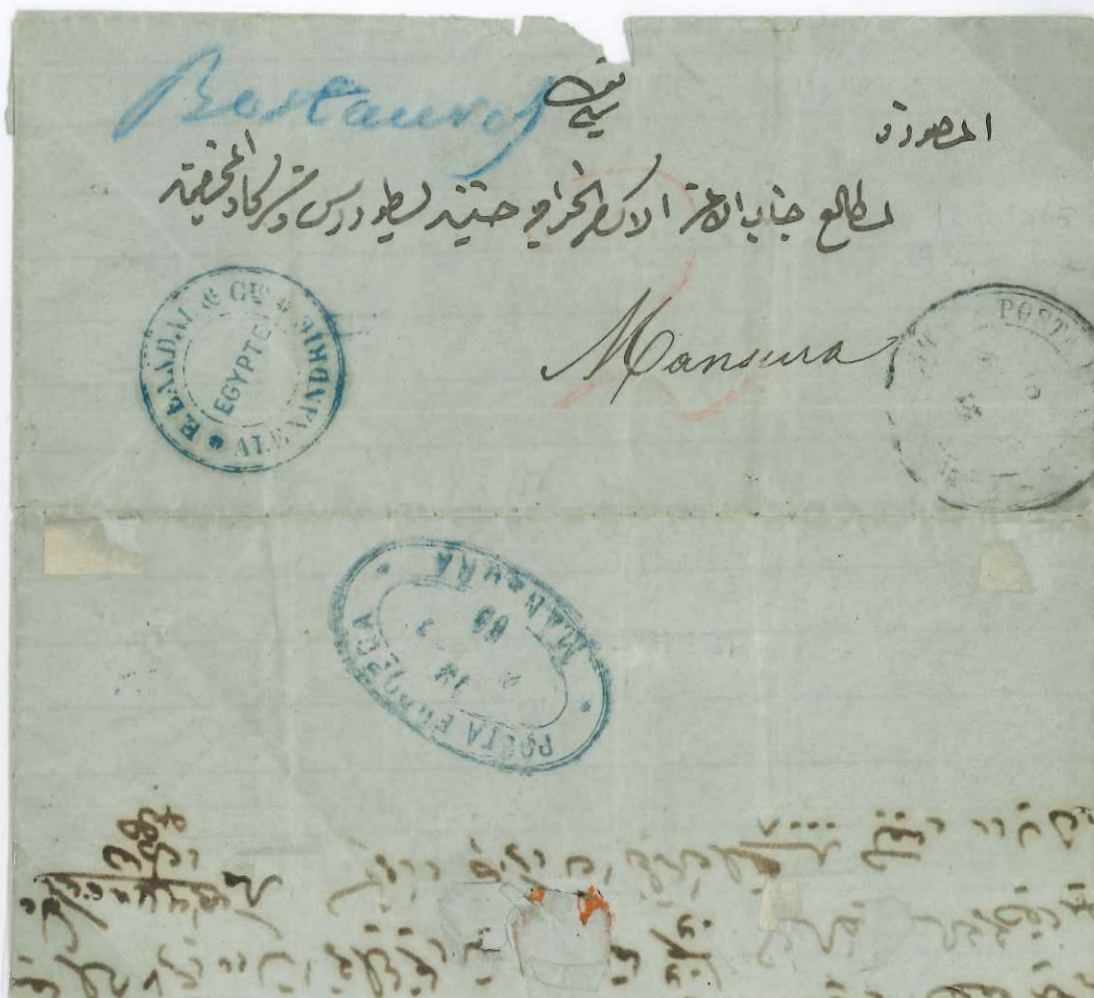


Posta Europea.

Type VI.

Alexandria.



March 12<sup>th</sup> 1865. Entire to Mansura with sender's cachet in blue of Landal & Cie of Alexandria, prepaid '2 piastres' with red crayon marking denoting payment, with faint (as usual) black 'Posta Europea-Alessandria' of dispatch and 'Posta Europea-Mansura' (Type V) arrival in blue of the same day.

Alexandria Type VI.

Earliest Known: June 28<sup>th</sup> 1863.

Latest Known: April 14<sup>th</sup> 1865.

Mansura Type V.

Earliest Known: July 1<sup>st</sup> 1863.

Latest Known: April 14<sup>th</sup> 1865.

Posta Europea.

Type III.

November 11<sup>th</sup> 1863. Entire to Alexandria rated '2 piastres' in blue manuscript crayon,  
'Posta Europea-Mansura' struck in green at left.

Earliest Known: November 29<sup>th</sup> 1856.

Latest Known: May 1<sup>st</sup> 1864.

Posta Europea.

Type II.

Cairo.



March 21<sup>st</sup> 1855. Cover to France mailed from Cairo with oval black  
'Agenzia Della Posta Europea-Cairo' handstamp.

The letter was transferred to the French Post Office in Alexandria (March 23<sup>rd</sup>)  
and thence by French Packet with red framed 'Paquebots de la Medieranee'  
to Marseille where it arrived on April 1<sup>st</sup>.

Charged at double rate of 20 decimes (2 francs) on arrival.

Posta Europea covers used to destinations outside Egypt are uncommon.

Earliest Known: January 8<sup>th</sup> 1850.

Latest Known: September 29<sup>th</sup> 1860.
