Details :15 x 14 perforation , gum Arabic, chalk-surfaced paper, multiple crowns watermark; no phosphor or three bands applied in photogravure ; designed by J. Norris Wood ; printed photogravure by Harrison in sheets (6 x 20) ; 22,011,935 non-phosphor and 3,653,280 blocks of four sold.

Colours and Plates /Cylinders

Cylinder numbers located in the left margin of sheets by column 1, rows 17 to 19 ; traffic lights in the right margin by column 6, rows 17 to 19:

Black-grey-yellow-red-green-blue-bistre-brown

2A-1B-1C-1D-1E-2F-2G-1H (non phosphor and phosphor)

2A-1B-1C-1D-1E-2F-2G-1H (non phosphor and phosphor)

Notes: The first Great Britain stamps to be printed using eight colours. The stamps were issued both with and without phosphor. The 4d values were printed together in blocks of four (2x2) within sheets
