**The Letter is Sealed at the Back with a Red Sealing Wax and
Shows on the Front the Signature of a British Regimental
Censor**

FIRST INDIA - LONDON RETURN FLIGHT Rutbah -ENGLAND

A cover carried by air as part of the First Flight from India to London from the station RUTBA in the Western Desert at the border with Jordan. There is a rectangular cancel on the front stating in purple {RUTBA APRIL 3RD. 1929 FIRST FLIGHT AIRMAIL LONDON KARACHI SERVICE.}

A stamp of 6 Annas SAG#47 is cancelled in BAGHDAD on 2nd APR 1929 There is a Liverpool cancel but the date is uncertain.

An air mail cover to London England from Baghdad showing a neat black boxed yellow adhesive perforated label "AIR MAIL PARAVION". The cover redirected to Digby Hines. The rate used 4 1/2 Annas (Scott No.s 385) cancelled by a clean bilingual "Lower Baghdad (IRAQ) بستان الخبز" dated 10 NOV 28 / 230 PM. The back shows a large circular rubber cancel in black of the "Air Ministry Personal Letter Section - 19 NOV 1928" London F.O. No. 21 Small Strike at 6.15 PM 19 NOV 28 is also shown.



Registered By Air Mail, Baghdad –Cairo From Basrah to Grenoble –France, 1924

It paid 9 annas and canceled by an all English strike of
Basrah- Reg. on 3rd April 24

The front shows a blue Registration label of Basrah
while the back shows a bilingual strike of Baghdad on
3rd , bilingual Registration strike of Cairo on the 4th and
a Grenoble strike on 12th April 1924





A Cover Sent from
POONA – India to BUSHIRE Iran- 1931

It paid with an Indian stamp of 3 Annas and was cancelled with a
Poona strike on 16th September 1931.

The front of the cover shows a bilingual strike of Bushire on the
21st of September
