

# DULOZ ISSUES OF THE OTTOMAN EMPIRE 1865-1877

This exhibit features the stamps of the second issue of the Ottoman Empire, which were in use from January 1865 to March 1884.

The second issue of Ottoman stamps was initially ordered to Paris in 1864 by the Ottoman authorities to compensate the poor quality of the previous issue. The contract was given to the Parisian printer Poitevin. At Poitevin, a Mr.Duloz prepared the first dies, engraved the first plates, and gave his name to these stamps. Still today these stamps are referred to as Duloz stamps. Later issues were printed in Constantinople, first with the original dies, and later with die plates made in Constantinople.

The designs of the postage and postage-due stamps in all these issues are the same, except that the different values are expressed by their respective numerals in the four corners of the stamp and their denomination in Arabic script at the bottom of the overprint. All the stamps bear the arabic overprint of: Postai Devleti Osmaniye (Post of the Ottoman Empire)

This collection studies all the Duloz stamps of the 1865-1877 period, the essays and the proofs, the colored postage stamps and the brown postage due stamps, whether issued or non-issued. It points to the important errors and varieties of each issue and tries to point at some interesting plate flaws and at their usage in postage. They are exposed in the order of their issue and the beginning of each period is indicated by the date in bold caracters:

- -1865 Postage Stamps and Postage-Due stamps (Perf. 12 1/2);
- -1867 Postage Stamps and Postage-Due stamps (Perf.12 1/2);
- -1868 Postage Stamps and Postage-Due stamps (Perf. 13 1/2);
- -1870/72 Postage Stamps and Postage-Due stamps (Perf.5-11);
- -1873 Postage Due transitional stamps (Perf.12-13);
- -1875 Postage Stamps (Perf.13 1/2);
- -1876 Provisional issue of Postage Stamps for U.P.I. countries (Perf.13 1/2);
- -1876/77 Definitive Postage Stamps for use within the Empire and for U.P.I. countries (Perf.13 1/2).





During the process of the production of Setting I of 10 paras, by mistake, a cliché of 1 piaster without overprint got among the clichés of the 10 paras at the 33rd position, and the whole sheet received the overprint of 10 paras.

After the printing of an unknown number of sheets, the mistake was spotted and the error of the 33rd position was corrected in Setting II.by the addition of a dot, the Turkish equivalent for "O" on the right of the "I" in all four circles.

However, the dot is higher and closer to the "I" than in the normal stamps, while the figure "I" is exactly in the centre of the circle as shown in the drawing above..

By mistake a cliché of the 1 piastre, without overprint, got among the clichés of the 10 paras, and the whole sheet received the overprint of 10 paras. The error was corrected by the addition of a dot, the Turkish equivalent for "0" on the right of the "I" in all four circles. This dot is higher and closer to the "I" than in the normal stamps, while the figure "I" is exactly in the center of the circle. This error is found in emissions of 1865, 1867, 1869, 1871 and 1873 because the same plate was used for all printings.



Only a very small quantity of the 25 pi was printed and consequently this is the rarest stamp of Turkey.

Never seen on cover or even on piece, only 15 stamps are known to exist. Its face value was enormous for that time, and one cannot think of a case where it could have been used as postage due franking.

Cover sent from Alep to Marseille on the 18th of March 1872, franked with 20 pa and 1 pi of 1868 and canceled with boxed Halep (stamps and cancellation probably fake).

Transited at Alexandrette/Syria on 22nd of March 1872 (round arrival cancellation), taxed with a rose "Napoleon III lauré" 80c. (1863-70) and canceled with a pointed losange roulette with post office number 5079 (large numbers), belonging to Alexandrette.

Received at Beyrouth on March 24, 1872 and canceled with small round stamp, then shipped on a vessel and canceled Paquebot S/S America.

Small PD stamp in rectangle (Payé jusqu'à Destination) meaning postage paid up to destination.

First day issue for 10 paras is January 1875, for 20 paras February 1875, and for 1 piastre August 1875.





The provisional issue of stamps with the French surcharge "Pre" was printed for postage to countries belonging to the Universal Postal Union. Printed in Constantinople on white paper, with a single line perforation of 13 1/4, they were issued in sheets of 150 stamps. First date of issue January 13, 1876.









These stamps were issued with the same overprint of 1876 but without the French surcharge. Printed in Constantinople, on white paper, with single line perforation of 13 1/2, the 5 pi and the 25 pi was not issued. A grey 20 paras and a 2 piastre was issued in 1881/82 with the same overprint and the same perforation and they are considered as part of the 1876/77 issue. These were the last stamps of Duloz issues and were withdrawn definitely on 1st of March, 1884.
