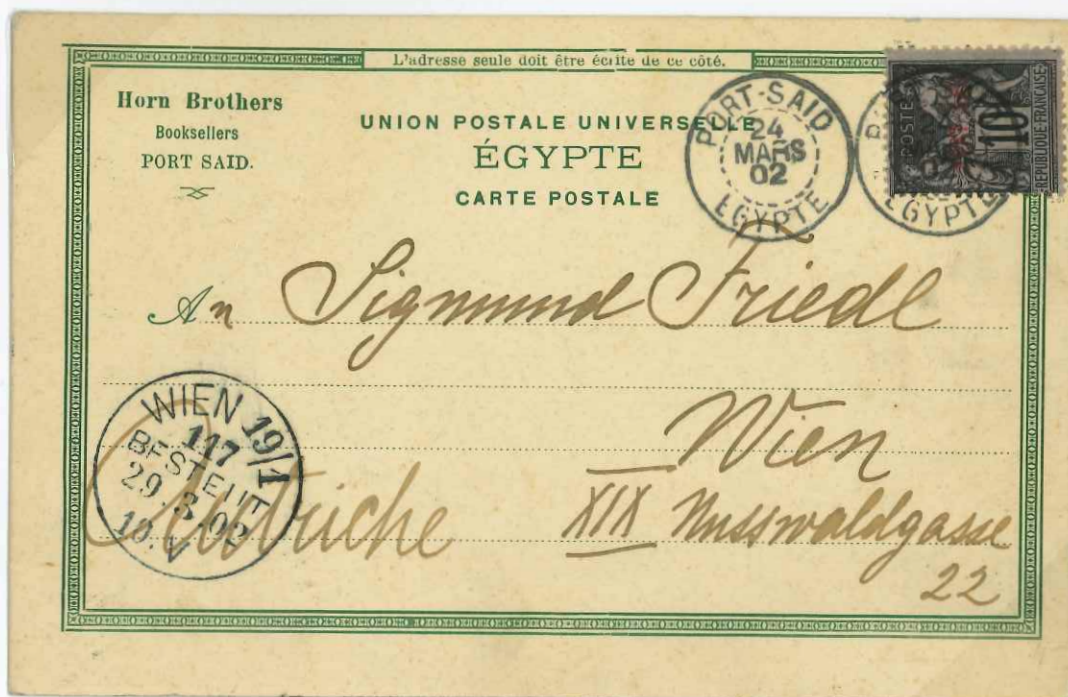


The French Post Office in Port Said.

1899. 10c. on card.



March 24th 1902. Privately produced postcard
by Horn Brothers, Booksellers, Port Said
franked by 1899 10c. black on lilac, Type A,
cancelled by Port Said datestamp.
Vienna arrival March 29th.



1899. Interpanneau pair from Row 9
Type B-'N' under 'U' of 'Republique'.

November 1899 Surcharges.



November 25th 1899.

'25c.' and 'Vingt Cinq' red surcharges
on 10c. black on lavender, used.



November 20th 1899.

'Vingt Cinq' red surcharge on 10c. black on lavender,
a used pair cancelled on second day of issue.



November 24th 1899.

'Vingt Cinq' red surcharge on 10c. black on lavender,
a used strip of five cancelled on the sixth day of issue.

French Post Office Port Said.

1924-25. Surcharged in Paris.

The issued set of eleven were overprinted in Paris with values in Milliemes instead of Centimes and Francs.

The surcharges were printed first, followed by the bars obliterating the original value.

- 15m. dull blue November 1927.*
- 20m. magenta November 1928.*
- 50m. red & blue-green February 1928.*
- 100m. blue & buff February 1928.*
- 250m. green & carmine February 1928.*

May 1921 Issue.

Surcharged in Paris.

Twelve stamps surcharged on stamps of 1902, eleven different values, the 10m. being surcharged on both the 1903 25c. blue and 30c. mauve remainders.



1m. on 1c. grey.



2m. on 5c. green.



4m. on 10c. carmine.



5m. on 3c. orange-red.



6m. on 15c. orange.



8m. on 20c. purple brown.



10m. on 25c. blue.



10m. on 30c. mauve.



15m. on 50c. brown & lavender.



30m. on 1 franc
lake and yellow green.



60m. on 2 franc lilac and buff.



150m. on 5 franc deep blue and buff.

French Post Office in Alexandria.

1921-23 Issue.

Colours changed from the 1902 issue, the 4m. surcharge now on 10c. green, rather than carmine, the 15m. surcharge applied on 50c. blue rather than 50c. brown and lavender and the 60m. surcharged on Merson 2 franc printed in orange red and blue green instead of deep lilac and buff.



The set of three values.

May 1921. 4m. on 10c. green 75,000 overprinted.

August 1921. 15m. on 50c. blue 229,000 overprinted.

October 1921. 60m. on 2fr. orange & blue-green 15,000 printed.

Surcharged in Paris.

Covers to Switzerland.



November 6th 1924 and February 25th 1925.

Two covers to Switzerland from the same correspondence,
each philatelically franked, upper cover at correct 15m. rate, lower cover overpaid at 19m.
with two 4m. green of 1923 issue.

Block of four.*

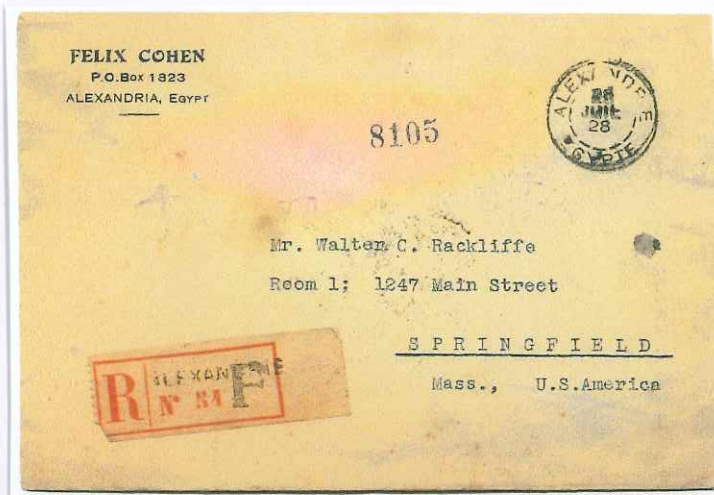


*Five values from the set all cancelled 31st MARCH 1931.

July 26th 1928. Registered cover to Springfield, Mass. at 30m. rate
franked on reverse with marginal block of six 1925 5m. on 3c. orange red
cancelled by Alexandria datestamps.

New York-Registered transit August 10th and arrival of the following day.

June 26th 1927. Registered cover to San Francisco franked at 70m. rate with 1925 10m. on 25c. and pair of 30m. on 1fr. cancelled Alexandria datestamps.

New York-Registered transit of July 9th alongside.

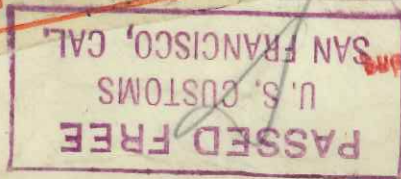

December 1925. Registered cover to San Francisco at 80m. rate,
franked by 10m. on 25c. pair and 60m. on 2 franc cancelled by Alexandria datestamps.

Cover was held for inspection on arrival in San Francisco with red
'Supposed liable to Customs duty' handstamp and struck with violet
'Passed Free-U.S.Customs-San Francisco, Cal' upon release.

Postage Stamps were exempt from Duty.

Registered Mail to England.



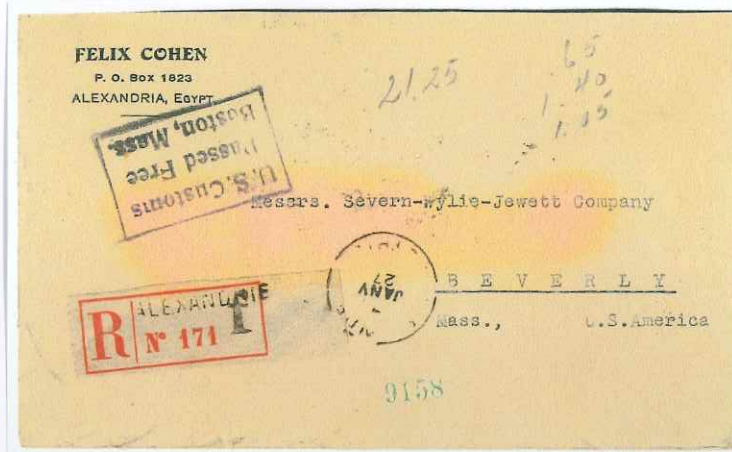
December 3rd 1927. Registered cover to Bexhill-On-Sea at 40m. rate franked by blocks of four 2m. on 5c. orange and 8m. on 20c. cancelled at Alexandria. Bexhill-On-Sea arrival of December 8th alongside.

The cover is addressed to a famous student of Egyptian philately
Mr.A.S.Mackenzie Low.

French Post Office in Alexandria.

1925 Issue.

Registered Mail to the USA.



January 7th 1927. Registered cover to Beverly, Mass. At 40m. rate franked by blocks of four 4m. on 10c. and 6m. on 15c. cancelled at Alexandria.

New York-Registered transit of January 24th arriving on the 26th via Boston with 'U.S.Customs-Passed Free-Boston, Mass' handstamp in black on front.

French Post Office in Alexandria.

1927-28 Issue.

Stamps similar in design to 1902 issue but now with 'Mm' for Milliemes in value tablet.

*Six values issued.
Perforated 14x13½.*



*3m. orange red,
November 1928.*



*15m. dull blue,
September 2nd 1927.*



*20m. magenta,
November 1928.*



50m. red and blue green,



*100m. deep blue and buff,
September 1927.*



250m. sage green and red,



Five of the six values all cancelled 31 MARCH 1931. The day the Alexandria Office closed.
