## 1887. First General Revenue Issue.

A set of six values was produced by De La Rue in London, the vignette featuring the Sphinx and Pyramid design of the current Postage issues.

Printed in sheets of 120 stamps divided into two panes of 60 stamps, inscribed 'Gouvernement Egyptien' and value in French.

Typographed. The stamps were printed with fugitive inks. Watermark Star & Crescent, sideways on the horizontal values. Perforated 14.



The complete set of six values.

Printing figures are not known but most examples in the fresh condition displayed here are from the De La Rue archive sales at Robson Lowe held between 1972-78.

## 1938. Ministry of Finances Revenue.

Inscribed 'damgha masriya' in centre (Egyptian Tax). A set of five values was issued in sheets of 100.  
Issued in 1938, probably in December with the similar Official issue of that date.

Lithographed by the Survey Department, Cairo.

Watermark Multiple Crown. Perforated  $13\frac{1}{2} \times 13$ .



King Farouk Palace Printing,  
imperforate on card paper, under-printed 'Cancelled'.  
200 of each value were printed.



King Farouk Palace Mis-perforations.

Deliberately produced for King Farouk's personal collection.  
Less than 200 sets exist due to damage since the disposal of the collection.
