Multiples of all values  
of this issue with the exception  
of the 5 paras are extremely scarce.

**Type 1**

- The first of 3 dots at right of top label is above level of the other two.
- Both '1' in 10 are thinner.
- The summit of the pyramid touches the oval.

**Type 2**

- The horizontal bar of right corner P'A'ra is almost missing.
- The 0 of 10 at right is large with a flattened bottom.
- The 0 of 10 at left has its centre distorted at lower right.
- At right, Par'A' is fatter than the others.

**Type 3**

- The two 1 in 10 are fatter than in T.1.
- The summit of the pyramid does not touch the oval.
- The first of the three dots of first word at right of top label is lower.

**Type 4**

- At left, Par'A' is very thin.
- Bottom label right, no point over 'nun' total 4 points instead of 5.

1867 (Aug 1<sup>st</sup>): 10 paras dull lilac, a used block of six, Types I-II-I / III-IV-III, cancelled by "Poste Vice-Reali Egiziane / Suez" datestamps in black dated August 20<sup>th</sup> 1869. The upper strip of three is horizontally creased and the multiple with slight discolouration, however a rare stamp in a used multiple.
