The weak entry flaw (1955/7, 1966)

This flaw appears on the top left corner of the bird stamps R12/5. The wear is progressive and by 1965, during the printing identified with letter (e) (1), the light shading in the vicinity of letters **FA** of FALKLAND has almost disappeared to the extent that weak entry status is accorded by most specialized catalogues.

In my collection of several hundred copies of 1955/57 the ½ p (SG 193, and 193a) there are numerous stamps with a partial weak entry where the shading extending between letters F and L is very light and the shaded area below the first three letters: **FAL** is very much reduced in comparison with the normal shading in Waterlow and TDLR printings.

The real weak entry is always much more rare and limited to the light shading between letters **F** and **A** and with almost no shaded area below **FAL**.

The weak entry flaw has been recorded for the following TDLR values: **½, 1, 2d and 2 shillings** (SG 193ab 194ab, 195ab and 204ab) and also for the watermark sideways print of the 1/2d (SG 227a).

In this small collection you shall find several copies of these values and magnified photos of the entry on different stamps.



The weak entry has less crossed shade lines, they almost disappear between letters F and A, and especially below both. There are fewer or no lines connecting following letters. These stamps are rare and not easily find. Normally not well identified because there are entries between both extremes. They are rather abundant on 1/2d. stamps, and more rare on 1d, 2d, .6d and 2 Sh.



shading is very reduced below FAL and up to letters A-L

Weak entries appear on the following values: ½, d; 1d; 2d; 6d and 2 Sh.
The normal entry print has crossed shade lines specially below and between letters F and A. and, sometimes, they appears among other letters to the right. The general impression is strong shading.
