/or who have viewed lots before an auction are understood to have examined all lots which they purchase and accept them as they are at the moment of the knocking-down and not necessarily as described.

2. Auction bids

2.1 The auction bid steps for all auctions are as follows: (some auctions may be in other currencies than Euros)

Bids between these steps will be adjusted accordingly to the next highest bid step. The bidder is bound by his offer until a higher bid has been validly accepted.

- 2.2 DAVID FELDMAN S.A. has full discretion to refuse any bidding, to divide any lot or lots, to combine any two or more lots and to withdraw any lot or lots from the sale without in any case giving any reason. In these cases, the vendor is treated as a buyer and the auctioneer shall bid on his behalf up to reserve prices. If the reserve price fixed by the vendor is not reached, the auctioneer passes to the next lot by a simple knock of the hammer.
- 2.3 Bid orders are only accepted from registered clients of DAVID FELDMAN S.A. and/or its associated companies. Live Room bidders must confirm their invitation prior to obtaining a bidding number.
- 2.4 Bid orders received by DAVID FELDMAN S.A. including via its website before the relative auctions have priority over room bids in the case of Live Room auctions. Clients giving bidding instructions to DAVID FELDMAN S.A. may make alternative offers and/or limit the total of their expenditure in advance. Bids marked "BUY" are considered as up to ten times the quoted estimate price where such exists. 3. The auction

- **3.1** Unless explicitly stated otherwise, the currency of the auction is Euros. Attendance at the Live Room auction is reserved for invited clients and/or their agents.
- 3.2 Prerogatives of David Feldman S.A.: DAVID FELDMAN S.A. may withdraw, group differently, divide or refuse to knock down any lot. DAVID FELDMAN S.A. reserves the right to refuse any bid orders and/or for Live Room auctions, refuse admittance to the auction room, at its discretion, to anybody whomsoever. DAVID FELDMAN S.A. cannot be held responsible for any physical accident that may occur on the premises where auctions take place. In the case a bone fide offer for the entire collection presented in this catalog is received at least two weeks before the auction date, and would be accepted by the vendor and the auctioneer, it maybe withdrawn from sale and the auction offer cancelled.
- 3.3 Bidders' representatives and auction agents: any per-

son bidding for the account of a third party is fully liable for any obligation arising from such bidding. This responsibility is notably applicable for the verification of the condition and for the payment of purchased lots.

3.4 Winning Bids: each lot is sold on behalf of the respective owner to the highest bidder who becomes the buyer at one bid step over the next highest bid step; this is the knock-down price. In addition to the knock-down price, the buyer pays an all-in fee of 20% to cover commission, charges and expenses including lotting fees, insurance, packing, export formalities etc. whether all incurred in particular cases or not. Cost of postage or shipping for all lots is additional and will be invoiced separate from the buyer all-in fee. - 3.5 Payment: Sale price plus commission and postage or shipping (if any) are due for immediate payment as invoiced against delivery of the lots. Payment in other currencies is accepted at the rates of exchange of the day as quoted by a major Swiss bank. The bidders who are successful with whom it has been expressly agreed that they pay after the sale under special conditions, are due to pay the sale price and the commission according to those terms. 4. Guarantee

4.1 Extent of the guarantee: subject to paragraph 4.3 below, the authenticity of all philatelic items sold in the auction is guaranteed for a period of 30 days from the auction date, with the express exclusion of any other fault(s). Any reclamation regarding authenticity must come to the notice of DAVID FELDMAN S.A. on the delivery of the

lots but at the latest within 30 days from that date. Before delivery, which may take place after the 30 days period. the lots nurchased may be examined at the Geneva offices of DAVID FFI DMAN S.A. The buyer whose reclamation is made after 30 days from the auction date loses all rights to the quarantee. Such reclamation will not be valid by DAVID FFI DMAN S.A., If an extension of the period is required in order to substantiate the claim with an expertise, a request for such extension must be made to DAVID FELDMAN S.A. within 30 days of the auction date. No request for extension will be considered beyond this 30 days period. If a stamp is found by a recognised expert, taking financial responsibility for errors, to have been forged, he may mark it accordingly. Consequently, the marking "FALSCH" (forged) is not considered an alteration. In the case of such reclamation, DAVID FELDMAN S.A. reserves the right to request, at its own discretion, one or more further expertise(s). All expertise and relative charges accrue to the vendor's account in the case of a justified claim, or to the buyer's account if the claim is not justified. In the case of a justified claim, the lot is taken back and the knock-down price plus the commission are refunded to the buyer. In the case of delayed payment due to expertise agreed by David Feldman S.A., interest is charged at 50% of the standard rate for all cleared lots. If David Feldman S.A. has not agreed, then full interest is due.
- 4.3 Exclusions: lots described as collections, accumulations, selections, groups and those containing duplicates cannot be the subject of any claim. Claims concerning lots described as a set or groups of sets containing more than one stamp, can only be considered under the terms of paragraph 4.1 above if they relate to less than one third of the total value of the lot.
