The cover shows payment with a Baghdad Provisional Bisect of 1890-1892, cancelled with the rare negative strike of

BAGHDAD POSTA KHANA, 1399-

ISFILLA No. AP06 with a rating of

RR

The cover shows on its front the unique negative strike of

Kerbela, (KERBELA MUALLA POSTA KHANA),


ISFILIA No. AP06 with a rating of

RRR

The cover was addressed to a Jewish Master, Mr Shaool Saleh Hardoon using both Arabic script and repeated exactly but using a Hebrew script.

It is very significant to note that the City of Kerbela is the prime holy city for the Sheaa Moslems. The cover indicates that more than a century ago Iraqi Jews lived and operated in this Holy Moslem City just like in other cities. Also, Jews used Arabic but written in Hebrew script

The cover was bought at a Queen's St. Philatelic Establishment in the Eighties in Auckland-New Zealand. It was claimed then that the cover came from the collection of Sir Dave Robinson, a past Mayor of Auckland, who

The cover originated from Mahmood Shabandar Outfit the owners of the famous "Shabandar" coffee house on Al Mutanabbi Street

It paid with an Ottamani 1.0 Kursh stamp and cancelled with the the Very Rare all negative cancel of NEJEF, 95

RR

The front shows an all English strike of Hamadan dated probably 1878



A COVER FROM SYRIA TO ISTANBUL 1909

A cover sent from Haleb, (Aleppo), Syria to Der Saadet,

(Istanbul) on the 21st Temuz of the Ottoman year of 1325

which corresponds to July 1909. It arrived in Istanbul on the

29th. It paid one Qurush and was canceled with Alap cancel,

(Cole and Walker No. 12). The back shows an arrival strike in

Istanbul of Der Saadet- Mawroodaon on the 29^{th of Temuz.}

The cover probably contained an official application to the Ottoman Authorities.







From BAGHDAD to HALEB, Syria

It was sent during the 1st World War and cancelled with the RARE

KERYA BACHI (Baghdad),

C&W #14 and ISFILA #APO8

It was cancelled on 19th December 1914 and shows a negative cancel strike of the Militry Censor in Arabic Script since it was during the early part of the First World War. The Back shows a strike in purple of a PAUL TIEVENOW-BAGDAD
